## **Inter-Agency "Ghost Busters" Operations**

#### NYPI

- Interagency Task Force consisting of NYPD, State Police (NYSP), Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), Tunnel & Bridges
  Authority (TBTA), Sheriff's Office, Port Authority Police Department (PAPD), Taxi & Limousine Commission (TLC), US Park
  Police, Business Integrity Commission (BIC)
  - TBTA, Sheriff and PAPD focus on toll evaders with excessive outstanding tolls and scofflaw violators
  - Unregistered/uninsured vehicles as well unlicensed operators are the focus of NYPD, NYSP, DMV, TLC, BIC
    - Focus on lost/missing, stolen, previously surrendered, altered, covered, mismatched and no license plates
- 8 hour enforcement operation conducted at identified locations
- Includes license plate readers to assist in identifying violators
- Public messaging to alert public of the creation of the taskforce and its focus
  - Use social media, mainstream media and variable message signs as well











### **NYPD Corridor Enforcement**

- Corridors selected in coordination with NYCDOT based on 3 years of data, 2021 to 2023, based on highest number of killed or seriously injured collisions
  - 9 corridors in 30 total precincts
- Precincts directed to maintain a consistence presence along these corridors <u>between the hours of 8AM</u>
   and 8PM, 7 days per week for the entirety of 2024.
- Precinct's Traffic Safety Officers have been directed to conduct a minimum of 50% of their overall enforcement on their assigned corridor.
- Focused enforcement, but not limited to <u>failure to yield</u>, <u>speeding</u>, <u>cell phones / texting</u>, <u>red lights</u>, <u>disobey</u>
   <u>signs</u>, <u>seat belts and unregistered vehicles</u> (including 2-wheel transportation modes)
