GUIDELINES FOR APPLICATION FOR TEMPORARY SEWER CONNECTION FOR CONSTRUCTION TRAILERS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

1. A Professional Engineer/Registered Architect submits a sketch (stamped and signed) to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Division of Permitting and Connections, 59-17 Junction Blvd, 3rd Floor, Low Rise, Corona, New York, N.Y. 11368.

The following is to be included in the submission: Copy of the Contract/Award letter issued by the Agency who uses the trailer, estimate of quantity of discharge; duration of project; location size and type of connections, invert elevations at the nearest manholes and at the point of connection; distances from the nearest manhole; etc.

- 2. A Licensed Plumber then submits an application for a Sewer Connection Permit to the appropriate Local office of the Bureau of Water and Sewer Operations.
- 3. A Department of Transportation (DOT) Street Opening Permit has to be obtained subsequent to the approval of the permit.
- 4. A DEP Sewer Connection Permit is issued at the appropriate Bureau of Customer Services (BCS) Borough office. The charge for a Sewer Connection Permit, as established by the New York City Water Board, should be paid to BCS.
- 5. An appointment for a field inspection should be scheduled by the Licensed Plumber at least 24 hours in advance by calling the House Connection Unit.
- 6. At the conclusion of the Construction period, a Licensed Plumber must obtain a DEP Plug Permit to terminate the sewer Connection. All work performed in conjunction with a Plug Permit must be inspected by a DEP Inspector as per the Department of Environmental Protection's Rules and Regulations. A permit fee for the plug, as established by the New York City Water Board, is to be paid to BCS.
- 7. The construction trailer has to be located in the street area outside the owner's property (meaning, sidewalk or roadway).
