Please read the information and instructions below carefully before completing the application. The deadline to return the completed application along with all requested documents is **Wednesday**, **July 12, 2023**. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.

<u>Eligibility</u>

A. Parent or Guardian

- 1. A permanent career City civil service employee with at least two years of continuous full-time service in a position for which the salary is paid in whole or in part by the City of New York.
- 2. Gross annual ordinary income for the year ending December 2022 may not exceed \$125,000 for parents and/or guardians. The applicant's income should not be included. Salaries listed should be before deductions for contributions to deferred compensation plans and/or other pre-tax benefits programs. Capital gains or losses should not be considered. If parents are separated or divorced, please describe financial arrangements with respect to applicant. Please include copies of page 1 of both parents' 2022 Federal Income Tax Return(s).

B. Applicant

- 1. Has had regular attendance at a private or public secondary school.
- 2. Matriculated as a full-time student at a private or public college or university.
- 3. Has taken the SAT or ACT examination. A copy of the test report must be submitted with the application.
- 4. Current college transcript with GPA.

<u>Financial Aid</u>

- 1. Attach copy of FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) submission and SAR (Student Aid Report).
- 2. Attach copy of letter received from college/university which details financial aid award for the upcoming year.
- 3. If the letter has not been received, please inform the association in a written message that is included with the application when it is submitted for review. Also, if financial aid has not been requested, please inform the association in a written message included with the application so that consideration of your eligibility is not delayed.

Selection Criteria

- 1. Scholastic achievement, leadership, and commitment.
- 2. Record of college and community activity and service.
- 3. Score on the SAT or ACT examination.
- 4. Acceptance letter to college or university.
- 5. Financial need.
- 6. Other information which The Hundred Year Association Awards Committee may require or deem pertinent.

<u>Summary</u>

- 1. All applications will be reviewed for eligibility and verification by the New York City Department of Citywide Administrative Services.
- 2. The Hundred Year Association Awards Committee will determine the winners following a personal interview with each finalist.
- 3. All information requested in the application must be completed for an applicant to be considered for an award, and the application must include the following documents:
 - a. SAT or ACT report.
 - b. 2022 Federal Income Tax Return (page 1 only) for both parents/guardians
 - c. FAFSA submission and SAR.
 - d. Financial aid award letter from college/university.
 - e. Current college transcript with GPA.
 - f. A scholar awards essay.
 - g. Career interest and awards/service inventories.
 - h. An up-to-date resume.
 - i. Supplementary materials included as necessary/appropriate.
- 4. All applications must be signed by the City employee parent or guardian and the applicant.


