

## Join NYC Fleet in Times Square For Car Free Day on April 23

On Saturday, April 23, NYC DOT will be hosting its annual [Car Free Earth Day event](#) across the five boroughs with activities and entertainment focusing on sustainability, global climate action, alternative forms of transportation, and more. As part of this event, DCAS will be displaying an all-electric collection truck and an all-electric police car at Broadway and 39th Street, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. We will also be providing educational materials about the NYC Fleet sustainability program in conjunction with NYC DOT.



First launched in 2016 by former City Council member and current DOT Commissioner Ydanis Rodriguez, Car Free Day is now in its fifth year; after being paused for two years due to the COVID-19 epidemic. Car Free Earth Day will be celebrated on Saturday in NYC. Global Earth Day will be observed on Friday, April 22.

When announcing the return of Car Free Day, DOT Commissioner Rodriguez stated, "Earth Day is when we can all commit to protecting our Earth and one way we can do that is by repurposing our roadways. Car-Free Earth Day is a growing tradition that allows New York City's car-free streets to come alive. The last two years of *Open Streets*, *Open Restaurants*, the surge in cycling and so much more, have only made us appreciate even more how much better we must treat Mother Earth... and a day without cars allows us to envision a more sustainable world for more than just one day."



Of course, the goal of Car Free Day is to encourage public transportation, bicycling, walking, and re-imagining a City where roadways are used as open public spaces. However, where cars and trucks are needed, it's critical to transition them to zero-emission and safer units, minimizing harmful impacts to the public. DCAS has been leading those efforts for the City fleet.

“As NYC’s fleet manager, I don’t have a fleet vehicle assigned to me and go most places by subway and public transportation,” states DCAS Deputy Commissioner Keith Kerman. “When I do need a vehicle, I use a DCAS shared electric vehicle. If you can avoid vehicles altogether, that is best. Go car-free! Where you can’t, go electric.”


