THE TEST DATE: Multiple-choice testing is expected to begin on Monday, August 17, 2026.

WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES:

This is a supervisory technical class of positions with varying degrees of difficulty and responsibility encompassing construction project management work and the oversight of construction work necessary for constructing, rehabilitating, renovating and maintaining public buildings, structures, infrastructures, facilities and grounds or publicly owned subsidized or regulated residential buildings.

At Assignment Level I: Construction Project Managers, under supervision, perform construction management work and/or initiate and supervise work in the construction field including overseeing rehabilitation projects; assisting in overseeing routine reconstruction projects; perform difficult technical work in determining the need for and feasibility of construction work; oversee private contractors/vendors carrying out new construction, rehabilitation, repairs, alterations and/or structural maintenance work. Some of the duties of a Construction Project Manager include preparing shop orders, scope of work, routine specifications and cost estimates; accepting contractors' submissions of subcontractors for approval, ensuring agency's review, and maintaining contract files and written records; Construction Project Managers review and/or inspect contractors' work and contract administration for compliance with plans and contract specifications, prevailing wage requirements, site safety requirements, insurance requirements, and the City's vendor outreach programs. Furthermore, they ensure contractors acquire required permits and approvals. Authorizing the issuance of repair jobs to vendors; working with the architect or engineer of record regarding change orders, interpretation of documents, shop drawing approvals, and other architectural and engineering related issues; recommending issuance of change orders to comply with changing field conditions or specification/drawing errors and/or omissions; upon approval of recommendation, preparing change orders; reviewing and approving other contract changes in accordance with citywide procedures; reviewing and approving contractors' payments and requisitions submitted by contractors; operating a motor vehicle to visit job sites. Construction Project Managers may also supervise staff performing asbestos removal or lead abatement work involving removal or encapsulation of lead contained in or on any surface. All Construction Project Managers perform related work.

Special Working Conditions:

Construction Project Managers may be required to work various shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

Some of the physical activities performed by Construction Project Managers and environmental conditions experienced are: walking to and from inspection sites and during inspections; climbing and descending ladders or stairs to get to areas to be inspected; working on exposed heights; standing for extended periods of time; working in confined areas; wearing hard hats and other protective clothing in construction areas; bending and stooping during inspections; climbing over and around various objects; working in areas that may be hot, cold, damp, dark, dusty, smoky or acrid; working outdoors, including in natural areas, in all kinds of weather; may come into contact with rodents and/or insects; may be required to wear DEET; may supervise or inspect the removal of asbestos and/or lead requiring the use of a respirator. (This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY:

The current minimum salary is \$66,330 per annum. This rate is subject to change. There are three assignment levels within this class of positions. Appointments will generally be made to Assignment Level I.

READ CAREFULLY AND SAVE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

After appointment, employees may be assigned to the higher assignment levels at the discretion of the agency.

HOW TO QUALIFY:

You may be given the test before we verify your qualifications. It is your responsibility to ensure that you meet the education and experience requirements for the examination before submitting your application. If you are deemed "Not Qualified," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive an Admission Notice or score.

As per Section 54(2) of the Civil Service Law, the education requirement needed to qualify must be met by May 27, 2027. The experience requirement needed to qualify must be met by the last day of the Application Period (May 27, 2026). The license requirement must be met by May 29th, 2026.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

1. A four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent **and five years** of full-time satisfactory experience managing and/or inspecting one or more construction projects which must have a total cost of at least \$300,000 for each of the five years of the required experience; **or**
2. One year of the experience as described in "1" above **and** a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university, in engineering, engineering technology, architecture, architectural technology, landscape architecture, construction, construction technology, or construction management; **or**
3. One year of the experience as described in "1" above **and** a valid license as a professional engineer, registered architect, or registered landscape architect, issued by a board of examining engineers, architects, or landscape architects duly established and qualified pursuant to the laws of any state or territory of the United States; **or**
4. A four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent **and** a combination of at least two years of experience as described in "1" above and the education as described below to equal a total of five years of education and experience. One year of experience credit will be given for each 30 semester credits from an accredited college or university in engineering, engineering technology, architecture, architectural technology, landscape architecture, construction, construction technology, or construction management, up to a maximum of three years of experience.

