Data Sources

Bureau of Vital Stastics/Office of the Chief Medical Examiner: Mortality data were collected through an in-depth review of data and charts from the Health Department's Bureau of Vital Statistics and the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for 2000-2012. Methadone is reported separately and not included in opioid analyses.

Population Rates: Calculated using NYC DOHMH population estimates, modified from US Census Bureau intercensal population estimates 2000-2012, updated July 22, 2013. These rates will differ from previously reported rates based on Census counts or previous versions of population estimates. Rates are age-adjusted to Census 2000, except those for specific age groups.






