

**DIRECTOR OF CRIME STRATEGIES AND ANALYSIS (KINGS DA)**

**General Statement of Duties and Responsibilities**

This is a management class of positions

Under executive direction, with broad scope for the exercise of independent initiative, judgment, and decision-making, oversees, administers, and implements complex, confidential law enforcement intelligence gathering and analysis programs, projects, and functions of the Office. Advises District Attorney and executive staff regarding policy development and implementation of crime strategies, and intelligence-driven prosecution initiatives. Performs highly confidential managerial work and supervision of assigned staff, consults on crime strategies and analysis, and performs related work.

**Examples of Typical Tasks**

As Director of Crime Strategies and Analysis of the King County District Attorney (KCDA), oversees, administers, and implements complex, confidential law enforcement intelligence gathering and analysis programs, projects, and functions of the Office.

Advises District Attorney and executive staff regarding policy development and implementation of crime strategies, and intelligence-driven prosecution initiatives.

Performs highly confidential managerial work and supervision of assigned staff, consults on crime strategies and analysis, and performs related work.

Responsible for developing and implementing intelligence-driven prosecution strategies targeting priority offenders and neighborhoods.

Advises agency officials regarding policy, development, and implementation of crime analysis, crime strategies, and intelligence-driven prosecution initiatives. Performs related confidential studies and/or research for the District Attorney.

May represent the District Attorney through attendance at meetings, hearings, and other events, and may present Office programs on his behalf.

**Qualification Requirements**

A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university and five (5) years of full-time, satisfactory administrative, managerial experience in Business or Public Administration, or a related field, including two (2) years in Criminal Justice or a related field.

**Direct Lines of Promotion**

**None.** This class of positions is classified in the Non-Competitive class.
