Required Submission Materials for Permit Initiation

Instructions:

- Ensure the Qualified Inspector and Contractor are registered appropriately in SWPTS prior to filing a Permit Initiation.
- Prepare submission requirements as applicable based on project scope.
- The Owner or Developer **<u>must</u>** be the entity filing a Permit Initiation via SWPTS.
- The Contractor **must** acknowledge the Permit Initiation in SWPTS to start DEP review.

The following list of submission requirements must be reviewed prior to filing a Permit Initiation:

SPDES General Permit Identification (ID) Number & copy of NYSDEC Notice of Intent (NOI) Acknowledgement Letter	Dependent on project scope	Refer to <u>NYS DEC Stormwater Permit for</u> <u>Construction Activity</u> for guidance on the General Permit and NOI Submission. Refer to the SPDES Construction General Permit for project eligibility. SPDES ID Number is typically found in the body of the NOI Acknowledgement Letter issued by NYSDEC and should begin with "NYR". If the project does not require General Permit coverage, the SWPTS input for SPDES General Permit Identification Number can be "N/A".
NYC DEP Site Connection Proposal Certification	Dependent on project scope	Refer to <u>NYC DEP Sewer Certification and</u> <u>Connection Permits</u> for guidance on applicability, permitting process, and submission forms.
