## OVERVIEW OF GROUP CHILD CARE PROGRAM PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

## (After the site inspection)

Operators of group child care programs must follow the regulations outlined in <u>Article 47</u> of the NYC Health Code. Programs must also adhere to other applicable parts of the Health Code including but not limited to Articles <u>3</u>, <u>11</u>, <u>81</u>, and <u>173</u>.

- Once a prospective operator receives a satisfactory site viability inspection report, they must submit architectural plans prepared by a licensed architect for review by the New York City Health Department.
- Prospective operators must also obtain statements of approval from the <u>NYC Department of Buildings</u> and the NYC Fire Department.
- ➤ Obtain and submit test results for lead in drinking water by a New York State Environmental Laboratory Approved Program (ELAP) and a Lead-Based Paint Inspection Report from an EPA certified lead inspector or Risk Assessor.
- Submit a Written Safety Plan, which will include:
  - Lost Child Plan
  - Health Care Plan
  - Emergency Evacuation Plan
  - <u>Safe Sleep Plan</u> (Infant/toddler programs)
- All child care programs must have an Educational Director who is <u>certified</u> as a NYS Early Childhood Education Teacher (birth to grade 2) with two years of teaching experience.
- Obtain staff clearances:
  - Fingerprinting by <u>Department of Investigation (DOI)</u>
  - Child abuse and maltreatment by the New York State Central Register (SCR)
  - Reference letters from three most recent employers
  - Staff physical examination certificates
- Obtain certificates of workers' compensation and disability benefits insurance.
- Required <u>training</u>:
  - Child Abuse and Maltreatment all staff
  - Prevention of Infectious Disease all teachers
  - CPR and First Aid at least 1 staff on site at all times
  - Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and Shaken Baby (infant/toddler programs) -Infant/toddler and night care staff
  - Food protection certificate –supervisors of food preparation and service
  - Emergency procedures training all staff
- Program will receive a subsequent inspection of the facility for compliance with any outstanding requirements.
