WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES:

This class of positions encompasses professional electrical engineering work of varying degrees of difficulty and responsibility. There are three Assignment Levels within this class of positions.

Assignment Level I: Electrical Engineers, under general supervision, perform responsible supervisory work, or difficult and responsible work in electrical engineering. They perform the usual duties of a section engineer in charge of a major electrical engineering section or equivalent; plan, assign and review the work of subordinates, prepare progress reports, and may represent an agency, department head, or top- level engineering or architectural officer or employee in relations with City departments and agencies, contractors, damage claimants, consultants or their representatives, and the general public; engage in, or supervise the conducting of complex and important research, investigations, studies or examinations related to the engineering functions or activities of a department or agency; prepare, or supervise the preparation of, or examine and review, the electrical engineering portions or aspects of the basic design plan or significant or complex portions of the basic design plan; for major projects for the construction, remodeling, operation, maintenance, or repair of public works, structures, or installations, prepare designs, plans, contract and working drawings, contract specifications and other technical specifications; supervise the conducting of construction inspection operations with particular reference to electrical plant, machinery or apparatus, or the inspection or testing in a laboratory, manufacturer's plant, or on a job site of equipment or materials to be incorporated in public works, plants, or structures, or the inspection of premises in connection with the issuance of requisite and pertinent permits and compliance with the provisions of law, rule or regulation; participate in the supervision of the operation, maintenance and use of electrical plant, machinery or apparatus; when assigned in writing, may sign and seal engineering and other official documents. Electrical Engineers may operate a motor vehicle. All Electrical Engineers perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by Electrical Engineers and environmental conditions experienced are: walking to and from inspection sites and during the course of inspections; climbing and descending ladders or stairs to get to areas to be inspected; standing on scaffolds to inspect work; standing for an extended period of time; bending and stooping during inspections; working in confined areas; distinguishing colors; wearing protective equipment, such as hard hats; climbing over and around various objects; walking in areas that may be damp, dark, smoky or acrid; working outdoors in all kinds of weather.

Special Working Conditions:

Electrical Engineers may be required to work various shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

THE SALARY:

The current minimum salary is \$74,041 per annum. This rate is subject to change. There are three assignment levels within this class of positions. Appointments will generally be made to Assignment Level I. After appointment, employees may be assigned to the higher assignment levels at the discretion of the agency.

HOW TO QUALIFY:

You are responsible for determining whether or not you meet the education and experience requirements for this examination prior to submitting your application. If you are found "Not Qualified," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive a score.

READ CAREFULLY AND SAVE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

LICENSE, EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

A valid New York State Professional Engineer's License and either:

A master's degree in electrical engineering from an accredited college or university and three (3) years of full-time, satisfactory experience in electrical engineering work; **or** 2. Four (4) years of full-time, satisfactory experience in electrical engineering work.

This New York State Professional Engineer license must be maintained for the duration of your employment. Current New York State registration as a Professional Engineer must be maintained for the duration of your employment.

The education requirement must be met by January 31, 2024, the license requirement must be met by September 29, 2023, and the experience requirements must be met by the last day of the Application Period (September 26, 2023).

During the Education and Experience Exam (EEE), you may answer questions about your experience. If your experience was on a part-time basis working less than 35 hours per week, you will need to convert your part-time experience to full-time experience using the formula below. Once you have determined your full-time experience equivalent, use this amount to answer questions about your experience.

(number of hours worked per week/35) x (number of months worked)

For example, if you worked at a job for 21 hours per week for 12 months, you would make the following calculation: $21/35 \times 12 = 7.2$ months.

You have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (September 26, 2023) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience and Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in the Online Application System (OASys). Once you Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys, you will not be permitted to submit new or additional information on your Education and Experience Exam online.

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (September 26, 2023), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

You will not receive credit for education which you obtain after January 31, 2024, a license which you obtain after September 29, 2023, or experience which you obtain after the end of the Application Period (September 26, 2023).

Residency Requirement Advisory:

City Residency is not required.

English Requirement:

You must be able to understand and be understood in English.

Proof of Identity:

Under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, you must be able to prove your identity and your right to obtain employment in the United States prior to employment with an agency under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner, Department of Citywide Administrative Services.

