

**New York City Department of Correction
Quarterly Emergency Lock-In Report
FY25 Q1 (July 1 to September 30)**

This report provides information regarding the rate of emergency lock-ins that the New York City Department of Correction (“DOC” or “the Department”) is required to report pursuant to New York City Administrative Code §9-155. This reporting time frame is from July 1 to September 30, 2024.

In comparison to the previous reporting period, the number of department-wide lock-ins and extension lock-ins remained the same. The number of facility lock-in, housing area lock-in and the number of continuous lock-ins exceeding 24 hours decreased. The number of partial facility lock-ins and the number of mandated services interrupted increased.