The high school diploma or its educational equivalent must be approved by a State's Department of Education or a recognized accrediting organization. The college or university must be accredited by regional, national, professional, or specialized agencies recognized as accrediting bodies by the U.S. Secretary of Education and by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA).

If you were educated outside the United States, you must have your foreign education evaluated to determine its equivalence to education obtained in the United States. This is required only if you need credit for your foreign education in this examination. For more information see the Foreign Education Evaluation Guide in the Required Information section.

During the Education and Experience Exam (EEE), you will get instructions on converting part-time experience to the full-time equivalent.

You must Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period, and once you Final Submit, no changes can be made.

Failure to click Final Submit by the deadline will result in an incomplete application, and you will not receive a score or a refund of the application fee.

Driver License Requirement: At the time of appointment, you must possess a motor vehicle driver license valid in the State of New York with no restrictions that preclude the performance of Construction Project Manager work. Serious moving violations, license suspension or accident record may disqualify you. If appointed, you are required to obtain a New York State Class B Commercial Driver License with no restrictions within your probationary period. This New York State Class B Commercial License with no restrictions must be maintained for the duration of your employment.

Medical Requirement for Certain Assignments:

Employees assigned to supervise asbestos removal or lead abatement staff must meet applicable regulatory and medical requirements. Such employees must not have any condition which would prevent a good face seal when wearing a respirator. Periodic medical examinations will be administered as applicable while persons are assigned to supervision of asbestos removal or lead abatement.

Residency Requirement Advisory:

City residency is not required for this position.

English Requirement:

You must be able to understand and be understood in English.

Proof of Identity:

Under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, you must be able to prove your identity and your right to obtain employment in the United States prior to employment with an agency under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner, Department of Citywide Administrative Services.

HOW TO APPLY:

Apply through the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen application instructions to submit your application and payment. A valid email address is required. Free email accounts are available from Google, Yahoo!, AOL, Outlook.com, or Mail.com.

New OASys accounts must be verified to confirm your email address is valid and that you have access to the email account. You will receive a confirmation email from OASys to confirm your account upon registering for your OASys account. If any issues arise, contact DCAS at nyc.gov/CivilServiceNowNYC and select the applicable subject. If you do not receive the confirmation email, check your spam or junk mail folder before contacting DCAS.

Application Receipt:

After applying for the examination through the Online Application System (OASys), expect an immediate receipt via email. If you don't see it, be sure to check your Junk, Trash, or Spam folders. Alternatively, you can view a summary of your application status on your OASys Dashboard under "Notifications."

PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION:

Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after appointment, and may result in criminal prosecution.

REQUIRED INFORMATION:

1. **Application for Examination:** Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.
2. **Education and Experience Exam:** Complete the exam by following the on-screen instructions. You must provide detailed information about your licenses, education, and experience and finalize your submission in the Online Application System (OASys) by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the application period.

Once you click on Final Submit, no further changes can be made. Failure to submit by the deadline will result in your examination being deemed incomplete, and you will not receive a score or be invited to any subsequent exam portions. Additionally, your application fee will not be refunded.

3. **If applicable, ensure your foreign education evaluation is submitted directly to DCAS by an approved evaluation service within eight weeks after the application deadline.** Approved evaluation services are listed in the Foreign Education Evaluation Guide which is located on the DCAS website at <https://www.nyc.gov/assets/dcas/downloads/pdf/employment/nyc-dcas-foreign-education-evaluation-guide.pdf>. If you wish to claim a high school diploma in paragraph "1", or a baccalaureate degree in one of the acceptable fields stated in paragraph "2" in the "How to Qualify" section, then ask for a **"document-by-document"** (general) evaluation. B. If you wish to claim semester credits in one of the acceptable fields stated in paragraph "4" in the "How to Qualify" section, then ask for a **"course-by-course"** evaluation (which includes a "document-by-document" evaluation).

