Platforms for Online Learning

These are some platforms that NYC cultural organizations are using as part of their remote learning experience:

- Zoom
- Google Meet: Free service with free closed captioning, no breakout room capabilities.
- Screencastify: Free Chrome extension that enables user to create and share screen and webcam videos.
- Flipgrid: Free, accessible video discussion experience for PreK to PhD educators, learners, and families.
- Buncee: Online templates to help students visualize, voice, and communicate their learning.
- Pear Deck: Pear Deck makes your slides interactive so every student can respond to your questions or prompts right on their own screens.
- Movavi: Free easy-to-use video editor for Mac
- SpatialChat: A fluid chat system that allows participants to move closer to people to engage with and more fluidly split into groups.
- MentiMeter: A free (or paid) service that enables the user to launch live polls, quizzes, word clouds, Q&As and more to get real-time input - regardless if you're remote, hybrid or face-toface.
- Gather.Town: Each participant is reimagined as an 8-bit character that is able to walk freely around a virtual space. As the avatar gets closer to another character, you are able to video chat. Free for up to 25 participants at a time. Includes other features like whiteboards, games, spotlight feature, private meeting spaces, and Zoom integration.
