WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES:

Stationary Engineers (NYC Health + Hospitals), under supervision, operate, maintain, and adjust steam power plant and electro-mechanical building equipment. They operate, maintain and adjust boilers, furnaces, engines, pumps, heat exchangers, generators, motors, chillers, cooling towers, equipment for heating, ventilating, air conditioning, lighting and associated equipment in public buildings, including medical air pumps, medical vacuum pumps and air compressions for control air; are responsible for air balancing for negative and positive pressure rooms; make periodic inspections of equipment and minor repairs to such equipment; perform preventive maintenance; test, treat and maintain water systems; take responsible charge of a watch, and while so engaged, are responsible for and direct subordinate personnel; may operate control consoles in control rooms; prepare requisitions for materials and spare parts; instruct and train subordinates and other personnel; read meters, gauges, and other recording devices and log the data; keep records and write reports; as directed, inspect low pressure boilers in accordance with a unified inspection procedure instituted by the New York City Department of Buildings. All Stationary Engineers (NYC Health + Hospitals) perform related work.

Special Working Conditions:

Stationary Engineers (NYC H+H) may be required to work various shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

Some of the physical activities performed by Stationary Engineers (NYC Health + Hospitals) and environmental conditions experienced are: working in confined areas in a physical plant, including a boiler room, heating room, and/or ventilating room; walking up and down stairs; working on and from ladders, platforms, and scaffolds; handling chemicals; and being around hazardous materials, such as asbestos and infectious waste.

(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY:

The current minimum salary is \$73.90 per hour, for a 40-hour work week. This rate is subject to change.

ELIGIBILITY TO TAKE EXAMINATION:

This examination is open to each employee of the NYC Health + Hospitals, who **on the last day of the application period (August 26, 2025):**

- (1) holds a permanent (not provisional) competitive appointment or appears on a Preferred List (see Note, below) for the title of Plant Maintainer (Hospitals)/Oiler (NYC Health + Hospitals) or Plant Maintainer (Hospitals)/Tender (NYC Health + Hospitals); **and**
- (2) is not otherwise ineligible.

(Note: A "Preferred List" is a civil service list which is only for certain former permanent employees of the eligible title who have rehiring rights.)

READ CAREFULLY AND SAVE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

This examination is also open to employees who were promoted to an eligible title pursuant to Regulation 4 of NYC Health + Hospitals' Personnel Rules and Regulations, and who meet all other eligibility requirements.

If you do not know if you are eligible, check with **your facility's Human Resources Department**. You are responsible for determining whether or not you meet the eligibility requirements for this examination prior to submitting your application. If you are marked "Not Eligible," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive a score.

ELIGIBILITY TO BE PROMOTED:

In order to be eligible for promotion, you must have completed your probationary period in the eligible title as indicated in the above "Eligibility To Take Examination" section, and you must be permanently employed in the eligible title or your name must appear on a Preferred List for the eligible title at the time of promotion. Additionally, you must have served permanently in the eligible title for at least one year.

REQUIREMENT(S) TO BE PROMOTED:

License/Certificate Requirements: By the last date of the application period (August 26, 2025), you must possess:

1. A valid license for High Pressure Boiler Operating Engineer issued by the New York City Department of Buildings; **and**
2. A valid Certificate of Qualification for Refrigerating Systems Operating Engineer (Q-01/Q-99) issued by the New York City Fire Department; **and**
3. A valid Universal Section 608 Technician Certification issued by a certifying organization approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

These licenses/certificates must be maintained for the duration of your employment. If promoted with a Q-99, you must obtain a Q-01 within 90 days from the date of promotion.

For certain positions, you will be required, within 90 days from the day of promotion, to obtain a valid Certificate of Fitness for Supervision of Standpipe Systems (Citywide) (S-13), Supervision of Multi-Zone Standpipe Systems (S-14), Supervision of Sprinkler Systems (Citywide) (S-12), to Operate and Maintain Air Compressors (A-35), Supervision of Fire Alarm Systems (S-95), Fire Alarm Systems Inspection, Testing and Service Principal (Citywide) (S-97), Supervision of Piped Non-Flammable Medical Gases (G-71), Torch Use of Flammable Gas (G-60), Supervision of a Bulk Oil Storage Plant (P13) and/or any other site specific required certification issued by the New York City Fire Department.

You must clearly specify in detail all of your relevant licenses and certificates on your Profile page and submit your Education and Experience Exam in the Online Application System (OASys) by the end of the Application Period (August 26, 2025).

HOW TO APPLY:

If you believe you are eligible to take this examination, apply using the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen application instructions for electronically submitting your application, payment, and completing any required information. A unique and valid email address is required to apply online. Several internet service providers, including but not limited to Google, Yahoo!, AOL, Outlook.com, and Mail.com offer free email addresses. **All new OASys accounts require verification before a candidate can apply to ensure the accuracy of candidate information. Verification is instantaneous for most accounts and you will receive a confirmation email with instructions to activate your account. For any account creation issues, you will receive onscreen prompts to contact DCAS. This review may require up to two (2) business days to be reviewed and resolved. Please keep this information and the application period deadline in mind when creating your account.**

The following methods of payment are acceptable: major credit card, bank card associated with a bank account, or a prepaid debit card with a credit card logo which you may purchase online or at various retail outlets. If you are receiving or participating in certain forms of public assistance/benefits/programs, or are a veteran, you may qualify to have the application fee waived. REQUIRED INFORMATION:

1. **Application for Examination:** Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.
2. **Education and Experience Exam:** Fill out all the required sections displayed onscreen (if applicable). You will have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience on your Education and Experience Exam and submit it in the Online Application System (OASys).

