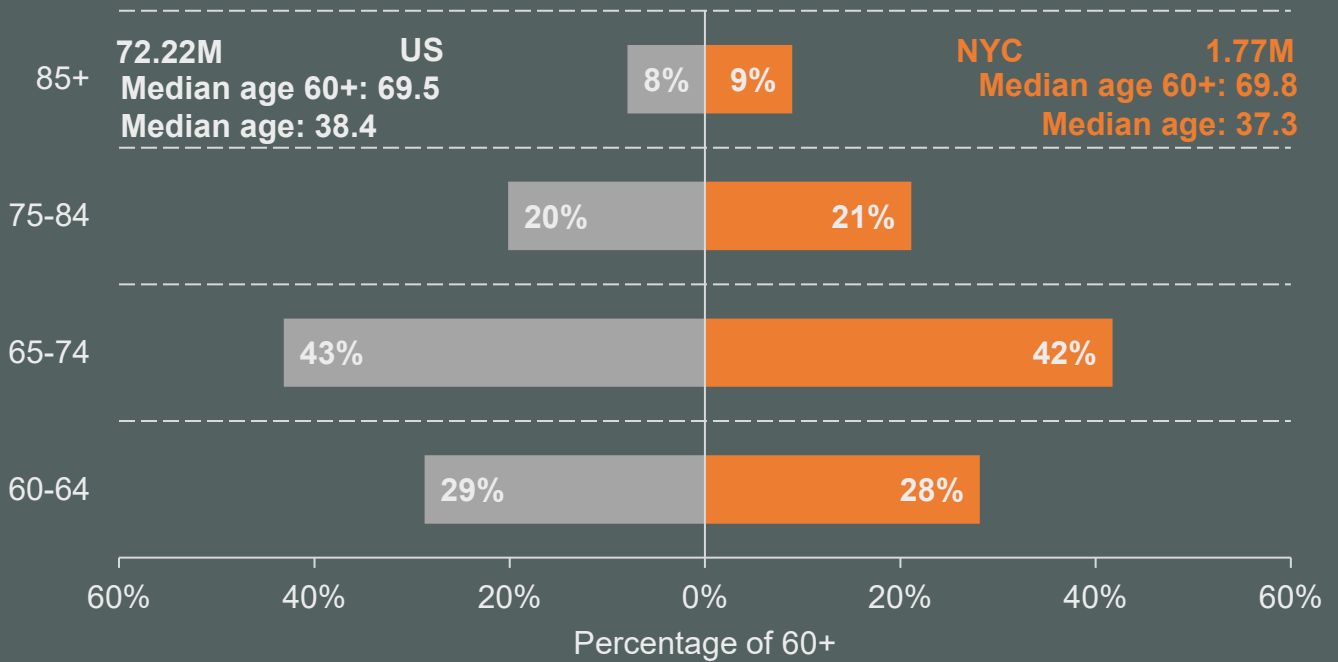

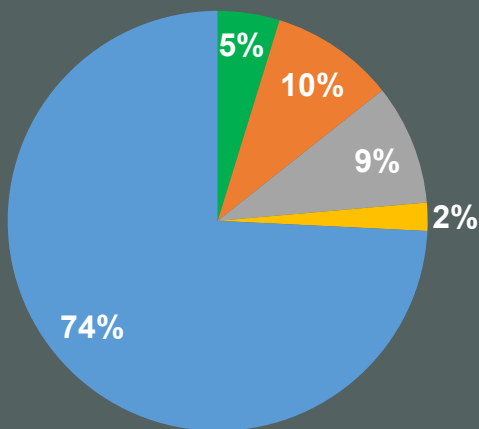

Similar age breakdown among older adults in the US and NYC

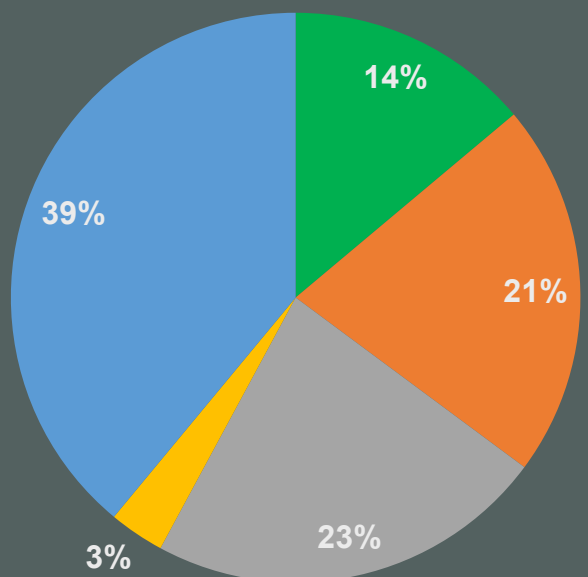


NYC's older adults are more diverse than the national average

