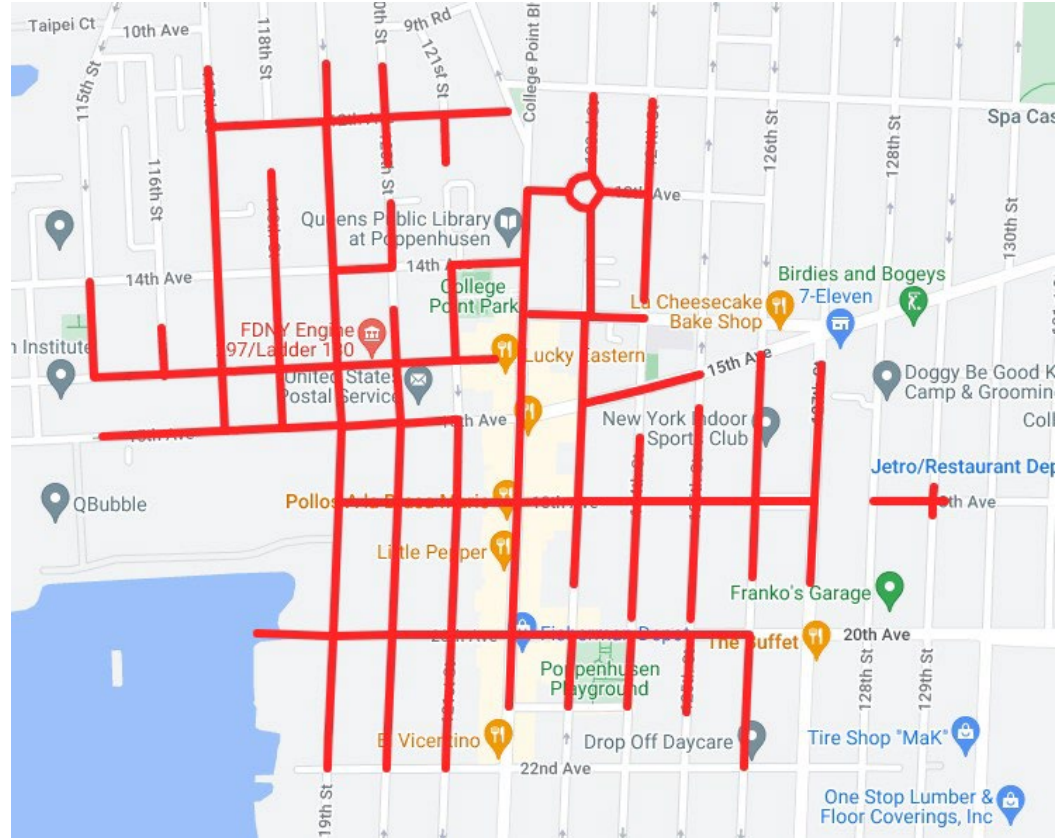

Purpose of Project

- Improve overall area drainage
- Alleviate flooding
- Keep rainwater out of the sewer system
- Replace aging infrastructure
- Maintain clean, safe water supply with adequate pressure
- Provide smooth, safe streets

