

Naloxone for Overdose Prevention

Naloxone is a safe medication that can save someone's life by reversing the effects of an opioid overdose.



Naloxone quick facts:

- Only works on opioids, such as heroin, fentanyl and prescription painkillers, but is safe to use even if opioids are not present
- Available as an easy-to-use nasal spray

Naloxone is available to anyone who wants it.

- Sign up for a free naloxone training with the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.
- Find an Opioid Overdose Prevention Program where naloxone is available for free in your community.
- Find a participating pharmacy where naloxone can be purchased with insurance or out of pocket.
- Learn about hosting a naloxone training in your community.