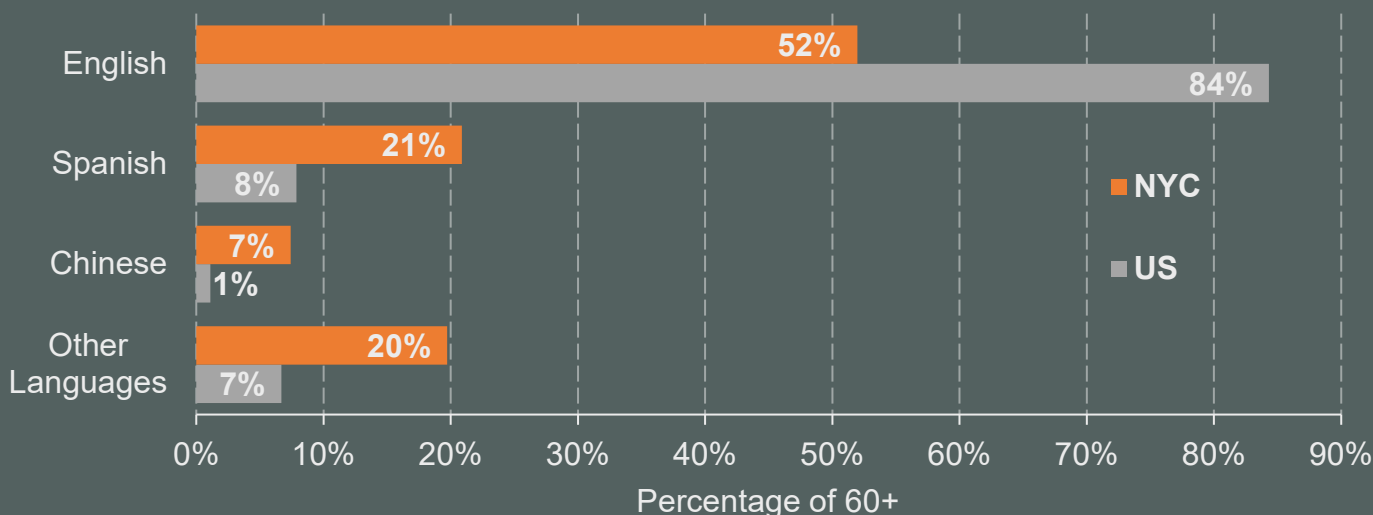

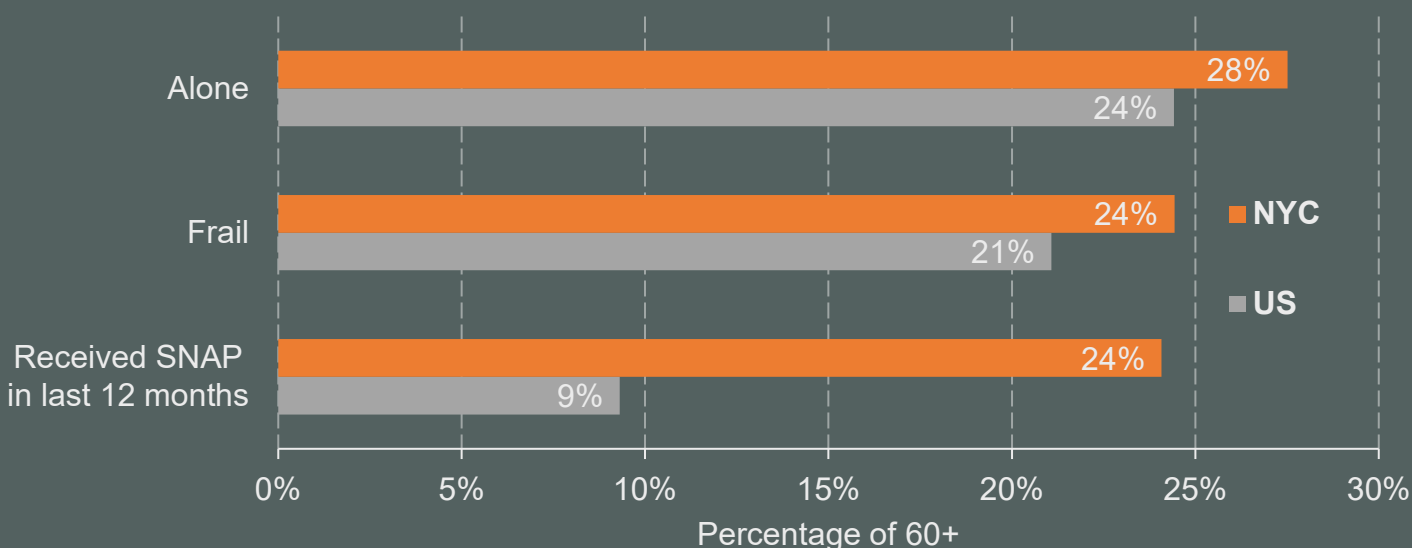

Almost 50% of older New Yorkers speak languages other than English at home, and 30% are limited English speakers

