WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES:

This class of positions encompasses professional environmental engineering work of varying degrees of difficulty and responsibility. There are three Assignment Levels within this class of positions.

At Assignment Level I: Environmental Engineers under general supervision, perform responsible supervisory work, or difficult and responsible work in the field, office, or laboratory in environmental and/or fire protection engineering. Environmental Engineers act as section engineers in charge of a major environmental or fire protection engineering section or the equivalent; plan, assign, and review the work of subordinates, prepare progress reports, and may represent an agency in relations with City agencies, contractors, consultants, or their representatives, and the general public in matters relating to environmental and/or fire protection engineering; engage in, or supervise the conduct of complex and important research, investigations, studies, or examinations related to the environmental and/or fire protection engineering functions or activities of a department or agency; prepare or supervise the preparation of the basic design plan or significant and complex portions of the basic design plan, including fire protection portions for major environmental engineering projects for the construction, remodeling, operation, maintenance, or repair of public works, structures, grounds, or installations; make interpretive detail sketches or layouts of intricate or fundamental portions or aspects of the basic design plan for engineering projects as proposed or adopted, and prepare maps, designs, plans, contract and working drawings, estimates, contract specifications, and other technical specifications; approve or supervise the design, inspection, construction, demolition, and/or alteration of premises, installations, or apparatus to ensure compliance with contracts, drawings, specifications, codes, resolutions, statutes, rules, and regulations; prepare reports on contracts and contract estimates, contract modifications and recommendations of award; participate in the development of proposals for major engineering projects with regard to the acquisition, disposition, or the public or private use of City property, the conduct of surveys, and the construction, operation or maintenance of public works, plants, or structures; plan, implement, and review studies of environmental impact and pollution control devices; prepare and develop and/or supervise the preparation and development of new and revised pollution control criteria, guides and standards; supervise the operation, maintenance of all fire protection systems and their associated components and equipment, in conjunction with failsafe elements of construction; supervise the inspection operation or testing operation in a laboratory, manufacturer's plant, or on a job site, of equipment and materials to be incorporated in public works, plants, or structures; supervise the operation and maintenance of public works and the preparation of recommendations for alterations or repairs; when assigned in writing, may sign and seal engineering and other official documents; and may operate a motor vehicle in the performance of assigned duties. All Environmental Engineers perform related work.

Special Working Conditions:

Environmental Engineers may be required to work various shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

Some of the physical activities performed by Environmental Engineers and environmental conditions experienced are: walking to and from inspection sites and walking during inspections, climbing and descending ladders and stairs to get to the area to be inspected, standing on scaffolds, standing for an extended period of time, bending and stooping during inspections, working in confined spaces, distinguishing colors, wearing protective equipment like a hard hat, climbing over and around objects, walking and working in areas that may be damp, dark, smoky, acrid, or under construction, working outdoors in all kinds of weather.

(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY:

The current minimum salary is \$78,740 per annum. This rate is subject to change. There are three assignment levels within this class of positions. Appointments will generally be made to Assignment Level I. After appointment, employees may be assigned to the higher assignment levels at the discretion of the agency.

HOW TO QUALIFY:

It is your responsibility to ensure that you meet the education and experience requirements for the examination before submitting your application. If you are deemed "Not Qualified," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive a score.

As per Section 54(2) of the Civil Service Law, the education requirement needed to qualify must be met by June 23, 2027. The experience requirement needed to qualify must be met by the last day of the Application Period (June 23, 2026). The license requirement needed to qualify must be met by June 30, 2026.

License, Education, and Experience Requirements:

You must have a valid New York State Professional Engineer's License **and either:**

1. A master's degree in environmental, fire protection, chemical, mechanical, petroleum, aeronautical, or materials engineering from an accredited college or university and three (3) years of full-time, satisfactory experience in environmental and/or fire protection engineering work; **or**
2. Four (4) years of full-time, satisfactory experience in environmental engineering and/or fire protection engineering work.

Current New York State registration as a Professional Engineer must be maintained for the duration of your employment.

The college or university must be accredited by regional, national, professional, or specialized agencies recognized as accrediting bodies by the U.S. Secretary of Education and by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA).

If you were educated outside the United States, you must have your foreign education evaluated to determine its equivalence to education obtained in the United States. This is required only if you need credit for your foreign education in this examination. For more information see the Foreign Education Evaluation Guide in the Required Information section.

