

DCAS Surpasses 400 EV Fast Chargers; Over 1.3 Million Now Charged

This month, DCAS took another big step in our electric vehicle program by installing over 400 fast electric vehicle (EV) chargers, the largest fast charging network in NY State. The newest chargers are at Old Slip, the DOT Facility in lower Manhattan.

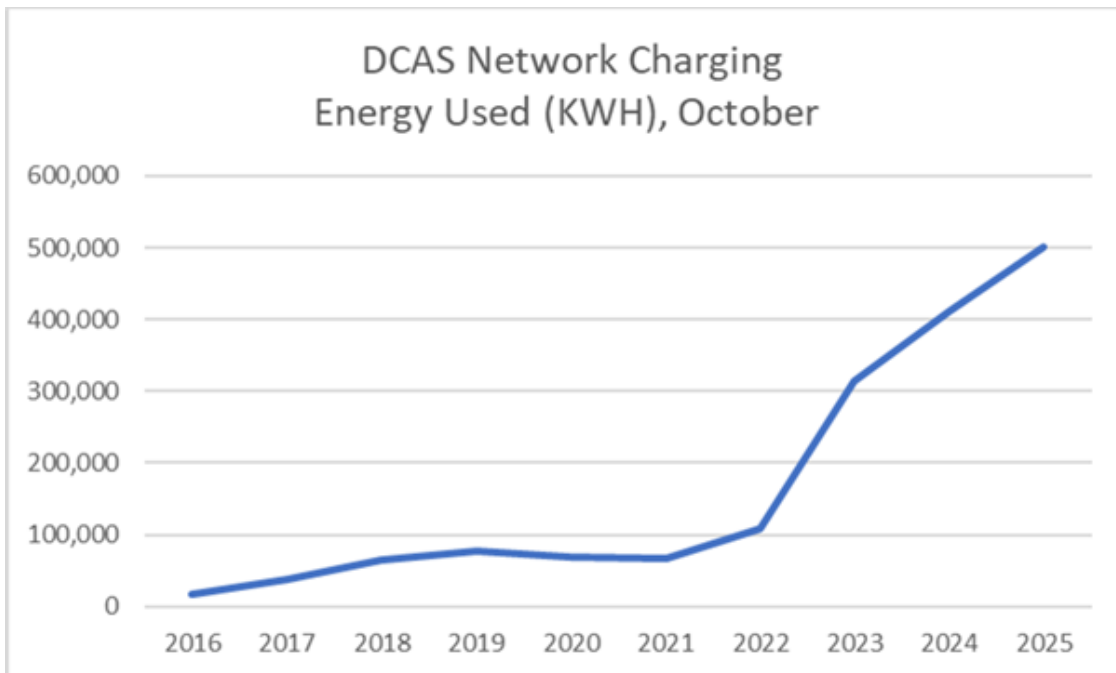
At Old Slip, DCAS completed the first and only 6 fast chargers that were specifically designed for curbside street use in NYC. All previous curbside chargers are overnight, level 2 chargers, DCAS and DOT partnered on this

initiative which will be extended to at least 4 additional sites. These chargers are for city fleet use.

In total, DCAS and DOT now operate 2,400 total charging ports including 1,619 overnight DCAS chargers, 161 solar carports, and now 406 fast chargers. In June, Con Edison recognized DCAS for installing the most EV fast chargers in the city. This was the third straight year DCAS received this award. In just three years, there has been a 500% increase in electricity used to power city fleet operations. DCAS has now charged over 1.3 million customers since 2013.



While the primary role for DCAS is to support fleet charging, DCAS does offer 22 charging [sites](#) to the general [public](#). These sites have been used over 208,000 times by the general public since January 2021.



As excitingly, DCAS broke ground this month on our largest public charging network at Forest Park in Queens at the [Bandshell](#) parking lot. DCAS will be installing 10 fast chargers at the site including 2 ADA accessible chargers. Our previous largest public charging hub is 5 chargers at World's Fair Marina in Queens. We look forward to opening the site in Spring 2026.



DCAS Fleet and Procurement also partnered this month with the New York State Office of General Services (OGS) on an important long term innovation in EV charging. For decades, DCAS has issued thousands of fuel pins and cards so city fleet operators can access commercial and in-house liquid fuel stations. Traditionally, this was limited to gasoline and diesel fuel sites.

For the first time, the fuel card is now a true power card and will enable access to commercial electric charging citywide. These power cards will greatly expand options for city agencies as we continue to electrify the city fleet. Citywide, we now operate over 5,750 electric vehicles with orders in place that will take us over 6,100.

Many thanks to Assistant Commissioner Brent Taylor, Sustainability Coordinator Fiona Crisp, our partners at Con Edison, our contracting partners, and all the agencies fleet and facility teams that have supported this rollout.