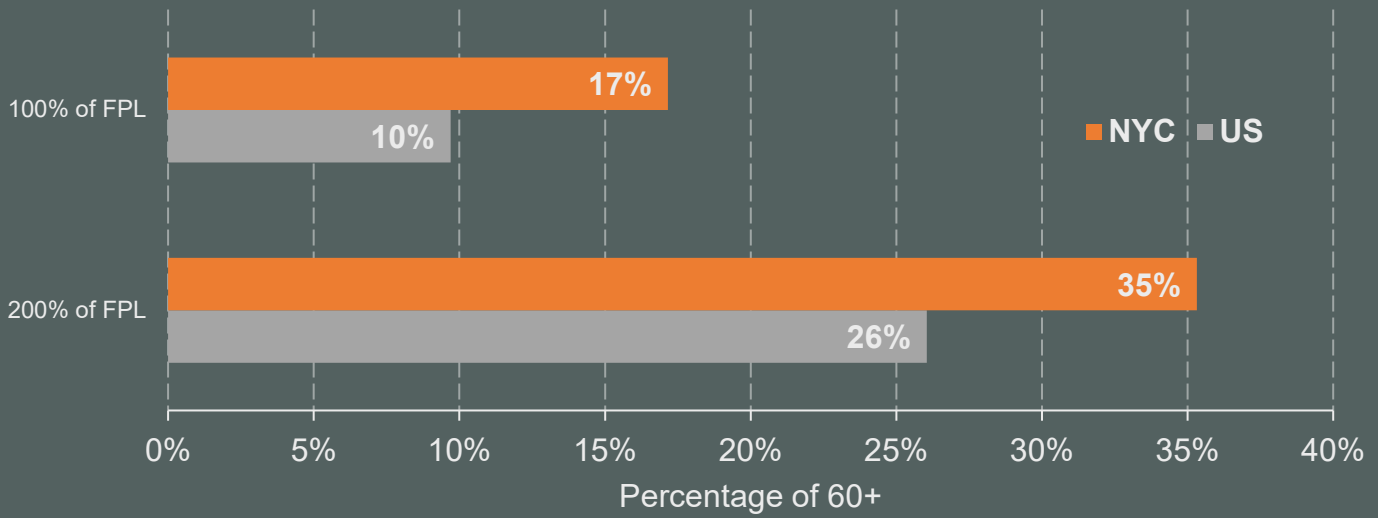
Primary Language Spoken at Home



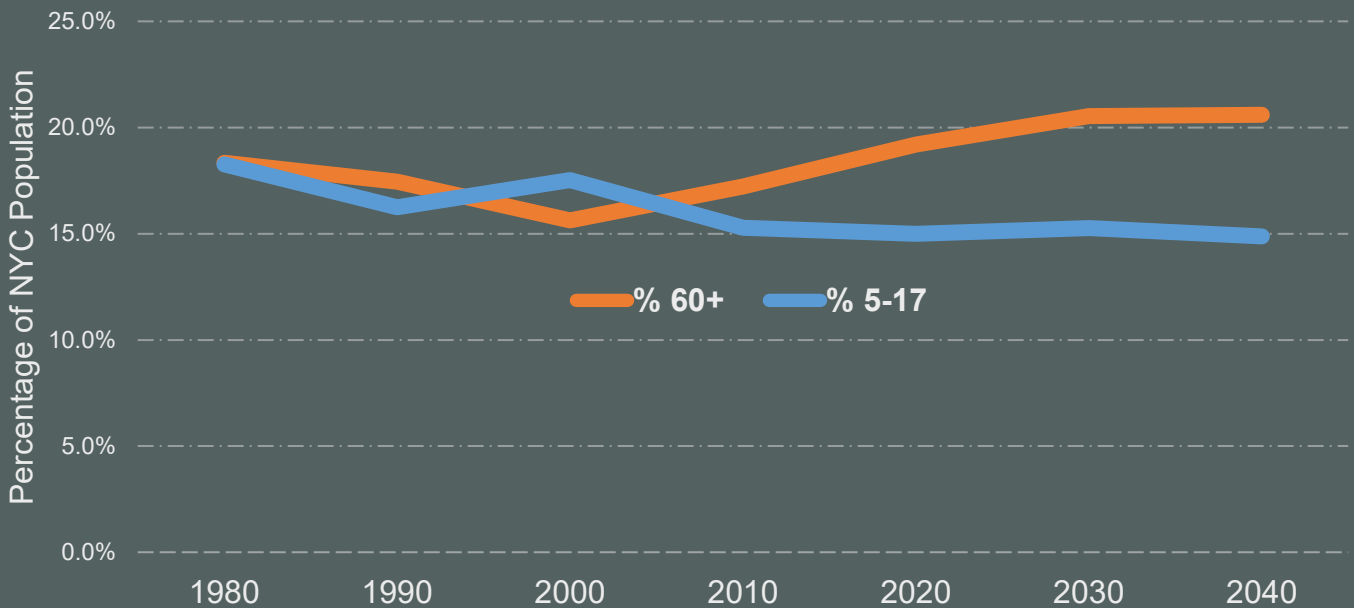
NYC older adults are also more likely to live alone, with frailty, and receive SNAP benefits than US older adults.
