

NYC's Newest Electric Trucks and More on Display at 37th Annual Fleet Show

Even with less than cooperative weather, DCAS and NYC Parks hosted a very successful 37th Annual Fleet Show on May 21 at Flushing Meadows Corona Park in Queens. We discussed our NYC and Los Angeles County bicoastal fleet partnership in the last newsletter and you can read more on that [here](#).

The event was also a coming out party for some of the city's newest electric trucks. The NYC Department of Sanitation (DSNY) had a 10-yard electric garbage truck and an electric pickup on display. The NYC Department of Transportation (DOT) displayed an electric rack and an electric attenuator truck. NYC Public

Schools displayed the city's first electric dump truck and NYCSBUS had an electric school bus on hand.



The show also displayed two electric trucks that one likely could not find anywhere else. NYC Parks and the City Parks Foundation (CPF) brought the city's PuppetMobile, which was electrified through DCAS support this year. The [PuppetMobile](#) is the longest standing program of its kind in the country and brings great performances and puppet making workshops to kids, and kids at heart, throughout the city each year. In addition, as outlined in a recent [newsletter](#), the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner (OCME) displayed our first electric mortuary truck.



In our latest [Clean Fleet Transition Report](#), DCAS introduced a new alternative fuel category, the extended range electric vehicle (EREV). While not yet in the city fleet, one of our manufacturers brought the first EREV to display at the show. Electrification of heavy-duty trucks is still in its early stages, with many challenges in terms of functionality, range, and costs. That said, fleet is starting to see some real progress in many areas and we look forward to announcing more on this soon.

Also at the show, students from Ralph R. McKee Career and Technical Education High School and Staten Island Technical High School showed off a solar race car built by the students. The students will represent NYC in a [competition](#) with the solar car this summer in Texas. Students from A-Tech and William E. Grady Career and Technical Education high schools were also at the event.

For the 17th straight year, our partners at [Empire Clean Cities](#) hosted their annual stakeholders meeting at the event. Empire is a non-profit that promotes fleet sustainability and has worked with the city on educational programs and events for well over 20 years.



The show also featured nearly 180 exhibitors of the latest in clean, safe, and smart fleet equipment and technology. Many of the vendors were coordinated through Quebec's NY Office. DCAS participated last week in a series of events in partnership with Quebec in Baltimore, Philadelphia, Newark with the Port Authority, as well as in Albany with the State Office of General Services (OGS). All of these cities and organizations made clear their commitment to clean, electric, and sustainable transportation and their willingness to work together to achieve it.

Thanks to all the agencies, schools, companies and organizations that participated and special thanks to NYC Parks, the show's longtime co-host and originator.
