The Office of the General Counsel (OGC) is comprised of the following units: Real Estate (leasing, acquisitions, and disposals); Human Capital (Civil Service and Employment Law); Procurement; and Discipline and Labor Relations. OGC's DCAS and Citywide legal support also extends to Litigation of landlord-tenant matters of City-owned property, performing legislative review, and providing legal counsel for agency lines in the areas of fleet administration, energy purchasing/conservation, and facilities management/construction. OGC works with Corporation Counsel on special matters present before the agency that may require litigation or additional review due to the City Charter.
