

PART I

Fiscal Year 2014 Recap

Mayor Bill de Blasio took office in January 2014 with a mandate to establish new ways for government to work for all New Yorkers. He appointed Tom Finkelpearl as Commissioner of the Department of Cultural Affairs (DCLA) to connect the City’s arts and cultural sector to this broader vision. Commissioner Finkelpearl, who served as President and Executive Director of the Queens Museum from 2002 until his appointment, brought to the Agency a deep understanding of the role culture plays in building strong communities.

In the first months of the new administration, the Agency’s baseline funding was preserved, stabilizing this critical source of support for the city’s nonprofit groups. DCLA also allocated tens of millions of dollars for new capital projects at cultural organizations in all five boroughs, and joined the Mayor to announce new funding and a renewal in the City’s commitment to provide high quality arts education for public school students. DCLA continued to work with its partners in and out of City government to expand access to the City’s cultural resources and to demonstrate that in New York City, **art and culture are for everyone.**

New Initiatives



DIVERSITY INITIATIVE

New York City is the most diverse city in the country by many measures. Yet studies show that in the U.S., arts and cultural organizations often don't reflect the richness of the communities they serve. Recognizing this as a critical issue for sustaining the future of the arts in New York City and connecting all New Yorkers to the City's extraordinary cultural assets, DCLA launched a major initiative in January 2015 to promote diversity among the staffs, boards, and audiences of cultural organizations. The initiative launched with a survey of DCLA-funded cultural groups to examine race, ethnicity, gender, disability, age, and other factors to set a benchmark understanding of where the cultural community's strengths are and where we can work together to promote best practices of more inclusive institutions. The long-term goal is to strengthen the cultural sector as a whole by cultivating organizations that will encourage future diverse generations to seek careers and fulfillment in the arts.

As part of the initiative's launch, in January and February 2015, DCLA convened a series of conversations about diversity led by Darren Walker, President of the Ford Foundation; Maya Wiley, Counsel to Mayor de Blasio; Arnold Lehman, Director of the Brooklyn Museum; Commissioner Finkelpearl; and others. These kickoff events at Ford Foundation in Manhattan and BRIC in Brooklyn drew representatives from over 400 organizations, and demonstrated the shared commitment to making real progress on this fundamental issue.



IDNYC

On January 15, 2015, the City launched IDNYC, a municipal identification card available to all residents of New York City above the age of 14, regardless of immigration status. The card serves as valid, government-issued ID, providing access to City buildings such as schools and courts, proof of identification in interactions with police, and a range of innovative benefits. DCLA partnered with the Mayor’s Office of Immigrant Affairs (MOIA) to offer one of the card’s most popular features: free one-year memberships at all 33 organizations in the Cultural Institutions Group (CIG) including museums, performance

arts centers, zoos, and botanical gardens (for a complete list of CIGs, see page 33). This partnership promoted the important message that our cultural resources are integral to city life and that they are open to *all* New Yorkers. The immediate and overwhelmingly positive response to the promotion confirmed our residents’ desire to connect more with culture: by the end of June 2015, more than 265,000 residents signed up for an ID, and used them to redeem more than 30,000 cultural memberships.

AFFORDABLE REAL ESTATE FOR ARTISTS (AREA)

In his 2015 State of the City address, Mayor de Blasio acknowledged the great value artists bring to the vibrancy and cultural vitality of New York City, and affirmed the City's commitment to attract, retain, and support creative workers. To that end, the Mayor pledged to build 1,500 units of affordable housing for artists and 500 below-market artist work spaces over the next decade, and a taskforce was formed to identify pipeline projects to meet the mandate. The initiative is managed in partnership with the Department of Housing Preservation & Development (HPD), and the Economic Development Corporation (EDC).

SOCIAL IMPACT OF THE ARTS PROJECT

In early 2015, the University of Pennsylvania's pioneering Social Impact of the Arts Project (SIAP) set out to study the correlation between cultural activity and other social indicators. In their studies of Philadelphia, SIAP found that higher rates of cultural activity correlate with lower social stress, improved school effectiveness, and even a decrease in violent crimes. With support from The New York Community Trust's Cultural Agenda Fund and Surdna Foundation, SIAP will conduct the same study in New York City to track and measure the impact of cultural engagement throughout

our communities. This research, which DCLA is happy to participate, will provide a powerful new way of understanding the role culture plays in New York and how it can contribute to a more just and equitable city.