Benefits of infrastructure upgrades

Storm sewer

- Less frequent flooding
- Avoid combined sewer overflow

Sanitary sewer

- Avoid backups

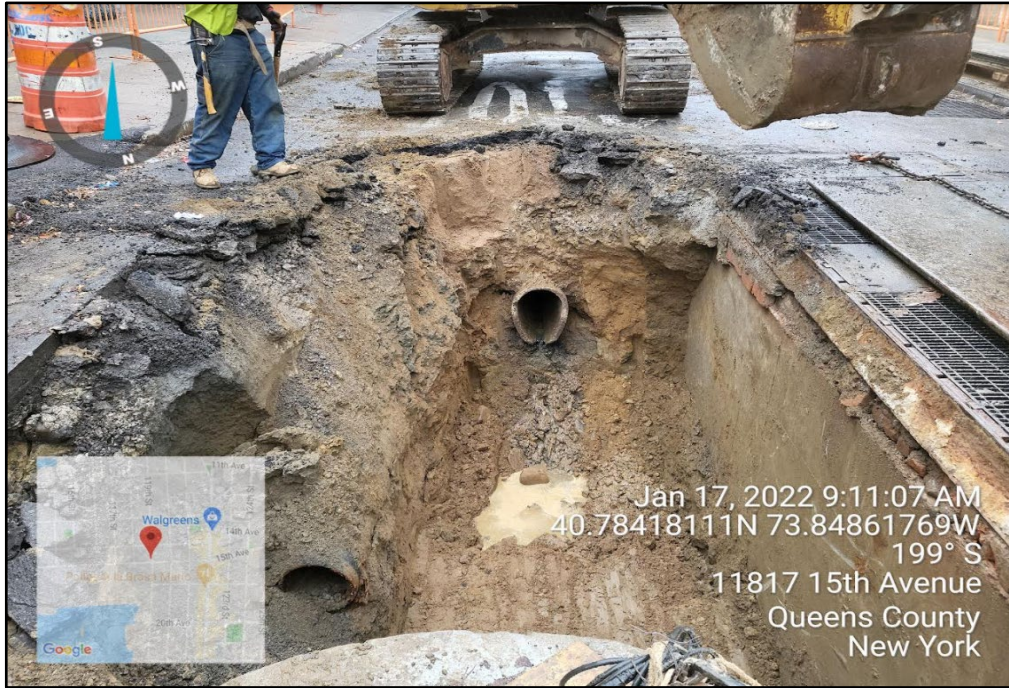
Catch basins

- Collect stormwater from streets and sidewalks
- Improve health of local waterways

Water main

- Stable and secure supply of clean water
- Improved water pressure

Scope of Work

- Add storm sewers to areas that had none (30,000 linear feet)
- Add new or replacement catch basins (288 linear feet)
- Replace sanitary sewers (25,000 linear feet)
- Replace water mains (40,000 linear feet)
- Repave roadways (85,000 square yards)
- Replace sidewalks (246,000 square feet)
- Replace curbs (54,000 linear feet)
- Micro tunneling (585 linear feet)
- Fire hydrants
- Traffic lights
- Street lights

