

**New York City Department of Correction  
Quarterly Emergency Lock-In Report  
FY24 Quarter 2 (October 1st to December 31st)**

*This report provides information regarding the rate of emergency lock-ins that the New York City Department of Correction (DOC or Department) is required to report pursuant to New York City Administrative Code §9-155. This reporting time frame is from October 01 to December 31, 2023.*
