

## Fleet Spotlight: NYC Fleet Chief of Staff Sherry Lee

Our spotlight for May is on Sherry Lee, who serves as the chief of staff for NYC Fleet.

Sherry Lee graduated in 2001 from Cornell University, School of Industrial and Labor Relations. Prior to graduating, Sherry had spent five years as an assistant manager supporting her family's restaurant, and conducting analysis on executive compensation and human capital issues during the summer months.

Sherry joined the NYC Department of Parks and Recreation's Citywide Operations unit on June 30, 2001, just months before 9/11. Sherry started as an operations analyst, and received promotions to senior analyst, and assistant director of citywide operations. At Parks, Sherry managed fleet administration for the fleet of over 2,500 units.

In addition to managing NYC Park's fleet administration, she led inventory control and storehouse management for the agency, and served as an internal auditor for the City marina operations. She managed customer service programs including a highly successful initiative to survey tens of thousands of New Yorkers about parks, beaches, recreation centers, playgrounds, golf courses, and other services. Sherry was recognized with an Isaac Liberman Public Service Award in 2010 from the 100 Year Association of New York, DCAS, and Parks.

In April 2012, Sherry joined DCAS Fleet, first as deputy chief of staff, and then began serving as chief of staff in 2014. As chief of staff, Sherry oversees fiscal management and vehicle acquisitions. Since Sherry's arrival, DCAS has administered \$2.6 billion in vehicle procurement for slightly over 25 thousand fleet units and has committed nearly \$290 million annually. Most recently, Sherry has organized DCAS's acceleration of the transition to electric vehicles, with the City's largest ever purchase of over 1,350 electric vehicles, taking place this year.

Sherry created the systems for tracking and monitoring the over 1,800 staff who work in fleet services citywide at the main agencies we refer to as the Fleet Federation. She also developed systems for monitoring citywide fleet and heating fuel expenditure, and has played a major role in our biofuel and renewable diesel programs. We refer to the fiscal and personnel tracking system Sherry developed for fleet, consistent with Mayoral Executive Order 141, as the *virtual agency*. This system enables DCAS to manage fleet fiscal issues across over 40 fleet operating agencies, working closely with the the Mayor's Office of Management and Budget.

Sherry has extraordinary administrative, analytical, and organizational skills and plays essential roles in almost every area of fleet endeavor, often behind the scenes ensuring fleet's success. At both NYC Parks Citywide Operations and DCAS, Sherry has an exceptional record of effectiveness and service, producing volumes of substantive work every day and being a leader that her colleagues can rely on.

Sherry lives in Queens, following her beloved (and frustrating) Mets, and enjoys movies and spending time with her parents and nephews.


