1. These counts reflect the total stays with restrictive housing end date between the start date and end date of reporting period. These counts do not include individuals in restrictive housing that did not have an end date within the reporting period. Each distinct stay in restrictive housing is counted, meaning if one individual was in Punitive Segregation and in Restrictive Housing in separate instances, that individual would count twice in this metric.
2. These counts reflect all individuals in restrictive housing for at least one day between the start date and end date of the reporting period, regardless of when the stay in restrictive housing started or ended. This number will not match the Length of Stay. Each distinct stay in restrictive housing is counted, meaning if one individual was in Punitive Segregation and in Restrictive Housing in separate instances, that individual would count twice in this metric.
3. The individual in GRVC was known to the Department to be an adult at the time of placement. While housed in punitive segregation the individual brought to the attention of staff that he was young adult. DOC took an immediate action to verify his age. After obtaining his birth certificate and verifying age, he was removed from punitive
4. These counts reflect all individuals with a start date in restrictive housing between the start date and end date of the reporting period. These counts will not match the Length of Stay (which reflects inmates that left restrictive housing during the reporting period) or the demographics or infraction charge counts (which reflect all individuals in restrictive housing for at least one day during the reporting period).
5. These counts reflect the highest infraction charge for an individual during the individual's incarceration, regardless of date of occurrence, who were in restrictive housing for at least one day between the start and end date of the reporting period. For example, if a grade 1 infraction was charged prior to the reporting period, this would still be counted. The highest charge for each individual was reported based on their restrictive housing category during the given reporting period. For example, if an individual had a grade 1 infraction and was in both Punitive Segregation and RHU in separate instances, this individual would count twice in this metric (once for grade 1 highest infraction in Punitive Segregation, and once for grade 1 highest infraction in RHU). A small amount of observations due to either a highest infraction grade 3 charge or missing data.
6. Data in this section was provided by NYC H+HC Correctional Health Services (CHS). Questions on health-related data in this section should be directed to CHS.
7. Data is not available for patients housed in either RHU or PACE due to comingling within housing areas (PACE/CAPS and RHU/Non-RHU).
8. Reported by DOC. Placement in CAPS does not require a disciplinary hearing, only that an infraction has been served and that the inmate/patient meets the necessary clinical criteria.
9. CAPS Unit provides unrestricted access to showers and calls; no requests made. ESH provides escorted showers only for individuals in ESH level 1. The counts shown here exclude individuals in ESH level 2 and 3.
* number reflected is showers taken for ESH 1 as all other levels have unrestricted access.
10. These counts reflect the total number of individuals receiving at least one visit during the reporting period by their restrictive housing unit category. For example, if one individual was in Punitive Segregation and in Restrictive Housing in separate instances and received 1 visit while in each housing area category, this would count once for punitive segregation and once for RHU. If a different individual was in ESH and RHU separately, and received 4 visits while in ESH and 1 visit while in RHU, this individual would count once for ESH (because they received at least one visit during the reporting period) and once for RHU (because they received at least one visit during the reporting period).