HOW TO APPLY:

If you believe you meet the requirements in the "How to Qualify" section, apply using the Online Application System (OASys) at *www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs*. Follow the onscreen application instructions for electronically submitting your application, payment, and completing any required information. A unique and valid email address is required to apply online. Several internet service providers, including but not limited to Google, Yahoo!, AOL, Outlook.com, and Mail.com offer free email addresses. All new OASys accounts require verification before a candidate can apply to ensure the accuracy of candidate information. Verification is instantaneous for most accounts and you will receive a confirmation email with instructions to activate your account. For any account creation issues, you will receive onscreen prompts to contact DCAS. This review may require up to two (2) business days to be reviewed and resolved. Please keep this information and the application period deadline in mind when creating your account.

The following methods of payment are acceptable: major credit card, bank card associated with a bank account, or a prepaid debit card with a credit card logo which you may purchase online or at various retail outlets. If you are receiving or participating in certain forms of public assistance/benefits/programs, or are a veteran, you may qualify to have the application fee waived. Effective January 2020, the Online Application System is no longer supported on Windows 7 or earlier versions of Windows operating systems.

You may come to the DCAS Computer-based Testing & Application Centers to apply for this examination online. However, you must schedule a customer service appointment prior to your visit. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, DCAS no longer permits walk-ins at DCAS sites.

REQUIRED INFORMATION:

- 1. **Application for Examination:** Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.
- 2. Education and Experience Exam: Fill out all the required sections displayed onscreen (if applicable). You will have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (September 26, 2023) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience on your Education and Experience Exam and submit it in the Online Application System (OASys).

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (September 26, 2023), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

3. Foreign Education Evaluation Guide (Required <u>only</u> if you need credit for your foreign education to meet the education and experience requirements): If you were educated outside the United States, you must have your foreign education evaluated to determine its equivalence to education obtained in the United States. The services that are approved to make this evaluation are listed on the Foreign Education Evaluation Guide which is located on the DCAS website at *https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/dcas/downloads/pdf/employment/foreigneducation.pdf.* When you contact the evaluation service, ask for a "document-by-document" (general) evaluation of your foreign education. THE TEST:

Your score will be determined by an Education and Experience Exam. You will receive a score of 70 points for meeting the qualification requirements listed in the "How to Qualify" section. After these requirements are met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100 points on the following basis:

If you have satisfactory full-time experience performing electrical engineering work subsequent to receiving a New York State Professional Engineer's License for:	You will receive up to:
At least 1 year but less than 2 years	6 points
At least 2 years but less than 3 years	12 points
At least 3 years but less than 4 years	18 points
At least 4 years but less than 5 years	22.5 points
At least 5 years but less than 6 years	27 points
6 or more years	30 points
If you have an Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Certification:	You will receive:

1 point

During the Education and Experience Exam (EEE), you may answer questions about your experience. If your experience was on a part-time basis working less than 35 hours per week, you will need to convert your part-time experience to full-time experience using the formula below. Once you have determined your full-time experience equivalent, use this amount to answer questions about your experience.

(number of hours worked per week/35) x (number of months worked)

For example, if you worked at a job for 21 hours per week for 12 months, you would make the following calculation: $21/35 \times 12 = 7.2$ months.

Experience used to meet the minimum requirements cannot be used to gain additional credit.

You must clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience on your Education and Experience Exam and submit it by the end of the Application Period. You will not receive credit for experience which you obtain after the end of the Application Period.

You have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (September 26, 2023) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience and Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in the Online Application System (OASys). Once you Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys, you will not be permitted to submit new or additional information online.

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (September 26, 2023), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

Experience and certificate must be obtained by the last day of the Application Period (September 26, 2023).

THE TEST RESULTS:

If you pass the Education and Experience Exam, your name will be placed in final score order on an eligible list, you will be given a list number, and you will be notified by email of your test results. The eligible list determines the order by which candidates will be considered for appointment. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for appointment if your name is reached on the eligible list. Once a list has been established, it will typically remain active for four years. If you believe that your test part was rated incorrectly, you may submit an appeal of your score to DCAS, Committee on Manifest Errors, through the Online Application System (OASys). Your appeal must give specific reasons why your score should be higher. Your appeal may result in a higher or lower rating.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Selective Certification for Certifications, Credentials, Licenses, and/or Special Experience:

If you have the certifications, credentials, licenses, or experience listed below, you may be considered for appointment to positions requiring these certifications, credentials, licenses, or experience through a process called Selective Certification. If you wish to apply for this Selective Certification, follow the on-screen instructions when completing the Education and Experience Exam to indicate your interest in such Selective Certification and Final Submit it in the Online Application System (OASys). Your credential(s), certification(s), license(s), and experience will be checked by the appointing agency at the time of appointment.

