New Solutions for Super Speeders



New York City ISA Pilot

- NYC has installed ISA on more than 700 city fleet vehicles, including 158 that were identified as frequent speeders from telematics.
- ISA is on all every make, model and type including school buses!
- ISA eliminates 99.74% of all speeding, even for habitual speeders (a 64% reduction from before they were installed)
- NYC will now require ISA on all civilian fleet vehicles (about 7,500 city vehicles)



Safety and Risk Reductions Across the Board

- Improvements in speeding behavior
 - E.g., reduction in speed camera tickets dropped from 6-8 per week to 1 in nine weeks
- Improvements in other safety-critical behavior
 - Reduced hard braking
 - Reduced red light infractions
 - Reduced preventable collisions
 - (30% reduction shown in one fleet)
 - Increased following distance
- Decreases in Fuel Costs (CSA) scores
 - E.g., some have shown more than 10% savings
- Improvements seen in carrier Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) scores
 - E.g., one fleet reduced CSA from 65 to 20



Super Speeders Bill

- Who is affected?
 - **Owners** with **16** or more speed camera violations in 12 months
 - 16 = Twice as likely to be in KSI crash
 - 18,668 vehicles = 0.8% of vehicles
 - **Drivers** with **11** or more points on a license in 18 months for speeding related offenses
- What vehicles are affected?
 - **ALL** vehicles that the owner or driver **OWNS** or **OPERATES**

Super Speeders Bill

- How long does it last?
 - **First offense** = 12 month ISA
 - **Second offense** in 10 years = 24 month ISA
 - **Third offense** in 15 years = 36 month ISA
 - **Fourth offense** = cannot remove device until approved by DMV
- What speed does it limit to?
 - Five miles over the speed limit
 - Allows for brief override



What are the Consequences for Violating?

- Three New Misdemeanor Offenses:
 - Tampering/circumvention of ISA device
 - Driver operating any vehicle without ISA while being ordered not to
 - Owner operating or allowing someone to operate a vehicle that is required to have one

- In 2024, 18,668 (0.8%) vehicles got more than 15 speed camera violations
- 125 vehicles got more than 100 speed camera violations
- Two vehicles got more than 500
