This, as pertains to relevant protocols surrounding disability etiquette, the language used to describe, relate information about, and or address disabled individuals, in addition to in instances where service actions are being performed. Never be afraid to ask!
- Discussed Language: unintended bias/subliminal thoughts represented in language; person-first language; strategies for modeling language and respecting the language that others wish to use to describe themselves.

- Scenarios for discussion and brainstorming how RAs could be considered in these situations; reminder of interactive process of the RA process (don't make assumptions regarding what the person wants)
- Left off on RAs for People with Mobility Disabilities .