Selective Certification For Driver License (MVO): A motor vehicle Driver License that is valid in the State of New York. If you are appointed through this Selective Certification, you must maintain your motor vehicle Driver License for the duration of your employment.

Selective Certification for Energy Management (Foundational) (EMF): A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE").

Selective Certification for Energy Management (Extensive) (EMX): A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE") and at least one of the following valid certifications from AEE: Certified Energy Auditor ("CEA"), Certified Building Commissioning Professional ("CBCP"), or Certified Measurement and Verification Professional ("CMVP").

Selective Certification for Energy Auditing (ENA): At least one of the following valid certifications: Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE"), Certified Energy Auditor ("CEA") certification from AEE, High-Performance Building Design Professional ("HBDP") certification from the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air Conditioning Engineers ("ASHRAE"), Building Energy Assessment Professional ("BEAP") certification from ASHRAE, or MultiFamily Building Analyst ("MFBA") certification from the Building Performance Institute ("BPI").

Selective Certification for Building Commissioning (BDC): At least one of the following valid certifications: Existing Building Commissioning Professional ("EBCP") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE"), Certified Building Commissioning Professional ("CBCP") certification from AEE, or Certified Commissioning Authority ("CxA") certification from AABC Commissioning Group ("ACG").

Selective Certification for Analyzing Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GHG): At least one (1) year of fulltime, satisfactory experience conducting analysis, inventories, and/or verification of GHG emissions.

Selective Certification for Energy Management (Foundational) and Sustainability (EFS): A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE") and at least one of the following valid credentials: LEED Green Associate ("LEED GA") accreditation from the U.S. Green Building Council ("USGBC"), LEED Accredited Professional accreditation from the USGBC with specialization in Building Design + Construction or Operations + Maintenance ("LEED AP BD+C" or "LEED AP O+M"), or Environmental Sustainability Professionals ("ENV SP") certification from the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure ("ISI").

Selective Certification for Sustainability (SUS): At least one of the following valid credentials: LEED Green Associate ("LEED GA") accreditation from the U.S. Green Building Council ("USGBC"), LEED Accredited Professional accreditation from the USGBC with specialization in Building Design + Construction or Operations + Maintenance ("LEED AP BD+C" or "LEED AP O+M"), or Environmental Sustainability Professionals ("ENV SP") certification from the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure.

Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Fire Protection Engineering Experience (FEE): At least one (1) year of satisfactory, full-time experience, in designing, reviewing, or inspecting fire alarm systems, emergency communication systems, and/or energy storage systems.

Selective Certification for Experience in Energy Conservation and Efficiency (ECE): At least one (1) year of full time, satisfactory experience in New York City Energy Conservation Code (NYCECC), analysis of property's energy usage, and/or building energy audits.

Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Electrical Systems Experience (LHP): At least one (1) year of full time, satisfactory experience in the design or examination of plans for electrical systems for light, heat, and/or power distribution for buildings and/or building equipment systems.

Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Environmental Experience (EEX) (Department of Environmental Protection only): At least six (6) months of full-time, satisfactory experience in electrical engineering in wastewater treatment, sanitary engineering, water treatment, landfill design/construction, and/or ground water treatment.

Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Sewer and/or Water Experience (ESW) (Department of Environmental Protection only): At least six (6) months of full-time, satisfactory experience in electrical engineering for sewers, sewer collection systems, water, and/or water distribution systems for developing, implementing, rehabilitating, usage projection, planning, and/or managing the engineering of improvement projects, including conceptual design through detailed construction design, preparation of contract documents, construction services, and regulatory permitting.

Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Tunnel Experience (TUN) (Department of Environmental Protection only): At least six (6) months of full-time, satisfactory experience in electrical engineering tunnel work.

Application Receipt:

You will be emailed a receipt immediately after you have applied for the examination. If you do not receive this receipt, check "Junk", "Trash", or "Spam" folders for the primary email linked to your Online Application System (OASys) account. If you are unable to locate the email, you can view a summary of the notification email to you on your OASys Dashboard, then Notifications. If you are still unable to find the email, please email DCAS via the Contact feature available in OASys with a description of the issue and include the exam number and your profile number located on your Profile page. While on your Profile page, check that the email addresses you provided are correct and/or updated.

Promotion Test: A promotion examination for this title is being held for eligible employees. The names appearing on the promotion list will be considered first in filling vacancies.