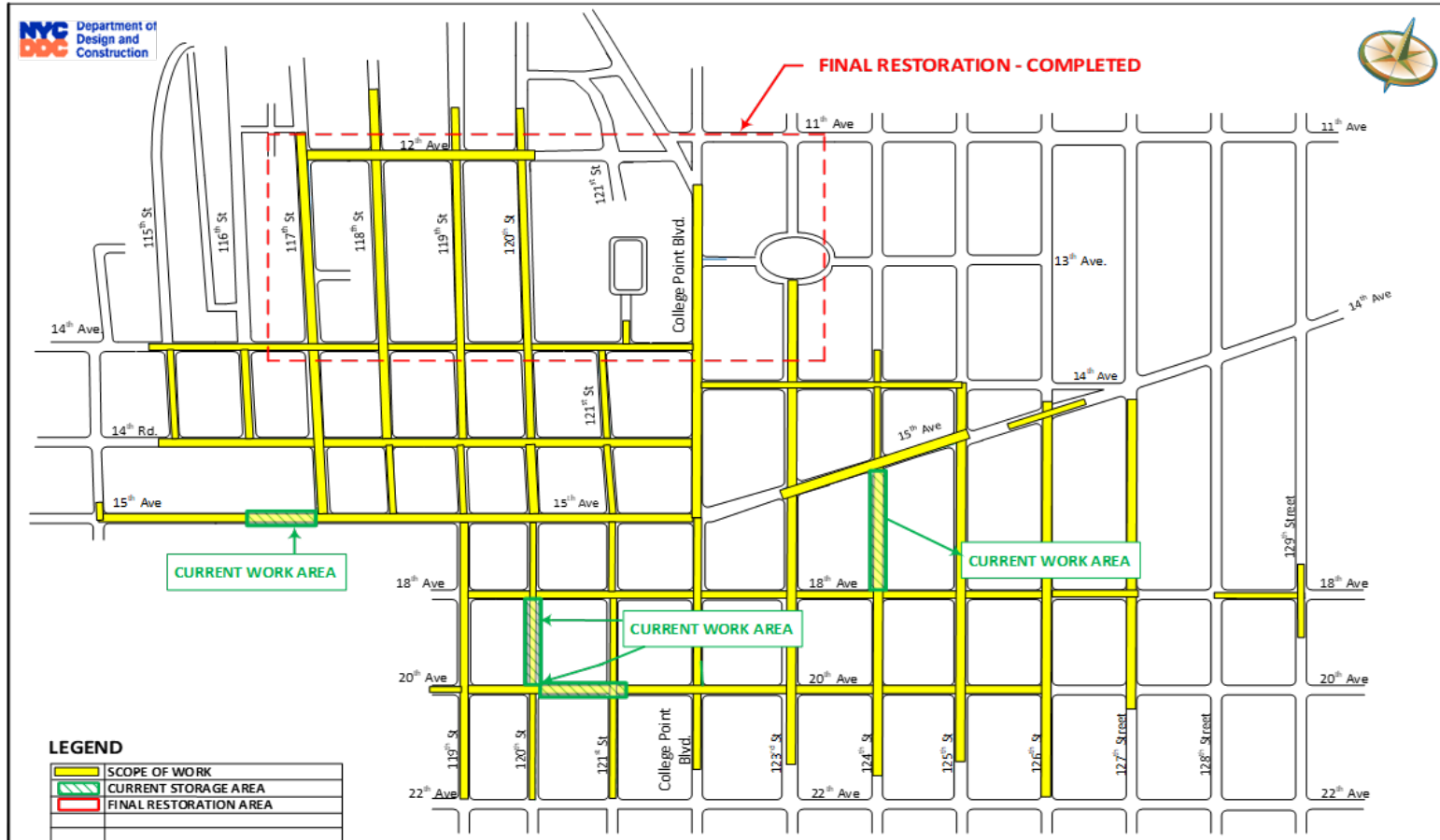
Plan to Expedite Work

- Accelerated schedule
- Five crews instead of three
- Extended hours (can work later during spring and summer)
- Weekend work
- Night work (only College Point Boulevard)

