Mayor Adams Announces Speed Camera Expansion and Crackdown on Fake License Plates

Mayor Eric Adams has recently announced two critical enforcement initiatives tied to traffic and road safety: the expansion of the speed camera program, and a crackdown on fake and illegal license plates. NYC fleet operators should set an example in complying with these and all areas of safe and proper vehicle operation.

On June 30, 2022, Mayor Eric Adams, Deputy Mayor Meera Joshi, and NYC Department of Transportation (DOT) Commissioner Ydanis Rodriguez announced the [expansion of the City's speed camera program](#). On August 1, 2022, New York City's expanded speed camera law goes into effect. The City will be able to issue violations 24 hours a day, seven days a week, year-round. NYC DOT is authorized to operate speed cameras in 750 school speed zones. By getting drivers to slow down, we will prevent crashes, protect New Yorkers from injury, and save lives.

Speeding in a school speed zone may mean a \$50 ticket. City employees are required to pay for any speeding or other traffic violations they receive in fleet vehicles. It is illegal to speed anywhere within the City of New York, but the placement of speed cameras is limited to school speed zones – streets within a quarter-mile radius of school buildings. You should always drive at or below the speed limit, regardless of where you are.

In 2014, New York City reduced its speed limit to 25 MPH to make the city safer for pedestrians, cyclists, and drivers. While speeding has decreased, it remains a major factor in fatal crashes. The faster a vehicle is moving, the harder it is for the driver of that vehicle to avoid a crash. Even a small difference in vehicle speed makes a big impact in terms of safety.

– a pedestrian who is struck by a vehicle traveling at 30 MPH is twice as likely to be killed compared to a pedestrian struck by a vehicle traveling at 25 MPH.

In addition, on July 5, Mayor Adams, along with Deputy Mayor for Public Safety Philip Banks, Police Commissioner Keechant Sewell, and NYC Sheriff Anthony Miranda, announced [**renewed enforcement against fake, altered, and illegal license plates.**](#)

Vehicle operators may not make their own license plates. They may also not alter, bend, cover-up, or otherwise distort license plates to avoid detection by speed or red light cameras or EZ pass readers. These laws apply equally to City fleet vehicles, and DCAS asks all fleet operators to check daily that their license plates are in proper condition. If there is a missing or altered license plate, report it immediately to your fleet director or agency transportation coordinator.
