


FY25 Fleet Fuels Report: Fossil Fuel Use Down 67% Since FY13


To close out Climate Week, DCAS [announced](#) a major achievement in weaning the fleet program off fossil fuels.

At the end of each fiscal year, fleet management looks at various areas of performance. This effort culminates in the publication of the annual [fleet section](#) of the Mayor's Management Report (MMR) each September.


Today's newsletter focuses on our annual fuels report. With the competition of the renewable diesel initiative for the city's on and off-road fleet, we've made our biggest single-year move ever in sustainability, with 67% or 20 million gallons per year of fossil fuel now displaced from the fleet program.

This achievement includes a net reduction in total fuel use and the transition of 99% of all diesel fuel to biofuels, primarily renewable diesel with 5% biodiesel. The most significant reduction in fuel use was in gasoline, where 4.2 million gallons of

annual gasoline have been cut, representing a 33% decrease. Our initiatives in fleet electrification, hybrids, and efficiencies have led the way to this reduction, which should continue as we transition to an all-plug-in fleet by 2035 through Local Law [140](#).




We achieved a 2% reduction in diesel use, amounting to a smaller 348,000 gallons. The electrification of diesel trucks and off-road equipment will take longer to accomplish than for light- and medium-duty units, and renewable diesel offers a way to make progress for that segment of the fleet now. Diesel fuel use in any given year can also be heavily impacted by major emergencies or new initiatives, such as coastal storms or organic collection, and the trends show more variation from year to year than gasoline, which has steadily declined.



Local Law [38](#) of 2005 requires DCAS to publish the EPA fuel economy for new light-duty vehicles purchased by the city. This is the fleet equivalent of the

Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFE) standards. For the seventh time in eight years, DCAS averaged over 100 miles per gallon (MPG) for average new fuel economy, demonstrating clearly that the marketplace can support significant increases in fuel economy for vehicles.



With the diesel program now fully transitioning to renewable diesel, fleet management can place further emphasis on reducing total fuel use, including through our fiscal year 26 fleet electrification efforts. We will also work to maximize charging of plug-in hybrids and further optimize fleet size and commuting practices.

Thanks to Fleet Chief of Staff Sherry Lee, who originally developed and still produces most of the fleet’s fuel reporting, and also Deputy Chief Tamika Johnson for the Local Law 38 reporting.
