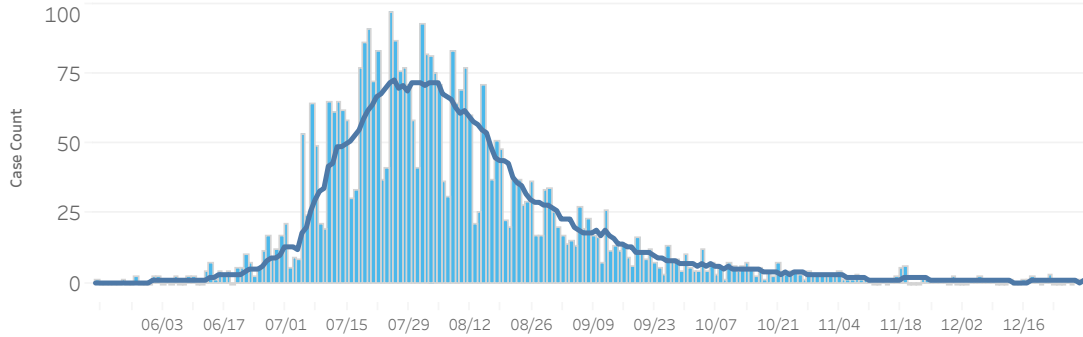

Mpox Response (2022)

