

DCAS Announces Major Expansion of Automotive Internship Program

On November 13, DCAS Commissioner Molina [announced](#) a major expansion of the automotive fleet internship program for high school students. Initially expanded to include a spring cohort in 2023, the program now offers city high school students the opportunity for hands-on automotive training all year round, bridging a vital gap in automotive education.

The internship is also a critical component of a direct pipeline from automotive high schools to City employment: the City has a civil service exam for entry-level automotive repair titles that have a two-year experience requirement that can be

satisfied with a degree from one of the City's automotive high schools, which allows for a direct pathway to civil service. The next civil service exam period for the automotive service worker [opens](#) on January 8, 2025.

Last month, DCAS welcomed the latest cohort to the automotive internship, with 14 students from across the city participating in our first fall class. Since 2015, DCAS has managed the fleet internship at fleet repair garages, and to date, nearly 500 New York City youth have participated in the program. Through the DCAS automotive internship, students gain invaluable skills and paid internship experience by performing maintenance and repairs on city vehicles from NYPD, DSNY, FDNY, DOT, and NYC Parks in garages.

On December 4, DCAS, FDNY, and NYC Public Schools hosted a recognition event for the class of fall interns at the FDNY's Engine and Ladder Shop at 34th Street in Queens. FDNY's entire team of mechanics and supervisor of mechanics at the shop greeted the students and provided a tour of one of NYC's most unique and important fleet repair operations.



The automotive internships are just one of many ways that DCAS supports automotive education. DCAS donates 21 vehicles to NYC automotive schools for use in automotive repair and driver education. Most of these are all-electric vehicles. NYPD, DSNY, and others also donate engines for repair education. DCAS and MTA chair the NYC Automotive Commission which seeks to expand public and private sector support for the automotive schools. DCAS and NYC Public Schools created an animated video to explain the benefits of electric cars, called [Batteries Included](#); and DOT, DCAS and NYC Public Schools

partner together to educate elementary school children about truck safety as part of a Vision Zero Truck Experience initiative.