THE TEST:

The multiple-choice test will be given at a computer terminal. Your score on this test will be used to determine your place on an eligible list. You must achieve a score of at least 70% to pass the test.

The multiple-choice test is designed to assess the extent to which candidates have certain abilities and technical knowledge determined to be important to the performance of the tasks of a Construction Project Manager.

Task categories to be tested are as follows: Resolving Construction-Related Problems, Planning Construction, Overseeing Construction and Assuring Compliance, Performing Construction Cost Estimates, Directing Construction, Inspecting Construction, and Managing Project Close-Out.

The test may include questions on construction techniques, materials, equipment, safety practices and OSHA law and regulations; pertinent parts of the Building Code of the City of New York, Accessible Design and Building practices and other applicable codes and laws; contracts, plans, specifications, payments, and change orders; scheduling and coordination of work; job-related mathematics; report writing; record keeping; environmental hazards regarding construction; standards of proper employee ethical conduct; and other related areas.

The multiple-choice test will include questions requiring the use of any of the following abilities:

Material Resources Management: This skill involves managing material resources, including obtaining and seeing to the appropriate use of equipment, facilities, and materials needed to do certain work.

Example: A Construction Project Manager may use this skill to evaluate material needs, costs, and changes that are a result of shortages.

Number Facility: The degree to which adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing can be done quickly and correctly. These can be steps in other operations, such as finding percentages. **Example:** A Construction Project Manager may use this ability to perform basic calculations related to their assigned projects.

Personnel Resource Management: This skill involves managing personnel resources, including identifying the best people for the job, motivating, developing, and directing people as they work. **Example:** A Construction Project Manager may use this skill to assign work to the best person, manage the work of contractors or other internal staff.

Teamwork: The ability to work with people as part of a team and collaborate on ideas and decisions. **Example:** A Construction Project Manager may use this ability to create a collaborative environment in order to complete the work being done.

Written Comprehension: The ability to understand written sentences and paragraphs. **Example:** A Construction Project Manager may use this ability to read reports, emails, and contract documents.

Certain questions may need to be answered on the basis of documents or other information supplied to the candidates on the date of the multiple-choice exam.

EXAM SITE ADMISSION:

Your Admission Notice will be available on your Dashboard in OASys 14 days before the first date on which testing is expected to begin. Test site assignments will take your address into consideration, but nearness to your address cannot be guaranteed.

Warning: The use of electronic devices at the test site is strictly prohibited. This includes phones, smart watches, cameras, e-cigarettes, vape pens and/or other portable media or electronic devices. Any of these items brought to the test site will be placed in a Yondr pouch and sealed until after the exam event (Examination, Protest Review Session, TVB session). Headphones and earbuds are also not allowed. Only basic, hand-held calculators with addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division functions are permitted; calculators with additional features are banned and will be sealed in a Yondr pouch if brought to the site. If you use any prohibited devices or remove them from your Yondr pouch without authorization-whether in the testing area, restroom, hallway, or any other location-you will have your test score nullified, be barred from taking civil service tests for up to five years and forfeit your application fee.

If you have a medical assistive device that sends alerts or vibrates, you must obtain written authorization from DCAS to use it during the test. To request authorization, contact DCAS at testingaccommodations@dcas.nyc.gov. Furthermore, you cannot bring anyone with you while being processed or taking the test, and no one is allowed to wait for you inside the Computer-based Testing & Application Center during the exam.

Required Identification: To enter the test site, you must bring one valid (non-expired) ID that includes both your signature and photo. The name on your ID must match the first and last name used in your exam application. If you fail to provide an acceptable form of identification, you may be denied entry to the test. Acceptable forms of identification (bring one) are as follows: State issued driver's license, City or State issued identification card, IDNYC, US Government issued Passport, US Government issued Military Identification Card, US Government issued Alien Registration Card, Employer ID with photo, or Student ID with photo.

Leaving: After completing your test, you must leave the test site immediately. If you exit the site after being fingerprinted but before finishing the test, you will not be allowed to re-enter. Ignoring this instruction and attempting to re-enter could result in not receiving your test results, nullification of your test score, and forfeiture of your application fee.

