NYC Stormwater Management Program: Industrial and Commercial Stormwater Sources

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) requires certain industrial facilities to obtain coverage for stormwater discharges under the State Pollution Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) Multi-Sector General Permit for Stormwater Discharge from Industrial Activities (GP-0-17-004) (MSGP). While NYSDEC will continue to administer the MSGP program, DEP is implementing an Industrial and Commercial (I/C) Program in the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) area to assess unpermitted facilities for contributions of pollutants of concern to impaired waters and inspect both publicly and privately owned facilities with MSGP coverage.

What will this mean for your facility?

If your facility currently has an MSGP permit and is located in the MS4 area, then DEP will conduct ongoing inspections at your site. At a minimum, DEP will inspect high priority facilities every year; medium priority facilities every three years; and low priority facilities every five years.

For active permitted facilities, you shall continue to send submittals to NYSDEC,

though you must begin to send copies to DEP. Starting June 1, 2019, you should submit your copies to DEP online using our MSGP File Uploader at nyc.gov/dep/msgp-uploader.

If your facility does not have an MSGP permit, then you may have received a notification that DEP may soon conduct a one-time, on-site assessment to determine if your facility conducts activities as specified in the MSGP and generates significant contributions of pollutants of concern to impaired waters. DEP will update the inventory periodically.