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

THE TEST:

Your score will be determined by an Education and Experience Exam. You will receive a score of 70 points for meeting the eligibility and license/certificate requirements listed above. After these requirements are met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100 points on the following basis:

Experience used to gain additional credit must be obtained by the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025).

If you have satisfactory full-time experience working for the City of New York as a permanent (non-provisional) employee, for any governmental entity other than the City of New York, or for any private employer operating a high pressure boiler while in possession of a valid license for High Pressure Boiler Operating Engineer issued by the New York City Department of Buildings, a valid Certificate of Qualification for Refrigerating System Operating Engineer (Q-01/Q-99) issued by the New York City Fire Department and a valid Universal Section 608 Technician Certification issued by a certifying organization approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency:

You will receive up to:

In a Hospital or Long Term Care Facility for:

At least 1 year but less than 2 years	6 points
At least 2 years but less than 3 years	12 points
At least 3 years but less than 4 years	18 points
At least 4 years but less than 5 years	24 points
5 or more years	30 points

If you have satisfactory full-time experience operating a high-pressure boiler in other than a Hospital or Long-Term Care Facility while in possession of a valid license for High Pressure Boiler Operating Engineer issued by the New York City Department of Buildings, a valid Certificate of Qualification for Refrigerating System Operating Engineer (Q-01/Q-99) issued by the New York City Fire Department, and a valid Section 608 Technician Certification issued by a certifying organization approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, for:

You will receive up to:

At least 1 year but less than 2 years	3 points
At least 2 years but less than 3 years	6 points
At least 3 years but less than 4 years	9 points
At least 4 years but less than 5 years	12 points
5 or more years	15 points

During the Education and Experience Exam (EEE), you may answer questions about your experience. If your experience was on a part-time basis working less than 35 hours per week, you will need to convert your parttime experience to full-time experience using the formula below. Once you have determined your full-time experience equivalent, use this amount to answer questions about your experience.

(number of hours worked per week/35) x (number of months worked)

For example, if you worked at a job for 21 hours per week for 12 months, you would make the following calculation: $21/35 \times 12 = 7.2$ months.

You may claim a maximum of one year of experience credit for each year you worked. Each year of experience will be credited under only one category which will be the highest appropriate category.

You must clearly specify in detail all of your relevant experience on your Education and Experience Exam and submit it by the end of the Application Period. You will not receive credit for experience which you obtain after the end of the Application Period (August 26, 2025).

You have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience and Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in the Online Application System (OASys). Once you Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys, you will not be permitted to submit new or additional information online.

If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (August 26, 2025), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.

CHANGE OF MAILING ADDRESS, EMAIL ADDRESS, AND/OR TELEPHONE NUMBER:

THE TEST RESULTS:

If you pass the Education and Experience Exam and are marked eligible, your name will be placed in final score order on a NYC Health + Hospitals eligible list, you will be given a list number, and you will be notified by email of your test results. The eligible list determines the order by which candidates will be considered for promotion. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for promotion if your name is reached on the NYC Health + Hospitals eligible list and you will receive a Notice of Interview by email.

If you believe that your test part was rated incorrectly, you may submit an appeal of your score to DCAS, Committee on Manifest Errors, through the Online Application System (OASys). Your appeal must give specific reasons why your score should be higher. Your appeal may result in a higher or lower rating.

To access the appeal portal of OASys, please log into your OASys account at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs and use the following steps:

1. Navigate to the Dashboard for the Appeals tab.
2. Click the NEW APPEAL button to create and submit your appeal.
3. Select the exam from the Exam drop-down list, and
4. Select the exam part from the Exam Part drop-down list.
5. Select the reason for your appeal from the Appeal Reason drop-down list (if applicable).
6. Enter the details of your appeal by providing specific reasons why your score should be higher.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Please note that NYC Health + Hospitals is a separate municipal employer; therefore, employees of New York City agencies cannot transfer to NYC Health + Hospitals. If an employee of a New York City agency accepts a position with NYC Health + Hospitals, the employee's date of appointment for the purposes of salary, seniority, and time and leave accruals is their date of appointment to NYC Health + Hospitals.

Application Receipt:

You will be emailed a receipt immediately after you have applied for the examination. If you do not receive this receipt, check "Junk", "Trash", or "Spam" folders for the primary email linked to your Online Application System (OASys) account. If you are unable to locate the email, you can view a summary of the notification email to you on your OASys Dashboard, then Notifications. If you are still unable to find the email, please email DCAS via the Contact feature available in OASys with a description of the issue and include the exam number and your profile number located on your Profile page. While on your Profile page, check that the email addresses you provided are correct and/or updated.

List Termination: The eligible list resulting from this examination will be terminated one year from the date it is established, unless extended by NYC Health + Hospitals.

This promotion examination is for NYC Health + Hospitals only and not for City agencies or the City University of New York (CUNY). If you would like to apply for the promotion examination for Stationary Engineer for City agencies, you must submit a separate application and fee for Exam No. 6549 from August 6, 2025 through August 26, 2025. If you would like to apply for the promotion examination for Stationary Engineer (CUNY), you must submit a separate application and fee for Exam No. 6546 from August 6, 2025 through August 26, 2025.

PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION:

Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after promotion, and may result in criminal prosecution.

The General Examination Regulations of the Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS) apply to this examination and are part of this Notice of Examination. They are posted at nyc.gov/dcas and copies are available at the DCAS Computer-based Testing & Application Centers.
