

CHAPLAIN (JUVENILE DETENTION CENTER)

General Statement of Duties and Responsibilities

Under direction, conducts religious services and provides spiritual and moral guidance for juvenile delinquents and persons in need of supervision in a child care facility; performs related work.

Examples of Typical Tasks

Schedules and conducts religious services for juvenile delinquents and persons in need of supervision in a child care facility who are of the Chaplain's faith.

Organizes and conducts a religious educational program and coordinates the religious programs with other programs of the institution.

Makes pastoral calls on the newly admitted, sick or about to be released youths of the Chaplain's faith.

Counsels youth of his/her faith at the facility and their families on personal, moral and spiritual problems.

Cooperates with psychiatrists, social workers and other staff members on personal, moral and spiritual problems of the youth at the facility.

Maintains cooperative relationships with social service agencies and other community organizations.

CHAPLAIN (JUVENILE DETENTION CENTER) (continued)

Qualification Requirements

Ecclesiastical endorsement by the official endorsing agency of the candidate's faith or denomination, and by the Committee on Chaplaincies.
