

How to use the Coordination Atlas

Three agencies, hundreds of projects, one map. It lights up the places where DEP, DOT, and Parks are about to dig in the same spot, so the City can dig once instead of three times. No login, nothing to install. Open it and start clicking around.

1. Pick how you want to look

The first screen offers two doors. **Start the guided story** walks you through the highlights in a few minutes and is the best place to begin. **Explore the map freely** drops you straight onto the full map to wander on your own. You can switch between them any time.

2. The guided story, in order

It opens with the big picture, then visits the five strongest sites one at a time (the camera flies in and the rest of the city dims so you can focus), then lands on a short list of what to do. At the very end there is a **Play all 21** button if you want to see every site. Move with the   buttons or the   arrow keys, pause or play with , and press  to step out to the map.

3. Exploring on your own

On the open map, the panel on the right lets you turn each agency on and off. Flip **Only coordination projects** to hide everything except the overlaps and cut straight to the point. Hover over any dot (or tap it on a phone) to see that project's name, agency, fiscal year, and rough budget.

4. Reading the colors

Each agency has its own color, and the soft pink glow marks a coordination zone.

★ One handy trick

In the guided story's opening view, every glowing bubble is clickable. **Tap any one** to jump straight to that site, even the ones that are not in the featured five.

That's it. Poke around freely. The map is hard to break, and a refresh always brings you back to the start. It reflects the FY2020–2026 capital plan and can be updated whenever new project data is released. Questions or update requests can go to the Town+Gown research team.
