If you choose to pay the application fee with a credit/debit/gift card, you will be charged a service fee of 2.00% of the payment amount. This service fee is nonrefundable.

THE TEST DATE: Multiple-choice testing is expected to begin on **Saturday, May 7, 2022.**

The Notice of Examination is amended to add a description of the written test under THE TEST section.

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR READING THIS ENTIRE NOTICE BEFORE YOU SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION.

WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES:

Carpenters (NYC Health + Hospitals), under supervision, do installation and repair work involving rough, finish and general carpentry. They install, repair and replace flooring, partitions, window frames and sashes, door frames and doors, drop ceilings and metal framing of walls, and other related components of buildings and structures including boardwalks, fences and screens; build and repair tool boxes, movable and fixed sashes, doors and wooden office furniture, equipment for recreational areas; build and rebuild truck cabs; are familiar with, use, and operate both hand and powered woodworking equipment; build and repair various types of fire ladders; work from plans and sketches; keep job and other records; and may supervise assigned personnel. All Carpenters (NYC Health + Hospitals) perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by Carpenters (NYC Health + Hospitals) and environmental conditions experienced are: lifting and carrying building materials weighing up to approximately 80 pounds; climbing and descending ladders and scaffolds; working in hot areas in boiler rooms; working in confined spaces; standing upright for extended periods of time; working in noisy and dusty areas; using electric-powered shop equipment and power driven electrical hand tools and machinery; being able to wear OSHA approved dust masks, safety goggles, work boots and work gloves.

Special Working Conditions:

Carpenters (NYC Health + Hospitals) may be required to work various shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY:

The current minimum salary is \$53.58 per hour for a 35-hour work week. This rate is subject to change.

HOW TO QUALIFY:

You may be given the test before we verify your qualifications. You are responsible for determining whether or not you meet the education and experience requirements for this examination prior to submitting your application. If you are found "Not Qualified," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive an Admission Notice or score. (For more information see Exam Site Admission section.)

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Five years of full-time satisfactory experience as a Carpenter; **or**
2. At least three years of full-time satisfactory experience as described in "1" above, plus sufficient training of a relevant nature acquired in a trade school or vocational high school approved by a State's Department of Education or a recognized accrediting organization to make up the equivalent of five years of acceptable experience. Six months of acceptable experience will be credited for each year of approved trade or vocational high school training.

The education requirement must be met by June 30, 2022. The experience requirement must be met by the last day of the Application Period (February 23, 2022).

READ CAREFULLY AND SAVE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

The trade or vocational high school must be approved by a State's Department of Education or a recognized accrediting organization.

If you were educated outside the United States, you must have your foreign education evaluated to determine its equivalence to education obtained in the United States. This is required only if you need credit for your foreign education in this examination. For more information see the Foreign Education Evaluation Guide in the Required Information section.

During the Education and Experience Exam (EEE), you may answer questions about your experience. If your experience was on a part-time basis working less than 35 hours per week, you will need to convert your part-time experience to full-time experience using the formula below. Once you have determined your full-time experience equivalent, use this amount to answer questions about your experience.

(number of hours worked per week/35) x (number of months worked)

For example, if you worked at a job for 21 hours per week for 12 months, you would make the following calculation: 21/35 x 12 = 7.2 months.

You have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (February 23, 2022) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience and Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in the Online Application System (OASys). Once you Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys, you will not be permitted to submit new or additional information on your Education and Experience Exam online.

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (February 23, 2022), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

You will not receive credit for education which you obtain after June 30, 2022 or experience which you obtain after the end of the Application Period (February 23, 2022).

Residency Requirement Advisory: City residency is not required for this position.

Medical Requirement: In accordance with applicable Federal, state and local laws and regulations, NYC Health + Hospitals has established medical standards for this position. Accordingly, all eligibles will be required to undergo and pass a medical examination prior to the date of appointment to ensure that those medical standards have been met.

Drug Screening Requirement: You must pass a drug screening in order to be appointed.

Vaccination Requirement: As of September 27, 2021, all new hires must be vaccinated against the COVID-19 virus. If you are offered employment with NYC Health + Hospitals, you must be fully vaccinated by your date of hire.

English Requirement:

You must be able to understand and be understood in English.

Proof of Identity:

Under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, you must be able to prove your identity and your right to obtain employment in the United States prior to employment with NYC Health + Hospitals.