CHANGE OF MAILING ADDRESS, EMAIL ADDRESS, AND/OR TELEPHONE NUMBER:

It is essential to promptly notify DCAS of any changes to your mailing address, email address, or phone number. Without your correct contact information, you may miss important updates regarding your exam(s), appointment considerations, or critical information that requires a timely response. THE TEST RESULTS:

If you meet the education and experience requirements, and pass the multiple-choice test, your name will be placed on an eligible list in final score order. You will receive a list number and be notified of your test results via email. This eligible list determines the order of candidates considered for appointment, usually active for four years.

If you believe your test was rated incorrectly, you can appeal your score to DCAS, Committee on Manifest Errors, using the Online Application System (OASys). Your appeal must clearly state the reasons for requesting a higher score and may result in a different rating.

SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS:

Late Filing:

If you are currently provisionally employed by the City of New York, consult your **agency's Personnel Office/Human Resources** to determine the procedure for filing a late application if you meet one or more of the following conditions:

- You are provisionally employed in the title for which the examination is administered and were absent from work for at least one-half of the application period and cannot apply for reasons such as vacation, sick leave, or military duty; **or**
- You were appointed provisionally to the title for which the examination is administered after the application period closed but before the date on which testing is expected to begin.

Make-up Test:

You may apply for a make-up test if you cannot take the test on the regular test date(s) for any of the following reasons:

1. being ordered to military duty; or
2. compulsory attendance before a court or other public body or official having the power to compel attendance; or
3. on-the-job injury or illness caused by municipal employment where you are an officer or employee of the City; or
4. absence from the test within one week after the death of a spouse, domestic partner, parent, parent-in-law, sibling, child or child of a domestic partner where you are an officer or employee of the City; or
5. a clear error for which the Department of Citywide Administrative Services or the examining agency is responsible; or
6. a temporary disability; or
7. pregnancy, childbirth or a related medical condition.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

If you have the experience, credentials, or certifications listed below, you may be considered for appointment to positions requiring this experience, credentials, or certifications through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this experience, credentials, or certifications. Follow the instructions given to you on the day of the multiple-choice test to indicate your interest in such Selective Certification. **Your experience, credentials, or certifications will be checked by the appointing agency at the time of appointment.**

1. **Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Bridge Experience (BRS):** At least one (1) year of fulltime, satisfactory experience in bridge related work, i.e. design, construction, maintenance and/or inspection of bridges.
2. **Selective Certification for Energy Management Foundational (EMF):** A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE").
3. **Selective Certification for Energy Management Extensive (EMX):** A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE") and at least one (1) of the following valid certifications from AEE: Certified Energy Auditor ("CEA"), Certified Building Commissioning Professional ("CBCP"), or Certified Measurement and Verification Professional ("CMV").
4. **Selective Certification for Energy Auditing (ENA):** At least one (1) of the following valid certifications: Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE"), Certified Energy Auditor ("CEA") certification from AEE, High-Performance Building Design Professional ("HBDP") certification from the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air Conditioning Engineers ("ASHRAE"), Building Energy Assessment Professional ("BEAP") certification from ASHRAE, or MultiFamily Building Analyst ("MFBA") certification from the Building Performance Institute ("BPI").
5. **Selective Certification for Building Commissioning (BDC):** At least one (1) of the following valid certifications: Existing Building Commissioning Professional ("EBCP") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE"), Certified Building Commissioning Professional ("BCF") certification from AEE, or Certified Commissioning Authority ("CxA") certification from AABC Commissioning Group ("ACG").

