When there are heavy rains and the sewer system has reached its capacity, a diluted mixture of rain water and sewage, also known as combined sewage, may overflow into local waterways as a combined sewer overflow (CSO). The New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is developing a CSO Long Term Control Plan (LTCP) that will identify and evaluate alternatives to reduce the impact of CSOs in NYC's waterbodies and waterways. At this meeting, you will learn about DEP's proposed draft CSO control alternatives, the related water quality benefits and estimated costs.