During the Education and Experience Exam (EEE), you will get instructions on converting part-time experience to the full-time equivalent.

You must Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period, and once you Final Submit, no changes can be made.

Failure to click Final Submit by the deadline will result in an incomplete application, and you will not receive a score or a refund of the application fee.

Residency Requirement Advisory:

City residency is not required for this position.

English Requirement:

You must be able to understand and be understood in English.

Proof of Identity:

Under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, you must be able to prove your identity and your right to obtain employment in the United States prior to employment with an agency under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner, Department of Citywide Administrative Services.

HOW TO APPLY:

Apply through the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen application instructions to submit your application and payment. A valid email address is required. Free email accounts are available from Google, Yahoo!, AOL, Outlook.com, or Mail.com.

New OASys accounts must be verified to confirm your email address is valid and that you have access to the email account. You will receive a confirmation email from OASys to confirm your account upon registering for your OASys account. If any issues arise, contact DCAS at nyc.gov/CivilServiceNowNYC and select the applicable subject. If you do not receive the confirmation email, check your spam or junk mail folder before contacting DCAS.

You can pay with major credit cards, bank cards, or prepaid debit cards with a credit card logo. Veterans and individuals receiving certain public assistance may qualify for a fee waiver. Application Receipt:

After applying for the examination through the Online Application System (OASys), expect an immediate receipt via email. If you don't see it, be sure to check your Junk, Trash, or Spam folders. Alternatively, you can view a summary of your application status on your OASys Dashboard under "Notifications."

If you still can't find the email, contact DCAS at nyc.gov/CivilServiceNowNYC and select the applicable subject. Include your exam number and profile number for easier identification. Also, verify that your email address in your profile is accurate and up to date. Finally, add OASys@dcas.nyc.gov to your known senders to ensure you receive all important communications.

PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION:

Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after appointment, and may result in criminal prosecution.

REQUIRED INFORMATION:

1. **Application for Examination:** Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.
2. **Education and Experience Exam:** Complete the exam by following the on-screen instructions. You must provide detailed information about your licenses, education, and experience and finalize your submission in the Online Application System (OASys) by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the application period.

Once you click on Final Submit, no further changes can be made. Failure to submit by the deadline will result in your examination being deemed incomplete, and you will not receive a score or be invited to any subsequent exam portions. Additionally, your application fee will not be refunded.

3. **If applicable, ensure your foreign education evaluation is submitted directly to DCAS by an approved evaluation service within eight weeks after the application deadline.** Approved evaluation services are listed in the Foreign Education Evaluation Guide located on the DCAS website at <https://www.nyc.gov/assets/dcas/downloads/pdf/employment/nyc-dcas-foreign-education-evaluation-guide.pdf>. Request a "document-by-document" (general) evaluation.

THE TEST:

You will be given an Education and Experience Exam. Your score on this test will be used to determine your place on an eligible list. On the Education and Experience Exam, you will receive a score of 70 points for meeting the qualification requirements listed above. After these requirements are met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100 points on the following basis:

Certifications/licenses/credentials, education, and experience used to gain additional credit must be obtained by the last day of the Application Period (June 23, 2026).

THE TEST RESULTS:

If you pass the Education and Experience Exam, your name will be placed on an eligible list in final score order. You will receive a list number and be notified of your test results via email. This eligible list determines the order of candidates considered for appointment, usually active for four years.

If you believe your test was rated incorrectly, you can appeal your score to DCAS, Committee on Manifest Errors, using the Online Application System (OASys). Your appeal must clearly state the reasons for requesting a higher score and may result in a different rating.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Selective Certification for License, Certificate and/or Special Experience: If you have the license, certification, and/or experience listed in one or more of the areas listed below, you may be considered for appointment to positions requiring the license, certification, and/or experience through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this license, certification, and/or experience. If you wish to apply for this Selective Certification, follow the onscreen instructions when completing the Education and Experience Exam to indicate your interest in such Selective Certification and Final Submit it in the Online Application System (OASys). **Your license, certification(s), and/or experience will be checked by the appointing agency at the time of appointment.**

1. **AmeriCorps (AMC):** Successful completion of at least ten (10) months of satisfactory, full-time experience as a NYC Service AmeriCorps member at a City agency or non-profit organization, which includes 100+ hours of workforce preparedness trainings.
2. **Building Commissioning (BDC):** At least one of the following valid certifications: Existing Building Commissioning Professional ("EBCP") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE"), Certified Building Commissioning Professional ("BCF") certification from AEE, or Certified Commissioning Authority ("CxA") certification from AABC Commissioning Group ("ACG").

