

Water Conservation and Reuse Grant Pilot Program



Funding Available for New Water Efficiency Projects

The New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is offering funding for water efficiency projects through the Water Conservation and Reuse Grant Pilot Program. The Program reimburses water efficiency projects totaling greater than \$50,000 on a single private property that include conventional fixture retrofits and/or innovative water saving technologies, such as on-site water reuse. Currently, approximately \$1 million is available; however additional funding may be made available if sufficient demand is demonstrated.

Program Eligibility

You may be eligible to participate in the Program if the following criteria are met:

- ✓ You are an institutional, multi-family residential, or commercial customer who receives a water bill directly from DEP for your own water use, and not for resale.
- ✓ Your water and sewer account is in good standing.
- ✓ Your water meter is connected to a functioning Automated Meter Reading (AMR) device.
- ✓ Your water efficiency project will conserve at least one million gallons of water per year, or about 2,740 gallons per day, and costs greater than \$50,000 on individual properties.

Reimbursement Eligibility

The following costs are eligible for reimbursement under the Program:

- ✓ Third-party costs for a Facility Water Use Survey
- ✓ Third-party costs for Design Services
- ✓ Equipment costs (includes materials and supplies)

Labor costs are NOT eligible for reimbursement under the Program.

Eligible Costs	Conditions	Reimbursement Amount
Equipment Costs	WaterSense® certified fixture replacements	Fixed maximum unit price; see Grant Guide
	Custom Water Efficiency Retrofits	\$10 per gallon per day (gpd) water savings achieved, up to 100% of documented equipment costs.
Facility Water Use Survey & Design Services	Includes third-party costs for facility water use survey and any associated design services required in development of the application.	Up to 20% of total equipment costs

Note: Multiple properties with the same property owner may be grouped under a single grant application, so long as each project costs greater than \$50,000 per property.
