Notice of Adoption of Amendments to Chapter 6 of Title 68 of the Rules of the City of New York Regarding the IDNYC <u>Program</u>

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED in the Commissioner of the New York City Human Resources Administration (HRA) pursuant to Section 603 of the New York City Charter, and in accordance with the requirements of Section 1043 of the New York City Charter, that HRA has adopted the above final rule.

A proposed rule was published in the City Record on February 28, 2025, and a public hearing was held on March 28, 2025.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The New York City Identification Card Program ("IDNYC Card Program") was established to ensure that New Yorkers are provided with the opportunity and peace of mind that come with possessing a government-issued photo identification. The program was officially launched on January 12, 2015. To date, the program was enrolled approximately 1.7 million individuals. In an ongoing effort to serve New York's most vulnerable populations, IDNYC further seeks to expand and refine the number and types of reliable and verifiable documents that can be accepted as proof of identity and residency.

IDNYC has previously adapted its program to increase access for all New Yorkers, including:

- In December 2021, in partnership with the Department of Correction, IDNYC began accepting the DOC Photo Database as proof of identity for those applicants who were formerly incarcerated. This helped bridge the gap to identity for this population.
- In 2022, IDNYC restarted its partnership with the Department of Education to streamline accessibility to identity documents for young New Yorkers to better assist them as they work to gain access to higher education along with employment opportunities, such as the Summer Youth Employment Program. This partnership has been extremely successful with thousands of public school students having attained the IDNYC card.
- In late 2022, IDNYC began accepting an internal verification document that provides proof of identity as part of the Department of Social Services benefits access process. This change was particularly valuable for active clients, including those who are unhoused.

• Finally, in 2024, IDNYC updated its requirements for establishing residency to further increase access and remove barriers to obtaining an IDNYC card for asylum seekers housed by the City of New York.

Based on the experience over the past two years, and on recommendations from stakeholders, including applicants, advocates, IDNYC enrollment staff, and members of the City Council, the IDNYC program is now adopting revisions and additions to the IDNYC rules. Specifically, the adopted rule adds 23 different types of documents that can be used as proof of identity or residency.

A comment submitted during the rule public hearing expressed concerns regarding the acceptance of the DOC Photo Array. They indicated there may a lack of verification within the correctional facility as it related to identity. IDNYC understands this concern and this is why the document is only acceptable for one point of identity and must be supported by additional documentation to reach the three point identity threshold to attain an IDNYC card.

HRA's authority for this rule may be found in Sections 603 and 1043 of the City Charter, Administrative Code Section 3-115, and Executive Order No. 6 of 2014.

Section 1. Subdivision (c) of section 6-03 of Title 68 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(c) Only original documents or copies of documents that have been certified by the original issuing agency will be accepted. Data or electronic versions of documents [received from the issuing agency] may be deemed to constitute an original document if HRA determines in its discretion that the data <u>or electronic documents</u> have sufficient indicia of reliability. Documents with any alterations or erasures, or that are cancelled or invalidated, will not be accepted. IDNYC reserves the right to not accept any document, or type of document, whose validity it is not able to verify and, where relying on data or electronic versions of documents, to request additional information from the applicant.

2. Subdivision (e) of section 6-03 of Title 68 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(e) Applicants must [present] <u>submit</u> documents [in person] at an enrollment site designated by HRA in accordance with § 3-115(b)(2) of the Administrative Code of the City of New York. IDNYC provides free on-site document translation services to applicants who provide original documents that are not in English. Original documents will be returned immediately to the applicant before they leave the enrollment center. [IDNYC will not make copies of or digitally scan any documents used by applicants to establish identity or residency.]

§ 3. Subdivision (a) of section 6-04 of Title 68 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(a) An applicant may provide a single document that is worth the four points needed to establish both identity and residency. The documents listed below meet this four-point requirement, provided that they include a photo of the applicant, the date of birth of the applicant, and the applicant's current residential address in New York City.

(b) HRA may determine in the future that additional documents, including data and electronic versions of documents received from the issuing agency, licensed by the issuing agency, or in an HRA case record, may be accepted and will be afforded the value of one point toward establishing the residency of the applicant. In the event that HRA exercises its authority pursuant to this subdivision, HRA will publicize its acceptance of the new documents or data, including on the IDNYC website.