HOW TO APPLY:

If you believe you meet the requirements in the "How to Qualify" section, apply using the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen application instructions for electronically submitting your application and payment and completing any required information. A unique and valid email address is required to apply online. Several internet service providers, including but not limited to Google, Yahoo!, AOL, Outlook.com, and Mail.com offer free email addresses. **All new OASys accounts require verification before a candidate can apply to ensure the accuracy of candidate information. Verification is instantaneous for most accounts and you will receive a confirmation email with instructions to activate your account. For any account creation issues, you will receive onscreen prompts to contact DCAS. This review may require up to two (2) business days to be reviewed and resolved. Please keep this information and the application period deadline in mind when creating your account.**

The following methods of payment are acceptable: major credit card, bank card associated with a bank account, or a prepaid debit card with a credit card logo which you may purchase online or at various retail outlets. If you are receiving or participating in certain forms of public assistance/benefits/programs, or are a veteran, you may qualify to have the application fee waived. You may come to the DCAS Computer-based Testing & Applications Centers to apply for this examination online. However, you must schedule a customer service appointment prior to your visit. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, DCAS no longer permits walk-ins at DCAS sites.

The DCAS Computer-based Testing & Applications Centers will be closed on Saturday, February 19, and Monday, February 21, 2022.

To schedule a customer service appointment through OASys for an exam-related or eligible list-related inquiry, find **Exam #1889**, click **Apply**, and follow the instructions provided to reserve your appointment location, date, and time.

You must complete the entire application by midnight, Eastern Time, of the last day of the application period. If you have questions about applying for this examination, you may contact DCAS at OASys@dcas.nyc.gov.

Special Circumstances Guide: This guide is located on the DCAS website at https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/dcas/downloads/pdf/employment/pdf_c_special_circumstances_guide.pdf and available at the DCAS Computer-based Testing & Applications Centers. This guide gives important information about requesting an alternate test date because of religious observance or a special test accommodation for disability, claiming Veterans' or Legacy credit, and notifying DCAS of a change in your mailing address. Follow all instructions on the Special Circumstances Guide that pertain to you when you complete your "Application for Examination."

REQUIRED INFORMATION:

1. **Application for Examination:** Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.

2. **Education and Experience Exam:** Fill out all the required sections displayed onscreen (if applicable). You will have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (February 23, 2022) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant licenses and experience on your Education and Experience Exam and submit it in the Online Application System (OASys).

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (February 23, 2022), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

3. **Foreign Education Evaluation Guide (Required only if you need credit for your foreign education to meet the education and experience requirements):** If you were educated outside the United States, you must have your foreign education evaluated to determine its equivalence to education obtained in the United States. The services that are approved to make this evaluation are listed on the Foreign Education Evaluation Guide which is located on the DCAS website at <https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/dcas/downloads/pdf/employment/foreigneducation.pdf>.

When you contact the evaluation service, ask for a "**document-by-document**" (**general**) evaluation. You must have one of these services submit its evaluation of your foreign education directly to the Department of Citywide Administrative Services no later than eight weeks from the last day of the Application Period (February 23, 2022).

THE TEST:

The multiple-choice test will be given at a computer terminal. Your score on this test will be used to determine your place on an eligible list. You must achieve a score of at least 70% to pass the test.

The multiple-choice test is designed to assess the extent to which candidates have certain knowledge and abilities determined to be important to the performance of the tasks of a Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals). Task areas to be tested are as follows:

Installs, repairs, and replaces flooring, partitions, window frames and sashes, door frames and doors, furniture, stairs, cabinets, shelving, and other related components of buildings and structures.

Installs, repairs, and replaces boardwalks, fences and screens.

Builds and repairs tool boxes, movable and fixed sash, doors and equipment.

Is familiar with, uses, and operates both hand and powered woodworking equipment.

Builds and repairs various types of fire ladders.

Working with wood, metal, sheetrock, plastic (such as plexiglass, lexan, formica).

Working with trim, baseboard, casing, crown moldings.

Erects scaffolds, ramps, platforms and structures.

Works on wood and metal stick framing, sheathing, shielding, and layouts.

Prepares footing, forms and panels for concrete work.

Determines materials, labor, equipment and safety gear necessary for the job.

Fabricates forms, frames and special shapes by using hand tools, power tools and machinery.

Works from plans and sketches.

Keeps job and other records.

