




























### **Previous Work**

For Freedoms

**For Freedoms** is an artist-led organization that centers art as a catalyst for creative civic engagement, discourse, and direct action. Founded in 2016 by a coalition of artists including Hank Willis Thomas, Eric Gottesman, Michelle Woo, and Wyatt Gallery, For Freedoms is dedicated to fostering an environment of listening, healing, and justice through a wide range of creative activations. For Freedoms works closely with a variety of artists, organizations, institutions, and brands to expand what participation in a democracy looks like and reshape conversations about politics.

Since founding, For Freedoms has collaborated with over 1,000 artists on over 750 activations including public art installations, billboard campaigns, exhibitions, town halls, and events across all 50 states.





















On this project, For Freedoms is being represented by Eric Gottesman and Claudia Peña.

# STORIES Shape REALITY

An oral history archive and public art series to deepen understanding and healing through the voices, memories, and perspectives of people and communities.

### **Oral History Archive**

Jails are full of STORIES we need to hear.

For Freedoms proposes to build an ORAL HISTORY ARCHIVE of 50 stories by people impacted by the Brooklyn Facility Borough Based Jail.

### **Oral History Archive**

Everyone should hear these stories, so the archive will be available ONLINE as well as physically IN-PERSON at the jail.

ARTWORKS that interpret the archive will be installed INSIDE and OUTSIDE the jail.

### Why oral history?

A field of study for understanding and healing, oral history is a method of gathering, preserving, and interpreting the voices, memories, and perspectives of people and communities. Historically, many indigenous peoples had a tradition of passing on information orally from one generation to the next. An oral history interview is generally a one-on-one conversation in which the interviewer records the exchange in audio or video format. Recordings of the interview are transcribed, summarized, indexed, and archived.

## Who are we planning to interview?

As part of the public art commission at BBJ Brooklyn Facility, we plan to collect 50 oral histories from:

- 25 persons in custody
- 10 facility staff
- 10 family members of persons in custody
- 5 BBJ Brooklyn Facility neighbors and community members

# **Oral History Plan**

With the assistance of the NYC Department of Correction, For Freedoms will conduct at least five interviews with persons currently in custody.

Once these initial interviews are conducted, For Freedoms will create an artist brief and begin further conceptualizing visual interpretations of the oral histories.

For Freedoms will continue collecting the remaining oral histories over the course of the next 6 months.

For Freedoms will collaborate with confirmed artists to create artworks for each designated artwork location following the Preliminary Design Review requirements.


#### **Creative Process**







Embedded Poem by Bryonn Bain






Lobby Artwork by Jared Owens




**Jared Owens** is a self-taught, multidisciplinary artist who works in painting, sculpture, and installation, using materials and references culled from penal matter.







**Jamel Shabazz** is a photographer known for his work in documenting urban life in New York City. He served as a NYC corrections officer from 1983-2003.








2 INTERIOR ELEVATION - VISITING CONTACT - SOUTH




Marcus Manganni is a New York based sculptor and installation artist whose work confronts mass incarceration.

Light became both the primary medium and subject of Manganni's work during his time in federal solitary confinement. Utilizing the natural light from his cell window, he experimented with what little materials he had and created reflective structures placed throughout his cell allowing him to explore and liberate his physical and social confinement. Manganni has installed permanent sculptures in both public and private spaces worldwide.








