I strongly believe it's imperative that the current City Council redistricting rights the wrongs of the last redistricting and establishes a fair and equal balance in population between districts, to ensure that all New Yorkers have equal voting power and equal representation. The last redistricting left some districts like the 1st and 3rd with 10% more residents than other districts in the city and 5% more than the citywide average, leaving residents of these districts with diminished voting power and significantly underrepresented in the City Council over the last 10 years. That inequality has only grown as populations in some districts like the 3rd have soared, so that district now has over 30% more residents than other districts and 17% more than the citywide average, leaving its residents even more underrepresented and with proportionately less voting power.

The currently proposed new City Council district lines largely correct this glaring inequality, creating new districts with roughly equal populations except those on Staten Island, which would continue to have almost 4.5% fewer residents than the citywide average, and thus have disproportionately more representation and their residents disproportionately more voting power.

As the Redistricting Commission considers further changes to the proposed map, it's imperative that they not decrease the relative balance between district populations, and if anything that balance should be increased, and the current proposed inequalities (while significantly less than 10 years ago) should be further reduced or eliminated. 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Dear Commissioner Walcott,

I write to ask that the district lines proposed for Queens Council District 26 and Manhattan Council District 5 which include portions of Sutton Place, the Upper East Side and all of Roosevelt Island *not be adopted* for the following reasons.

First, the draft proposal violates four of the criteria set forth in City Charter Section 52 (1) (c) (d) and (e) and Section 52 (2). The violation of those criteria results in districts where:

neighborhoods and communities of interest are not kept intact,

the proposed district is not compact,

the proposed district results in an extreme crossover district, and • the proposed district is very . oddly shaped.

Second, the proposed districts will create significant practical difficulties for the affected neighborhoods. Notably, will a Queens Council Member have a district office in Manhattan to serve the needs of the extraordinarily high percentage of seniors in Manhattan Community Districts 6 & 8? Will a Queens Council Member send representation to two additional Manhattan Community Boards? Will a Queens Council Member hold full membership on two Borough Boards? What is the likelihood that the Manhattan portion of the proposed district will ever prevail in a matter of Participatory Budgeting? Manhattan and Queens residents may hold vastly different positions on important matters of public policy including, but not limited to, congestion pricing. Which position will a Queens Council Member adopt?

A defining element of the East Side's neighborhood character is the presence of numerous medical and research facilities with sprawling, densely populated campuses. Among those institutions directly impacted by the proposed new lines are: Hospital for Special Surgery, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, New York Presbyterian/Weill Cornell, Animal Medical Center, Rockefeller University and Cornell Tech. Manhattan elected officials have years of experience and expertise in addressing the compatibility of these

institutions with surrounding residential areas. How effective will a Queens Council Member be in this regard?

Third and finally, this oddly-shaped, extreme crossover district will significantly and adversely impact the provision of municipal services and diminish the political voices of thousands of Manhattan's residents.

In the strongest terms possible, I urge the Commission to return to the drawing board and not adopt the proposed districts referenced above. My fellow residents and I stand ready to meet with Commission staff to address these matters and to propose alternatives. I thank you in advance for your consideration.

I am Alexander Gdalevich, resident of Beach Haven.

According to the City Charter, Council district lines should keep neighborhoods and communities intact. They also should keep districts compact.

Currently, the lines of the 47th District do not meet any of these criterias. The new proposed preliminary map of the 47th District included Bay Ridge - far away from Coney Island, Sea Gate and Warbasse. Bay Ridge and Coney Island are connected in a weird way by some kind of long and thin "tunnel" of two blocks. I strongly disagree with these new proposed lines.

Current Council District 47 includes Warbasse Houses, but does not include neighboring high risers Trump Village, Luna Park and Brightwater Towers. It also does not include any parts of Brighton Beach (from Ocean Parkway to Coney Island Avenue) that would be natural part of the District given the similar demographics, local issues, close proximity and their traditional inclusion into districts of Community Board #13, the 60th Police Precinct, the 46th Assembly District, the 23rd State Senate District and the 8th Congressional District. Current lines of the 47th District include all Boardwalk and beaches of both Brighton Beach and Coney Island, but do not include any parts of Brighton Beach!

I urge the Commission to include in the 47th District the territory between Belt Parkway and Boardwalk, from West 12 Street to Coney Island Avenue. This way new lines will naturally unite similar neighborhoods and communities of interests that historically were represented by the same local civic institutions, community groups and elected officials. **Please, do not split the Russian speaking community in the 47th District and keep it intact! The 47th Council District should**

As the Executive Director of Good Old Lower East Side (GOLES), one of New York City's oldest, most respected, and leading housing organizations, I oversee an entity committed to providing tenant organizing and support, direct benefits assistance, resiliency outreach, and policy advocacy on the local and state levels. Moreover, established in 1977 to serve the Lower East Side, a neighborhood with a sizable Latino community, GOLES is supportive of maintaining and enhancing opportunities and leadership within government structures to lend this additional perspective to engagement and policy-making. Council District 2 has historically been key in representing the Lower Manhattan Latino perspective in the New York City Council, particularly as it relates to the New York City Housing Authority complexes contained within and the hundreds of Section 8, HDFC, and Mitchell Lama hosted here. Losing this perspective would harm representation of long-marginalized communities in this area, and Council District 2 has been the only consistent vehicle for such perspective for decades.