CULTURAL PLAN

In May 2015, Commissioner Finkelpearl joined Mayor de Blasio as he signed legislation initiated by NYC Council Members Jimmy Van Bramer and Stephen Levin, to create the first comprehensive cultural plan for New York City. The plan will address a range of topics including the availability and distribution of cultural activities in the five boroughs, the relationship between the presence of culture and social and economic health and welfare, housing and studio needs of artists, and arts education and activities in public schools. The legislation establishes a Citizens' Advisory Committee, which will inform the development of the plan through June 2017.

TURNAROUND ARTS

On June 3, 2015, DCLA and the Department of Education (DOE) proudly announced New York City's participation in Turnaround Arts, a national education reform program designed to improve low-performing public schools through the integration of robust arts programming. Spearheaded by the President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities, in coordination with the White House, the U.S. Department of Education, and several foundations, it is the first federal program to specifically support arts education as an improvement tool in high-poverty, underperforming schools.

Aligning Turnaround Art with the de Blasio administration's neighborhood-based approach to urban renewal and revitalization, DCLA and DOE selected four middle schools in central Brooklyn to join the program: East Flatbush Community Research School and Ebbets Field Middle School in Crown Heights, and P.S. 165 and P.S. 284 in Brownsville.

The Turnaround Local Program Director will work closely with each school leadership team to develop and implement comprehensive, school-specific arts integration programs for each school. Each participating school will receive arts supplies and musical instruments, licensing rights to perform school musicals, professional development in the arts and arts integration for teachers, strategic planning assistance and coaching. The program also enlists high-profile artists to engage with students throughout the year, and in Brooklyn, Paula Abdul, Marc Anthony, Misty Copeland, and Edward Norton have joined the effort.



INTER- AGENCY CULTURAL PARTNERSHIPS

Just as the arts are a part of everyday life in New York, so too are the services provided by City agencies, from trash collection to small business services. With support from Mayor de Blasio, DCLA is promoting the use of arts and culture to other city agencies looking for new ways to engage residents and increase access to services. Past examples – including artist Mierle Laderman Ukeles' decades-long residency with the Department of Sanitation; Seniors Partnering with Artists Citywide (SPARC), a partnership with the Department

for the Aging; and NeON Arts, a partnership between the Department of Probation and Carnegie Hall – serve as inspiration for possible new arts collaborations with other areas of City government. In July 2015, DCLA enounced the first partnership to result from this new effort, an artist-in-residence opportunity for artist Tania Bruguera at the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs.

DIGITAL DCLA

In January 2015, DCLA launched a suite of social media platforms including official Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram profiles in an effort to increase transparency and expand the Agency’s engagement with the public. These new channels join an active Tumblr blog dedicated to showcasing artwork from the Percent for Art program and the dynamic digital presence of Materials for the Arts across multiple digital platforms.



Highlights from the Agency’s new digital strategy include **#NYCultureTalks**, an ongoing series of Twitter discussions about topics critical to the cultural community; and **#NYCultureTrip**, a series that gives the diverse organizations the Agency supports the chance to share images depicting their own contributions to and experiences with the City’s rich cultural life. In just the first few months of #NYCultureTrip, DCLA partnered with many groups as they prepared to open exhibitions, stage performances, launch education initiatives and public programs, and celebrate organizational and programmatic milestones. Participating groups included: Art21, Guggenheim Museum, Casita Maria Center for Arts and Education, Staten Island Museum, Public Art Fund, El Museo del Barrio, Socrates Sculpture Park, and many more.

CultureAID

In the wake of Superstorm Sandy, DCLA convened a steering committee of cultural service organizations to explore ways to streamline aid provided to the cultural community following disasters.

With seed funding provided by the Arthur P. Sloane Foundation, the committee formed a new communications network called CultureAID (Culture Active in Disasters), designed to coordinate and communicate resources effectively to the cultural sectors across the five boroughs in time of disaster. DCLA and the City’s Office of Emergency Management (OEM) announced the official launch of CultureAID in September 2014 at the Martha Graham Dance Center, which sustained significant damage to its collection during Superstorm Sandy and has provided a model of resilience and recovery in the storm’s wake. By early 2015, CultureAID had almost 100 member organizations.

