On December 23, 2025, DCAS joined the original Vision Zero leadership agencies Department of Transportation (DOT), NYC Health, Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC), and the New York City Police Department (NYPD) at One Police Plaza to remind all New Yorkers of the dangers of driving while intoxicated (DWI).

NYPD, DOT, and TLC announced plans for [heightened enforcement](#) of DWI during the holiday season. DWI is a major and disproportionate source of crashes and fatalities during the holidays.

In November, DOT also released the campaign “You can’t rewind a crash,” featuring a powerful [video](#) about the importance of decisions on the road including those involving alcohol.

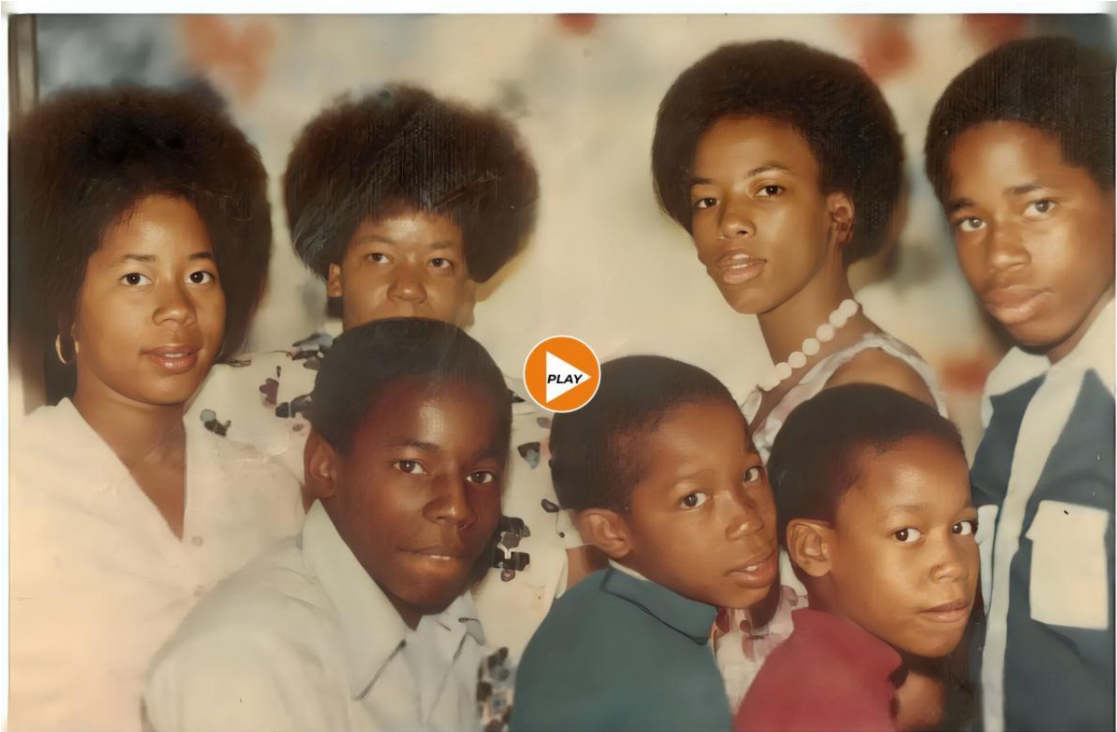

We took office with a simple promise: to ‘Get Stuff Done’ — and, over the last four years, that is exactly what our administration has delivered every day for working-class New Yorkers. We invited all your commissioners and leaders to City Hall last week to celebrate [four years of accomplishments and bury a time capsule with symbols of all we’ve achieved](#). I placed a vinyl record inside to commemorate all the records we broke during this administration. From the most jobs and small businesses to the lowest number of shootings, and so much more, we’ve made New York City safer and more affordable across all five boroughs.

We couldn’t have done all this without each and every one of you. Thank you for serving our city and your fellow 8.5 million New Yorkers. Watch the video below to see a recap of some of what we accomplished.

On top of celebrating all those wins, we continued to deliver for New York City in new ways last week because this administration isn’t over yet! Here’s what else we got done:

- To make sure the ‘War on Rats’ continues strong, I [signed an executive order creating the Mayor’s Office of Rodent Mitigation](#). Our administration got garbage bags off the curb, installed Empire Bins, and sent the rats packing — with rat complaints down for 12 months in a row!

- The Mayor’s Office of Animal Welfare is leading a [citywide initiative to expand housing options for New Yorkers with pets](#). These programs will keep owners and animals together, relieve intake at our shelters, and expand the number of potential adopters.
- We continued to make life more affordable for working families by [opening enrollment for our “Birth-to-2 Child Care Initiative.”](#) We’re providing more than 200 infant and toddler childcare seats at zero cost to families, making it easier for parents to provide for their families without having to choose between a paycheck and child care.