In the last proposed map, areas south of Delancey Street were removed from the 2003 Council District 2 map. This would reduce the percentage of both Latino and Black residents in the district, such as those at NYCHA Vladeck Houses. Further, any exclusion of election districts in Kips Bay that currently host communities of color, namely at the various Phipps Houses complexes, Kips Bay Court, East Midtown Plaza, 344 East 28th Street, and NYCHA's Straus Houses, would further dilute the voice of BIPOC residents into other districts.

Please ensure that you are keeping these linked communities intact, preserving - and enhancing - BIPOC representation through District 2 on the City Council by ensuring you retain communities of interest currently located in its northern and southern ends, and adding more where necessary for population adjustment.

The proposed September Redistricting Commission maps split Greenwich Village at Sixth Avenue and increase the inequality in representation of Lower Manhattan residents and neighborhoods by increasing the population of their districts, compared to the July maps. This is disturbing and must be changed as the maps are redrawn and finalized.

The principle of one person, one vote demands that there be as little deviation as possible between the populations of City Council districts; otherwise some residents have more voting power and others have less. Though the proposed September maps partially corrected this problem for Staten Island, they unnecessarily worsened it for Lower Manhattan residents, who for the last 10 years have had vastly overpopulated districts--and therefore, reduced representation and voting power compared to other New Yorkers. That inequality must end, and the changes proposed in the September maps were a step backward for the Lower Manhattan districts compared to the July maps.

I strongly believe it's imperative that the current City Council redistricting rights the wrongs of the last redistricting and establishes a fair and equal balance in population between districts, to ensure that all New Yorkers have equal voting power and equal representation. The last redistricting left some districts like the 1st and 3rd with 10% more residents than other districts in the city and 5% more than the citywide average, leaving residents of these districts with diminished voting power and significantly underrepresented in the City Council over the last 10 years. That inequality has only grown as populations in some districts like the 3rd have soared, so that district now has over 30% more residents than other districts and 17% more than the citywide average, leaving its residents even more underrepresented and with proportionately less voting power.

The currently proposed new City Council district lines largely correct this glaring inequality, creating new districts with roughly equal populations except those on Staten Island, which would continue to have almost 4.5% fewer residents than the citywide average, and thus have disproportionately more representation and their residents disproportionately more voting power.

As the Redistricting Commission considers further changes to the proposed map, it's imperative that they not decrease the relative balance between district populations, and if anything that balance should be increased, and the current proposed inequalities (while significantly less than 10 years ago) should be further reduced or eliminated. Only this way can we ensure equality of representation and voting power between all New Yorkers, and right the wrongs of the last redistricting, which left some New Yorkers woefully underrepresented.

I understand the importance of community service and giving back. 10 years ago I began attending Community Board meetings and met Hell's Kitchen neighbors who feel as I do. I've met our elected representatives and have tried to assist those that I work with. I have learned that a property is enhanced by what happens outside of our walls. To Whom it may concern,

The proposed district lines do not reflect the cultural links and strong immigrant history along the waterfront. I lived here all of my life, my friends, family and senior center are here. Our community is already struggling for representation with the surge of gentrification, thanks to developers like Jared Kushner. By removing public housing along the water below delancey from District 2, these lines reduce the electoral power of the Latino population.

Public Housing Developments along the water are strongly connected through many struggles to protect from challenges due to the effects of climate change. Campos Plaza, Jacob Riis Houses I & II, Wald Houses, Baruch Houses, and Vladeck Houses all experienced damage and trauma from Hurricane Sandy, ten years later we are still struggling to recover. This experience did not tear us down, we instead fought back as a united front. Moving these developments into more than one district separates this community of interest. Community District 3 Manhattan (CD3) spans the East Village, Lower East Side, and part of Chinatown, bordered by East 14th Street to the north and the Brooklyn Bridge to the south, and 58 percent of its population identify as low-income residents and residents of color.

The proposed district lines do not reflect the cultural links and strong immigrant history along the waterfront. I lived 56 years in Vladeck Houses with my husband, raised my children and helped my neighbors here. Our community is already struggling for representation with the surge of gentrification, thanks to developers like Jared Kushner. By removing public housing along the water below delancey from District 2, these lines reduce the electoral power of the Latino population.

Public Housing Developments along the water are strongly connected through many struggles to protect from challenges due to the effects of climate change. Campos Plaza, Jacob Riis Houses I & II, Wald Houses, Baruch Houses, and Vladeck Houses all experienced damage and trauma from Hurricane Sandy, ten years later we are still struggling to recover. This experience did not tear us down, we instead fought back as a united front. Moving these developments into more than one district separates this community of interest. Community District 3 Manhattan (CD3) spans the East Village, Lower East Side, and part of Chinatown, bordered by East 14th Street to the north and the Brooklyn Bridge to the south, and 58 percent of its population identify as low-income residents and residents of color.