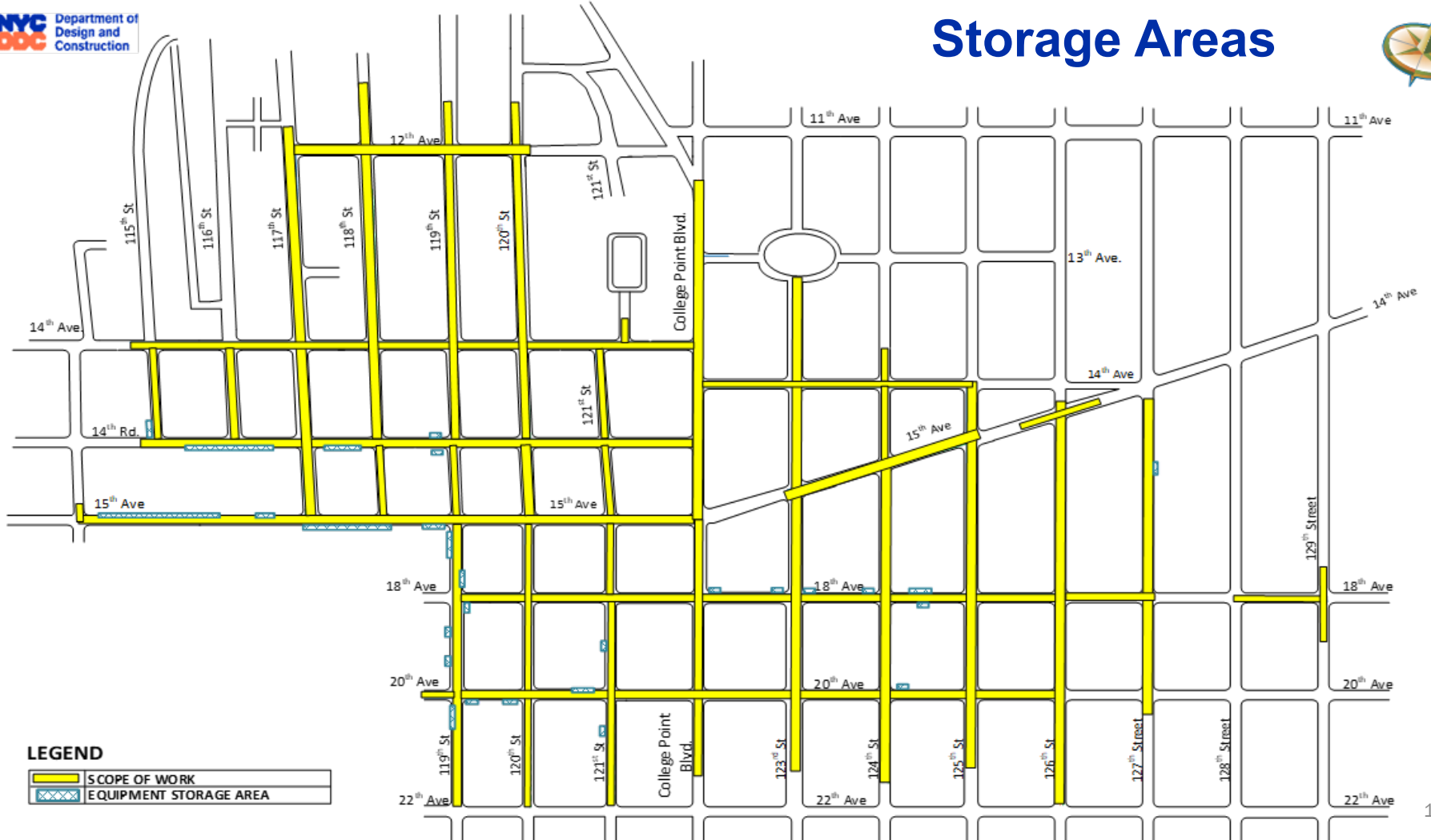

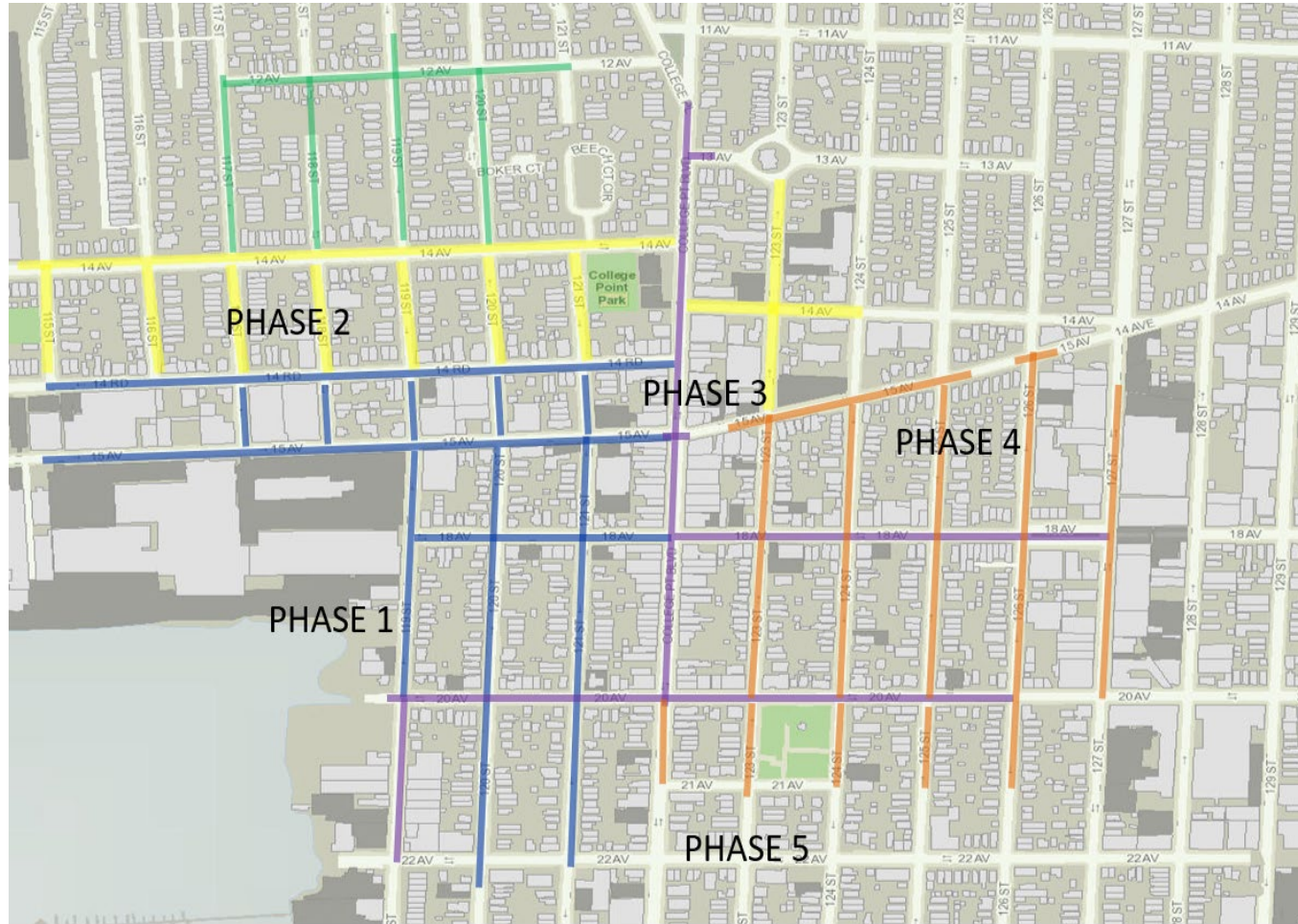

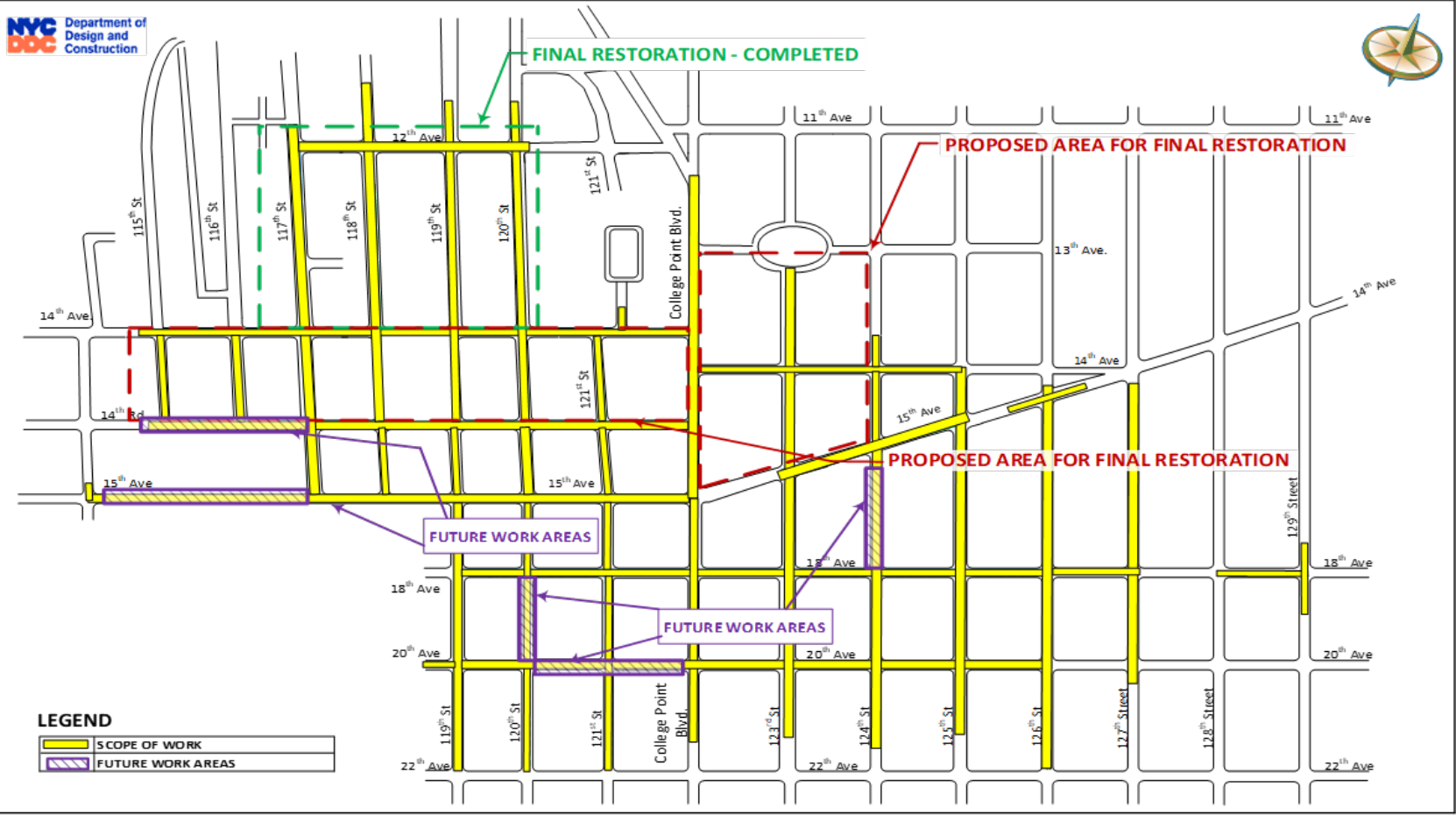

Installation of Storm & Sanitary Sewers in 119th Road

119th Road

The New York City Department of Design and Construction (NYCDDC) is managing a capital construction of sanitary & storm sewer project along 119th Road in Queens the cost of this project is \$8,888,124 dollars. The project began March 2017 and anticipated to end December 2018. After the completion of the project the NYC infrastructure will upgrade for generations to come, therefore, the capacity of the combine sewer will increase and reduce flooding, and the replacement of water mains will improve the drinking water as well as increasing fire protection by adding hydrants. Project work also includes: curbs, sidewalks and roadway resurfacing, as needed. Each phase of this project is an important component that will insure better services and quality of life for the community.