“New York’s arts community was hit hard in Hurricane Sandy, suffering alongside neighbors across the City as facilities were flooded and irreplaceable works of art were damaged or lost. CultureAID will help the artists and cultural groups that are so vital to our city’s vibrancy minimize the impact of future disasters by promoting preparedness and providing information about recovery resources more efficiently.”

OneNYC

In the first months of 2015, DCLA participated in the de Blasio administration’s effort to create a long term vision for a growing, equitable, sustainable, and resilient New York City. The resulting plan, OneNYC, includes for the first time ‘culture’ as a key tennant of a thriving city.

DCLA worked with residents, civic and business leaders, elected officials, and City agencies to articulate their cultural priorities for OneNYC: high quality cultural programming in all neighborhoods, organizational capacity building in underserved areas, cultural partnerships with public agencies to better serve residents, an easier permitting process to increase access to public spaces, and expanded use of public spaces via more cultural programming. DCLA will continue to work with partners across the City to address these goals.

Program Services

In FY15, DCLA continued its commitment to supporting arts and cultural programming at nonprofit organizations across New York City through the Cultural Development Fund (CDF). The CDF provides grants for a vast array of cultural activities each year, including museum and gallery exhibitions, plays, dance performances, festivals, arts education programs, and many others that reflect the breadth of the City’s cultural life.

For the FY15 CDF grant cycle, DCLA convened 20 panels of members from the arts community and representatives from City Council and the Borough Presidents’ offices to review


applications and determine project eligibility and funding for applicants. Of the 1,037 organizations that applied for funding, 84% received grants. In total, 858 cultural organizations were awarded \$33,930,021, including \$5,467,725 in one-time allocations from members of the City Council.

Cultural Institutions Group (CIG)

DCLA oversees the Cultural Institutions Group (CIG), 33 private nonprofit organizations that occupy City-owned property and receive annual subsidies for providing programming and facilities that are open to the public. From zoos and botanical gardens to museums, historical societies, theaters, and performing arts centers, the CIG offers residents and visitors of all ages an extraordinary array of high-quality cultural experiences. Additionally, with over 10,000 full and part-time employees, over 20 million visitors every year, and thousands of different programs, the CIG makes significant contributions to the economic strength of the City as a whole.

A New Generation of Leaders

FY15 brought numerous leadership transitions to the CIG. Claudia Bonn, **Wave Hill's** President and Executive Director for seven years, was succeeded by Karen Meyerhoff of the Guggenheim Museum. After 18 years as Director

of the **Brooklyn Museum**, Arnold Lehman was succeeded by Anne Pasternak, longtime President and Artistic Director of Creative Time. Karen Brooks Hopkins, President of the **Brooklyn Academy of Music** since 1999, will be followed by Katy Clark, President and Executive Director of the Orchestra of St. Luke's. The **Brooklyn Children's Museum** named Brooklyn native Stephanie Hill Wilchfort, formerly of the Tenement Museum, as its next president and CEO, succeeding Mindy Duitz, who was

serving as the interim president and CEO. And **Metropolitan Museum of Art** President Emily K. Rafferty retired after 10 years in her post and nearly 40 at the institution. The Museum's board appointed Daniel H. Weiss, President of Haverford College, to the position. These departing leaders have left a remarkable legacy in these thriving, vibrant institutions, expanding the reach and role that culture plays in the life of our city.



Capital Projects



Through renovations, new construction, and equipment purchases, DCLA's capital funding contributes to the long-term sustainability of NYC's cultural sector. Innovative, award-winning cultural capital projects enliven the City's landscape; up-to-date environmental systems allow organizations to have a cleaner carbon footprint; and ADA-compliant additions ensure access to all visitors. New purchases of lighting systems, theater seating, audio-visual equipment, improved information technology, and other crucial upgrades help ensure the highest quality cultural experiences for all audiences.

In FY15, DCLA allocated \$148 million in new funding for construction, upgrades, equipment purchases, and other improvements at cultural organizations across the five boroughs.



Percent for Art

For over 30 years, DCLA's Percent for Art program has beautified and enriched neighborhoods throughout the City with permanent works of public art. Since the program's inception in 1982, more than 300 projects have been completed, and nearly 90 more are underway.

In FY15, Percent for Art oversaw the completion of eight new installations in a variety of media. The City's robust public art program also successfully commissioned seven new art installations to be developed for public sites in the coming years.

