## **DCAS's Online Fleet Auctions Find a New Home With IAA**

Since DCAS's first online fleet auction contract was established in 2012, over 25,700 used New York City fleet vehicles and equipment pieces have been auctioned to the general public. Each week, DCAS posts the list of used fleet units that will be sold on the [DCAS website](#). Buyers can register for an account on our contracted online auction site to begin the bidding process. All auctions are open to the public and registration is free.

In November 2021, DCAS completed a new contract for online auctions based on the City's bidding requirements and processes. Our first contract holder, *Property Room*, will sell out their remaining City fleet stock through the end of 2022, and we welcome our new vendor, [IAA](#), which has assumed all new online auctions for NYC Fleet and DCAS beginning in 2022.

Consistent with the City charter, all used fleet units are posted for public auction after they have been retired for age and wear by their assigned agencies. DCAS placed the public auctions online in 2012 to expand access to the general public and to free up six acres of space for economic development at the Brooklyn Navy Yard, where in-person auctions were previously conducted.

All auctions are open and available to the general public. Potential bidders must register with [IAA](#), but there is no cost to bid, and bidders may bid directly without needing an agent or any third-party involvement. Active City employees are not authorized to bid on NYC Fleet units. More on the auction process and rules can be found in the [NYC Fleet Manual](#).

[DCAS achieved a record auction level in FY21](#) and continues to see high returns as the used vehicle market remains in heavy demand. We look forward to continued success as we start the new year with our new online provider.
