Pursuant to New York City Administrative Code $\S9-151$, the Department is required to report on information related to adolescents and young adults located in a Department of Education facility controlled by the Department of Correction that offers educational programming to incarcerated individuals. The reporting period pertains to the 2019-20 City school year (9/5/2019-6/26/2020).

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, all in-person educational programming was suspended on March 13th, 2020. To ensure continued educational programming while maintaining the safety of individuals in custody for the remainder of the school year, the Department provided individualized learning packets on a variety of topics. The below data represents incidents occurring during in-person educational programming from September 5th, 2019 to March 13th, 2020.

- 1. The number of departmental infractions issued to adolescents at a department of education site, and the number of departmental infractions issued to young adults at a department of education school site, in total and disaggregated by the type of infraction, as defined by the department:
 - a. There were a total of 62 infractions given to young adults at a Department of Education site during the 2019-20 school year. A breakdown of the type of infractions are attached.
- 2. The number of students prevented from attending educational programming by the Department of Correction because of a behavioral issue or an assault:
 - a. Due to behavioral concern of their part in an assault on a staff member or another person in custody, 48 individuals were unable to attend educational programming in the reporting period.
- 3. The number of assaults on staff at a department of education site, in total and disaggregated by whether such assault was committed by an adolescent or young adult:
 - a. There were no reported assaults on staff committed by adolescents on DOE school sites during the 2019-20 school year.
 - b. There were 2 instances of assaults on staff committed by young adults on DOE school sites for the 2019-20 school year.
- 4. The number of incidents of use of force A at a department of education site, in total and disaggregated by whether such use of force was used on an adolescent or young adult.

- 5. The number of incidents of use of force B at a department of education site, in total and disaggregated by whether such use of force was used on an adolescent or young adult.

¹ Class A Use of Force is a classification used to describe Use of Force Incidents that require medical treatment beyond the prescription of over-the-counter analgesics or the administration of minor first aid, including those resulting in one or more of the following treatments/injuries: multiple abrasions and/or contusions, chipped or cracked tooth, loss of tooth, laceration, puncture, fracture, loss of consciousness, concussion, suture, internal injuries (e.g., ruptured spleen, perforated eardrum, etc.), or admission to a hospital. Class B Use of Force is a classification used to describe Use of Force Incidents that do not require hospitalization or medical treatment beyond the prescription of over-the-counter analgesics or the administration of minor first aid (e.g., Use of Force Incidents that result in a superficial bruise, scrape, scratch, or minor swelling); or involve the forcible use of mechanical restraints in a confrontational situation that results in minor injury.