3. **Civil Service Pathways Fellowship (FEL):** Successful completion of at least one (1) year of the Civil Service Pathways Fellowship program.
4. **Construction Project Manager Positions Requiring Experience in Energy Conservation and Efficiency (ECE):** At least one (1) year of full-time, satisfactory experience in New York City Energy Conservation Code (NYCECC), analysis of property's energy usage, and/or building energy audits.
5. **Design-Build (DBI):** At least one of the following valid certifications: Design-Build Professional ("DBIA") certification, or an Associate Design-Build Professional ("Assoc. DBIA"), issued by the Design-Build Institute of America, may select this certification.
6. **Driver License (MVO):** A motor vehicle Driver License that is valid in the State of New York.
7. **Energy-Efficient Building Operations (EBO):** At least one of the following valid credentials: Building Operator Certification Levels I and II ("BOC I and II"), issued by Northwest Energy Efficiency Council, Operations & Performance Management Professional ("OPMP"), issued by ASHRAE, and the Systems Maintenance Technician ("SMT®") Designation issued by BOMA.
8. **Energy Management Foundational (EMF):** A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE").
9. **Energy Management Extensive (EMX):** A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE") and at least one of the following valid certifications from AEE: Certified Energy Auditor ("CEA"), Certified Building Commissioning Professional ("CBCP"), or Certified Measurement and Verification Professional ("CMVP").
10. **Energy Auditing (ENA):** At least one of the following valid certifications: Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE"), Certified Energy Auditor ("CEA") certification from AEE, High-Performance Building Design Professional ("HBDP") certification from the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air Conditioning Engineers ("ASHRAE"), Building Energy Assessment Professional ("BEAP") certification from ASHRAE, or Multifamily Building Analyst ("MFBA") certification from the Building Performance Institute ("BPI").
11. **Energy Management Foundational and Sustainability (EFS):** A valid Certified Energy Manager ("CEM") certification from the Association of Energy Engineers ("AEE") and at least one of the following valid credentials: LEED Green Associate ("LEED GA") accreditation from the U.S. Green Building Council ("USGBC"), LEED Accredited Professional accreditation from the USGBC with specialization in Building Design + Construction or Operations + Maintenance ("LEED AP BD+C" or "LEED AP O+M"), or Environmental Sustainability Professionals ("ENV SP") certification from the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure ("ISI").
12. **Experience Analyzing Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GHG):** At least one (1) year of full-time, satisfactory experience conducting analysis, inventories, and/or verification of GHG emissions.
13. **Federal Government Experience (FGE):** At least one (1) year of satisfactory, full-time experience working within the federal government of the United States in a similar position.
14. **Municipal Government Experience (MGE):** At least one (1) year of satisfactory, full-time experience working within a municipal government in a similar position, which provides services for a city with over 1 million in population.
15. **PMI Project Management Professional Certification (58V):** A valid certification as a Project Management Professional (PMP) issued by the Project Management Institute (PMI).
16. **Sustainability (SUS):** At least one of the following valid credentials: LEED Green Associate ("LEED GA") accreditation from the U.S. Green Building Council ("USGBC"), LEED Accredited Professional accreditation from the USGBC with specialization in Building Design + Construction or Operations + Maintenance ("LEED AP BD+C" or "LEED AP O+M"), or Environmental Sustainability Professionals ("ENV SP") certification from the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure.

The above Selective Certification requirements may be met at any time during the duration of the list. If you meet the Selective Certification requirement at some future date, please submit a request by contacting DCAS via the following link: nyc.gov/CivilServiceNowNYC using the "Selective Certification" subject. Please include the examination title and number, your full name, OASys Profile ID number, and the Selective Certification(s) you are requesting in your submission. If appointed through Selective Certification, the license or certification(s) must be maintained for the duration of your employment.

Promotion Test: A promotion examination for this title is being held for eligible employees. The names appearing on the promotion list will be considered first in filling vacancies.