May supervise assigned personnel.

The test may include questions on the use of the following technical knowledge areas: carpentry tools, equipment, materials and hardware; plan reading and specifications; construction, including framing and details; safety; and other related areas.

The test may also include questions which require the use of any of the following abilities:

Written Comprehension: understanding English words and sentences. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) understands work orders and manufacturer's catalogs.

Written Expression: using English words or sentences in writing so that others will understand. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) writes notes free of grammatical errors.

Mathematical Reasoning: understanding and organizing a problem then selecting a mathematical method or formula to solve the problem. It encompasses reasoning through mathematical problems to determine appropriate operations that can be performed to solve problems. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) sees a problem with pieces that do not fit together, calculates area, and corrects.

Number Facility: the degree to which adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing can be done quickly and correctly. This can be steps in other operations like finding percentages. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) adds the lengths of a number of pieces of lumber.

Deductive Reasoning: applying general rules to specific problems to come up with logical answers. It involves deciding if an answer makes sense. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) installs stairs in a non-standard layout.

Inductive Reasoning: combining separate pieces of information or specific answers to problems to form general rules or conclusions. It involves the ability to think of possible reasons for why things go together. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) uses different types of wood for varying operations.

Information Ordering: following correctly a rule or set of rules or actions in a certain order. The rule or set of rules used must be given. The things or actions to be put in order can include numbers, letters, words, pictures, procedures, sentences and mathematical or logical operations. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) has to repair or replace a floor following procedures.

Spatial Orientation: determining where you are in relation to the location of some object or to tell where the object is in relation to you. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) determines where he is located in relation to kitchen cabinets.

Visualization: being able to imagine how something would look when it is moved around or when its parts are moved or rearranged. It requires the forming of mental images of how patterns or objects would look after certain changes, such as unfolding or rotation. One has to predict how an object, set of objects or pattern will appear after the changes have been carried out. Example: A Carpenter (NYC Health + Hospitals) determines how a ceiling would look when replaced or remodeled.

Certain questions may need to be answered on the basis of documents or other information supplied to the candidates on the date of the multiple-choice exam.

EXAM SITE ADMISSION:

Your Admission Notice will be available on your Dashboard in OASys 14 days before the first date on which testing is expected to begin. You can print or display your Admission Notice on your phone or personal device to gain entry to the test site. Test site assignments will take your address into consideration, but nearness to your address cannot be guaranteed.

Warning: After gaining entry to the test site, you are not permitted to enter the testing area with electronic devices. Electronic devices include, but are not limited to, cellular phones, smart watches, recording devices, beepers, pagers, cameras, or portable media players. You are not permitted to use any type of headphones or ear buds. Calculators are permitted; however, they must be hand-held, battery or solar powered, and numeric only. Calculators with functions other than addition, subtraction, multiplication and division are prohibited. Electronic devices with an alphabetic keyboard or with word processing or data recording capabilities such as planners, organizers, etc. are prohibited. If you use any of these devices anywhere at any test site, whether in the testing area, restroom, hallway, or other location, at any time before, during or after the test or Protest Review Session, your test score will be nullified, you will be disqualified from taking any civil service tests for up to five years, and your application fee will not be refunded.

You may not have any other person, including children, present with you while you are being processed for or taking the test, and no one may wait for you inside of a Computer-based Testing & Applications Center while you are taking the test.

Required Identification: You are required to bring one (1) form of valid (non-expired) signature and photo bearing identification to the test site. The name that was used to apply for the exam must match the first and last name on the photo ID. A list of acceptable identification documents is provided below. **If you do not have an acceptable ID, you may be denied testing.** Acceptable forms of identification (bring one) are as follows: State issued driver's license, City or State issued identification card, IDNYC, US Government issued Passport, US Government issued Military Identification Card, US Government issued Alien Registration Card, Employer ID with photo, or Student ID with photo.

Leaving: You must leave the test site once you finish the test. If you leave the test site after being fingerprinted but before finishing the test, you will not be permitted to re-enter. If you disregard this instruction and re-enter the test site, you may not receive your test results, your test score may be nullified, and your application fee will not be refunded.