New Legislation

Community engagement has always been central to how Percent for Art commissions artwork. But in May 2015, Mayor de Blasio signed into legislation a bill requiring greater public input into the Percent for Art review process by requiring public presentations to be made earlier in the projects' development timeline.

Community Arts
Development Program

With funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development’s Community Development Block Grant program, DCLA’s Community Arts Development Program (CADP) provides capacity-building for cultural organizations serving low- to moderate-income neighborhoods and populations. In FY15, CADP offered its second round of Community Arts Leadership, a yearlong program consisting of a workshop series and one-on-one technical assistance from experts in the nonprofit and cultural field. The program provided intensive instruction for 12 organizations with budgets of \$500,000 or less in financial management, strategic planning, and board governance. The participants had special access to speakers addressing other relevant topics, such as improving communication skills, perfecting printed and online materials, and exploring legal issues specific to nonprofits. In December 2014, CADP joined Brooklyn Historical Society to host *Good Governance!*, an event that brought together board chairs of more than 75 cultural institutions to network and share effective leadership strategies.

Materials for the Arts

Materials for the Arts (MFTA) is New York City’s premier municipal reuse program, providing donated goods free of charge to nonprofit arts-related organizations, public school teachers, and City agencies. MFTA helps groups save money on a range of supplies, from fabric and paint to paper goods and office furniture, while helping spark creativity by integrating everyday objects into artistic practice. In FY15, MFTA collected materials worth \$7.3 million and made them available to 2,105 groups during MFTA’s free shopping days.

In addition to the materials warehouse, MFTA’s Education Center engages thousands of teachers and children each year. Public school teachers and community-based educators can take P-Credit and other professional development courses to further their careers, as well as workshops in creative reuse designed to help them utilize MFTA materials for lessons in all subject areas. MFTA also provides field trips for students, as well as in-school residencies that place teaching artists into schools for extended

periods of time.

In recent years, MFTA has added new opportunities for artists and the public to engage in creative reuse. In addition to the **MFTA Gallery** and **artist residency program**, both established in 2012, MFTA recently added **Third Thursday** to its list of public engagement efforts, offering classes to the general public in art-making with reusable materials.

Friends of Materials of the Arts (FOMA) is the nonprofit partner of MFTA that has sustained and grown MFTA’s educational efforts and arts programming. In FY15, FOMA assisted with the curation of the five gallery exhibitions and the launch of mftaTV, a new online platform that debuted with the original series, *Creative Reuse in the Classroom*. Additionally, with support from the New York Community Trust, FOMA established three in-school residencies at PS5, PS4 and PS297 in Bedford-Stuyvesant, Brooklyn to transform the school community and integrate arts into the Common Core.

Seniors Partnering with Artists Citywide (SPARC)

In FY15, DCLA, in partnership with the NYC Department for the Aging (DFTA) and five borough arts councils joined together to offer the fourth year of Seniors Partnering with Artists Citywide (SPARC). This innovative partnership places artists in 50 DFTA-funded senior centers throughout the City to provide participatory, interactive arts experiences for older adults. Artists applying to SPARC were encouraged to propose challenging and original projects, resulting in a wide array of unique programming including an all-senior production of *Romeo and Juliet*, puppet-making, printing and bookmaking, storytelling, music composition, and more.





City Council Initiatives

DCLA further expands access to arts and culture by administering funds provided by the New York City Council for the following Council-sponsored initiatives:

CULTURAL IMMIGRANT INITIATIVE

In FY15, City Council announced the new Cultural Immigrant Initiative to support arts and cultural activities that either serve a significant number of immigrant and foreign-born New Yorkers, or present or represent the traditions, cultures, or experiences of immigrant communities in New York City. These special awards enhance the artistic offerings of and to populations that are often underserved, providing greater opportunities for the cultural heritages of all New Yorkers to be recognized for their creative contributions to the City. \$1.5 million was allocated to 72 organizations for programming in all 51 Council districts.

CULTURAL AFTER-SCHOOL ADVENTURES (CASA)

DCLA continues to oversee Cultural After-School Adventures (CASA), a City Council program that pairs arts organizations with New York City public schools to offer cultural activities to students in after school programs.

In FY15, the Council increased CASA's budget by \$2 million to reach a total of \$7.1 million. Each Council member received \$140,000 to allocate among seven designations in their district. In total, 357 schools partnered with 125 cultural organizations.