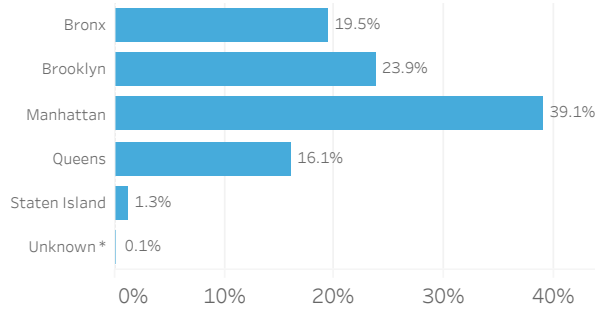

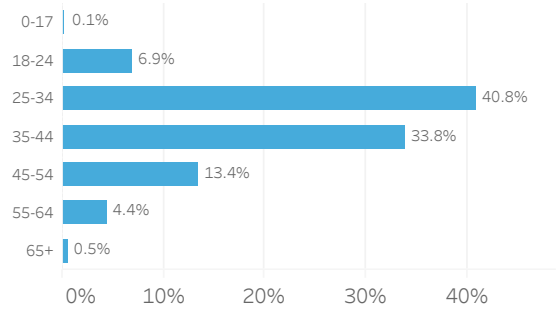

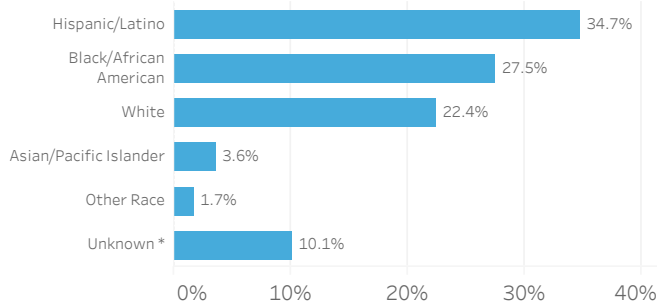

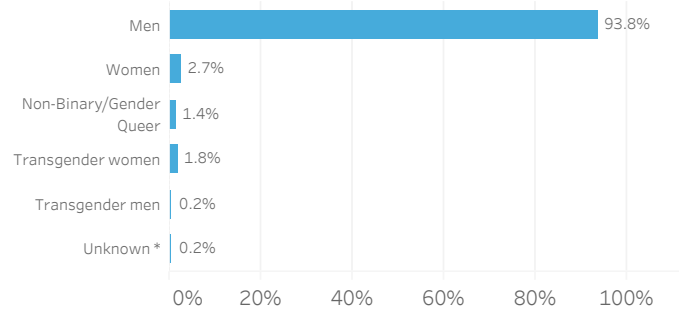

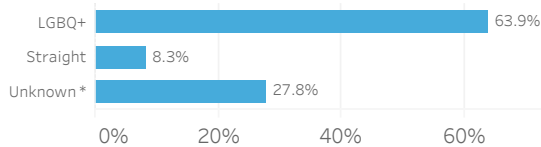

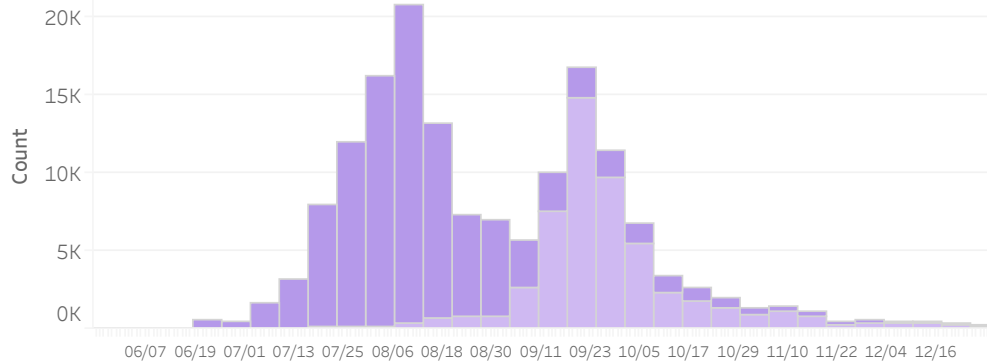

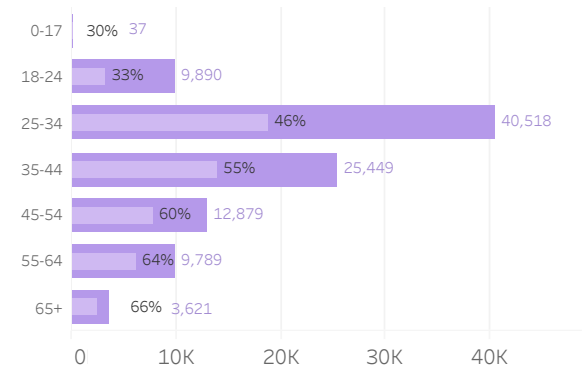
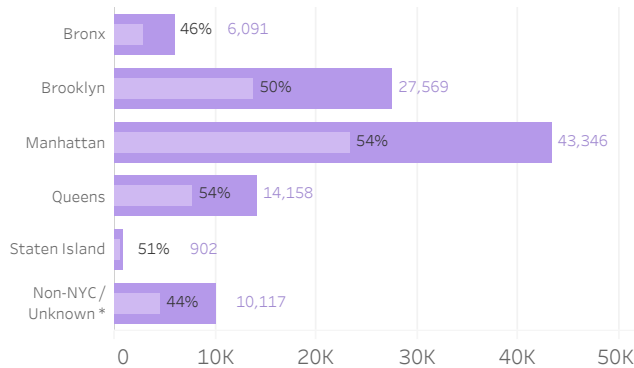

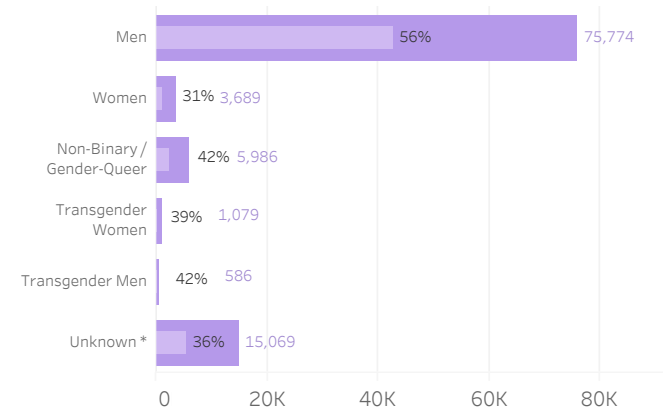
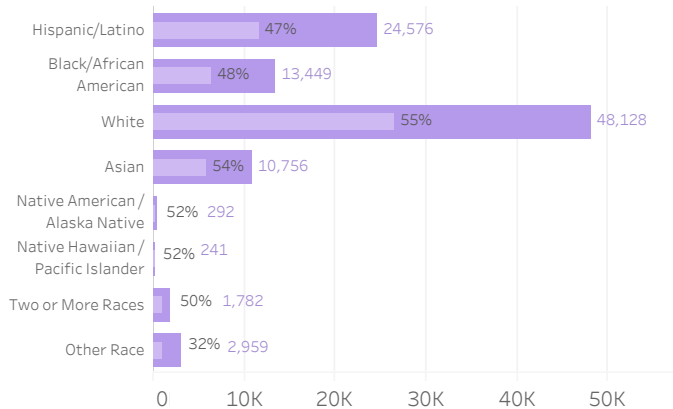
