

Notice to Melrose and Morrisania Residents About Legionnaires' Disease

September 10, 2026

The NYC Health Department is investigating a cluster of Legionnaires' disease in Melrose and Morrisania neighborhoods of the South Bronx (ZIP codes 10451 and 10456).

Legionnaires' disease is a type of pneumonia. Symptoms are flu-like and include fever, chills, muscle aches, cough, and shortness of breath.

The risk of contracting Legionnaires' disease is low, but if you live or work in or have visited these ZIP codes in September and have symptoms, see a healthcare provider right away. For help finding a provider, regardless of immigration or insurance status, call **311** or 844-NYC-4NYC (844-692-4692). Cooling towers in the community are the likely source of the *Legionella* bacteria causing this cluster of Legionnaires' disease. Cooling towers are typically found on top of buildings. They control the temperature of cooling systems, such as refrigeration. The cooling towers spray mist that can contain the bacteria into the outside air.

Cooling towers in the area are being tested by the Health Department. Buildings with cooling towers that test positive for the presence of *Legionella* bacteria are being ordered to immediately clean and disinfect their cooling towers.

It is safe for residents in the area to drink tap water, bathe, shower, cook, and use their air conditioner at home.