6. **Selective Certification for Sustainability (SUS):** At least one (1) of the following valid credentials: LEED Green Associate ("LEED GA") accreditation from the U.S. Green Building Council ("USGBC"), LEED Accredited Professional accreditation from the USGBC with specialization in Building Design + Construction or Operations + Maintenance ("LEED AP BD+C" or "LEED AP O+M"), or Environmental Sustainability Professionals ("ENV SP") certification from the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure.
7. **Selective Certification for Energy Management Foundational and Sustainability (EFS):** A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE") and at least one of the following valid credentials: LEED Green Associate ("LEED GA") accreditation from the U.S. Green Building Council ("USGBC"), LEED Accredited Professional accreditation from the USGBC with specialization in Building Design + Construction or Operations + Maintenance ("LEED AP BD+C" or "LEED AP O+M"), or Environmental Sustainability Professionals ("ENV SP") certification from the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure ("ISI").
8. **Selective Certification For Experience Analyzing Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GHG):** At least one (1) year of full-time, satisfactory experience conducting analysis, inventories, and/or verification of GHG emissions.
9. **Selective Certification for Transportation Construction Management (TMT):** At least two (2) years of full-time, satisfactory experience in construction management of roadway infrastructure, physical systems, and Intelligent Transportation System ITS deployment.
10. **Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Construction Environmental Health and Safety Experience (CHS):** At least two (2) years of full-time, satisfactory experience in an executive, managerial, or administrative capacity in construction safety and environmental work, e.g. preparing and reviewing Job Hazard Analysis, Health and Safety Plans and conducting EHS audits and inspections with knowledge of OSHA 1926-Safety and Health Regulations for Construction, New York City and State safety and environmental laws, rules and regulations.
11. **Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Certified Construction Manager certification (CMG):** A valid Certified Construction Manager certification issued by the Construction Management Association of America (CMAA).
12. **Selective Certification for a New York State Professional Engineering License (PEC):** A valid New York State Professional Engineer's License.
13. **Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Tunnel Experience (TNL):** At least six (6) months of fulltime, satisfactory experience in the project management of tunnel work. Experience in this area must be in a construction capacity.
14. **Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Wastewater Systems and Operations, or Environmental or Sewer and/or Water Experiences (ESW):** At least one (1) year of full-time, satisfactory experience in supervising employees performing wastewater management project work, in either: water systems for wastewater collections, treatment, biosolids management, combined sewer storage, resource recovery, energy management, advanced system upgrades, strategic planning, and coordination across operational units; or environmental experience in the project management of wastewater treatment, sanitary engineering, water treatment, construction experience, and/or groundwater treatment; or sewer and/or water systems experience in project management for sewers, sewer collection systems, water, and/or water distribution systems for developing, implementing, rehabilitating, usage projection, planning, and/or managing the engineering of improvement projects, through preparation of contract documents, construction services, and regulatory permitting.
15. **Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Water System Protection and Operations Experience (WPE):** At least three (3) years of full-time, satisfactory experience in source water protection or reservoir system operations and maintenance, e.g. review for approval of septic system and storm water pollution prevention plans, development of system operations and maintenance plans for multi-reservoir water systems to include all appurtenant facilities such as dams, bridges, aqueducts, highways and control work, review and inspection of advanced wastewater treatment facilities, implementing, rehabilitating, usage projection, planning, and/or managing the engineering of improvement projects.
16. **Selective Certification for Municipal Government Experience (MGE):** At least one (1) year full-time, satisfactory experience working within a municipal government in a similar position, which provides services for a city with over 1 million in population.
17. **Selective Certification for Design-Build (DBI):** At least one of the following valid certifications: Design-Build Professional ("DBIA") certification, or an Associate Design-Build Professional ("Assoc. DBIA"), issued by the Design-Build Institute of America, may select this certification.
18. **PMI Project Management Professional Certification (58V):** A valid certification as a Project Management Professional (PMP) issued by the Project Management Institute (PMI).
19. **Selective Certification for Construction Project Manager Positions Requiring Experience in Energy Conservation and Efficiency (ECE):** At least one (1) year of full-time, satisfactory experience in New York City Energy Conservation Code (NYCECC), analysis of property's energy usage, and/or building energy audits.
20. **Selective Certification for Energy-Efficient Building Operations (EBO):** At least one of the following valid credentials: Building Operator Certification Levels I and II ("BOC I and II"), issued by Northwest Energy Efficiency Council, Operations & Performance Management Professional ("OPMP"), issued by ASHRAE, and the Systems Maintenance Technician ("SMT®") Designation issued by BOMA.