Work Completed to date

- Water main installation 100% (5170 linear feet)
- Sanitary Sewers 100%

Proposed Work Schedule

October 2018 - December 2018

- Excavation for installation of storm sewers
- Excavation for installation of sanitary sewers
- Restoration of roadway surface, curbs & sidewalks in various locations.

Community Impact

During construction hours, you can expect the following:
• Traffic levels of trucks and heavy equipment.
• Occasional travel lane closures will be required, as well as detours. Warning signs will be posted in advance.
• Parking and driveway/loading dock restrictions. Signs will be posted within the affected areas.
• Emergency vehicle access and pedestrian access to sidewalk and buildings will be maintained at all times.

WATER SERVICE INTERRUPTION Installation of Fire Hydrants

8:00am for approximately 8 hours

WHY IS MY WATER BEING TURNED OFF? A water shut-off is necessary to facilitate the installation of new fire hydrant in conjunction with the 119th Rd project. It will occur at/or about 8:00 am and last for approximately 8 hours. On occasion, this work may be completed earlier and water service restored.

SOME THINGS TO REMEMBER:

The DDC recommends that you shut off the water main valve in your house/building in order to avoid problems that may occur when sediment enters or is released from your plumbing.

You are asked to shut off all WATER cooled appliances, which may include air conditioners, etc.

Once water service is returned, turn the main house valve back on and flush the system by running your faucets to sinks and tubs for about 15 to 30 minutes.