CHANGE OF MAILING ADDRESS, EMAIL ADDRESS, AND/OR TELEPHONE NUMBER:

It is critical that you promptly notify DCAS of any change to your mailing address, email address and/or phone number. If we do not have your correct mailing address, email address and/or phone number, you will not receive information about your exam(s), consideration for appointment and/or important information that may require a response by a specified deadline. CHANGE OF NAME AND/OR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER:

Use the Data Correction Form and follow all instructions for changing your name and/or social security number with DCAS. The following link will provide you with the DCAS Data Correction Form: <https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/dcas/downloads/pdf/employment/dp148a.pdf>.

THE TEST RESULTS:

If you meet the education and experience requirements and pass the multiple-choice test, your name will be placed in final score order on an NYC Health + Hospitals eligible list, you will be given a list number and you will be notified by email of your test results. The eligible list determines the order by which candidates will be considered for appointment. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for appointment if your name is reached on the eligible list.

If you believe that your test part was rated incorrectly, you may submit an appeal of your score to DCAS, Committee on Manifest Errors, through the Online Application System (OASys). Your appeal must give specific reasons why your score should be higher. Your appeal may result in a higher or lower rating.

To access the appeal portal of OASys, please log into your OASys account at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs and use the following steps:

1. Navigate to the Dashboard for the Appeals tab.
2. Click the NEW APPEAL button to create and submit your appeal.
3. Select the exam from the Exam drop-down list, and
4. Select the exam part from the Exam Part drop-down list.
5. Select the reason for your appeal from the Appeal Reason drop-down list (if applicable).
6. Enter the details of your appeal by providing specific reasons why your score should be higher.

Note: You may attach up to 5 documents to support your appeal by using the attachment functionality.

SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS:

Make-up test: You may apply for a make-up test if you cannot take the test on the regular test date(s) for any of the following reasons:

1. compulsory attendance before a public body;
2. on-the-job injury or illness caused by municipal employment where you are an officer or employee of the City or NYC Health + Hospitals;
3. absence from the test within one week after the death of a spouse, domestic partner, parent, sibling, child or child of a domestic partner where you are an officer or employee of the City or NYC Health + Hospitals;
4. absence due to ordered military duty;
5. a clear error for which the Department of Citywide Administrative Services or NYC Health + Hospitals is responsible; or
6. a temporary disability, pregnancy-related, or child-birth-related condition preventing you from taking the test.

To request a make-up test, contact Administration, Customer, and Exam Support by mail at 1 Centre Street, 14th Floor, New York, NY 10007, or by email at testingaccommodations@dcas.nyc.gov, as soon as possible, and include documentation of the special circumstances that caused you to miss your test.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

This examination is for positions with NYC Health + Hospitals only. If you would like to apply for Carpenter in City agencies you must submit a separate application and fee for Exam No. 2078 from February 3, 2022 through February 23, 2022. If you would like to apply for Carpenter with the City University of New York (CUNY), you must submit a separate application and fee for Exam No. 2112 from February 3, 2022 through February 23, 2022.

Re-employment of public service retirees: NYC Health + Hospitals has promulgated rules regarding the employment of persons who have already retired from public service. Any such retired person is advised to consult with NYC Health + Hospitals Human Resources Management, Office of Civil Service and Background Administration at (212) 788-3568 to determine whether they would be eligible for appointment from an eligible list established for this examination.

Please note that NYC Health + Hospitals is a separate municipal employer; therefore, employees of New York City agencies cannot transfer to NYC Health + Hospitals. If an employee of a New York City agency accepts a position with NYC Health + Hospitals, the employee's date of appointment for the purposes of salary, seniority, and time and leave accruals is their date of appointment to NYC Health + Hospitals.

List Termination:

The eligible list resulting from this examination will be terminated one year from the date it is established, unless extended by NYC Health + Hospitals.

Application Receipt:

You will be emailed a receipt immediately after you have applied for the examination. If you do not receive this receipt, check "Junk", "Trash", or "Spam" folders for the primary email linked to your Online Application System (OASys) account. If you are unable to locate the email, you can view a summary of the notification email to you on your OASys Dashboard, then Notifications. If you are still unable to find the email, please email DCAS via the Contact feature available in OASys with a description of the issue and include the exam number and your profile number located on your Profile page. While on your Profile page, check that the email addresses you provided are correct and/or updated.

PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION:

Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after appointment, and may result in criminal prosecution.

The General Examination Regulations of the Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS) apply to this examination and are part of this Notice of Examination. They are posted at nyc.gov/dcas and copies are available at the DCAS Computer-based Testing & Applications Centers.
