

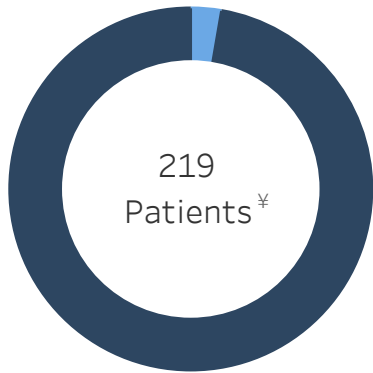

## Site-Specific Performance on Viral Load Suppression<sup>±</sup>

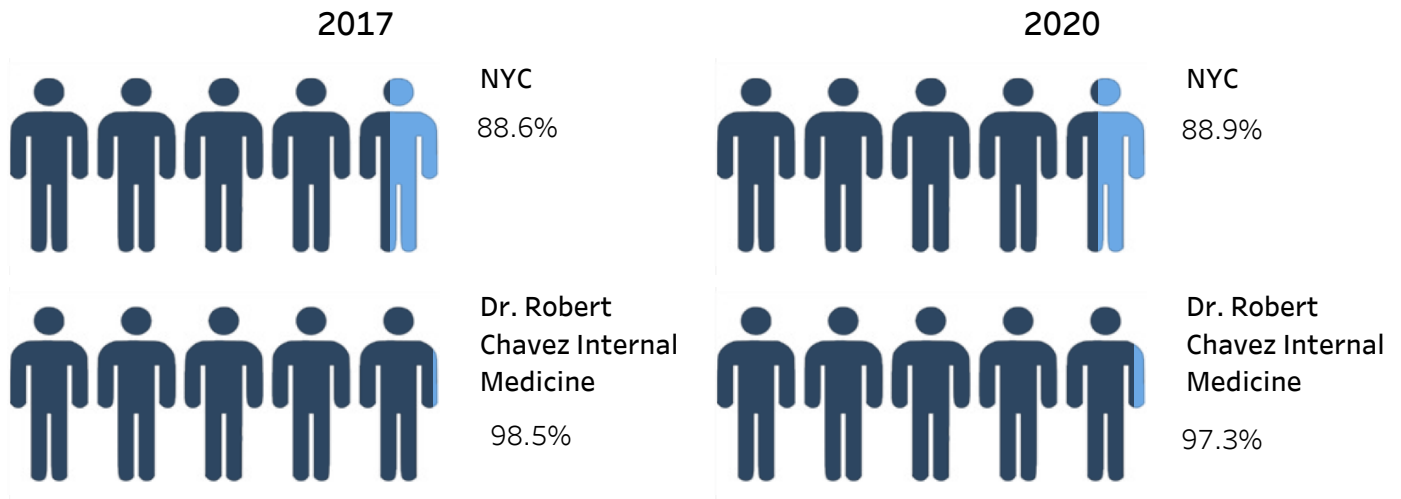
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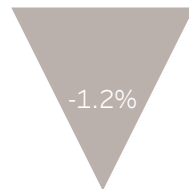


Suppressed : 213 (97.3%)
