Every New Yorker deserves to achieve their full health potential.

However, not everyone has fair access to the factors that contribute to good health, such as healthy foods, safe places to live and play, and a wage that allows them to live with dignity.

This is unfair and unjust.



To address this, the **Health Department launched Race to Justice**, the agency's effort to advance racial equity and social justice across all programs, policies and practices. Through Race to Justice, the agency will:

- ► Educate and train staff on how racism and other systems of oppression can shape health.
- ▶ **Study** how racism has affected our past work and create new policies to lessen that impact.
- ► Collaborate with local communities to counter injustices.






How to use the Race to Justice Action Kit
