Fleet Spotlight: Muhammad Nadeem, Fleet Services

For nearly 30 years, DCAS has directly served over 40 agencies and offices with comprehensive fleet services, including procurement, repair, collision and glass repair, auction, and fueling. Known as the "DCAS Client Fleet," this fleet includes nearly 4,000 fleet units, the third largest agency servicing program after NYPD and DSNY. In today's spotlight, we recognize Muhammad Nadeem, who is now playing a key role supporting all City agencies after over 20 years of support to fleet and technical services at NYC Parks.

Muhammad joined NYC Parks in January 2001. Prior to City service, Muhammad worked at JFK airport for 13 years. Muhammad began with Citywide Operations at Parks' 5-Boro Garage where he first managed the sign program. NYC has two main public sign operations—one at NYC Parks and one at NYC

DOT. Muhammad helped produce and rollout rules signs and historical and name signs that are seen by millions of New Yorkers and tourists each year.

From signs, Muhammad moved on to the horticultural equipment shop. While we tend to focus on trucks and fleet equipment in our newsletter, New York City also operates over 10,000 two and four-cycle units such as mowers, weedwhackers, chainsaws, snow blowers, pole saws, and small generators, all of which require maintenance. NYC Parks has the largest horticultural equipment program citywide. Muhammad took care of inventory, repair, fueling, and procurement of these units and helped introduce our first, early, electric models.

In 2002, Muhammad was promoted to fleet services, managing repairs and inspections for light and medium duty units including contract management. His promotion was highlighted in the Parks Daily Plant at the time. He worked at NYC Parks for over 15 years coordinating fleet services and now does the same at DCAS for all agencies citywide.



Muhammad joined DCAS in February of 2024 and is currently our coordinator for the Client Fleet Service Program. Muhammad offers first-class customer service whether you are a large client, like NYCHA with 1,000 assets, or one of our clients with only one agency vehicle. Working under DCAS Executive Director of Fleet Operations Harris Kaplan, and with Deputy Director Fouad Salem, Muhammad is helping to keep fleet readiness at over 98% for our client fleets with very steady annual costs.

Muhammad has also supported special events and emergency situations throughout his time at both agencies, and is always willing to respond to the scene seven days a week. Events that Muhammad has worked on include the Best of Parks Awards, the 9/11 Memorial Ceremony, Flight 587 Memorial, and even Dave Matthews and Bon Jovi concerts. Muhammad also played supporting roles in response to the 2003 Blackout, Hurricane Irene in 2011, and Super Storm Sandy in 2012.

Most recently at DCAS, Muhammad rushed out to the Maiden Lane area on July 29, 2024, in response to a possible stolen Department of Probation vehicle that the DCAS Fleet Office of Real Time Tracking (FORT) was monitoring. Muhammad was able to identify and confront the thief, leading to an NYPD arrest within the hour.



As per DCAS Executive Director of Fleet Operations Harris Kaplan, "Muhammad is a fleet professional with over 20 years of experience in fleet operations and emergency management. Muhammad is a pleasure to work with and provides exceptional customer service to the DCAS client agencies. Muhammad is a team player and understands that fleet is 24/7 and assists with all servicing requests quickly and efficiently."

When not at work, Muhammad spends time with his two boys, also public servants: Richard, a former US Marine who now serves with the US Army in Upstate NY; and Eddie, a Parks Supervisor for Queens Parks. Muhammad is also a grandfather to two grandsons, is a big Football Club New York soccer fan, and is looking forward to the new Flushing Stadium that Mayor Adams announced in November 2022.


