Understanding Generic Medicine



What is generic medicine?

• A generic medicine is the same as the brand name version.

What is the difference between generic medicines and brand name medicines?

- Generics cost much less.
- Generics have the same active ingredients, work the same way and meet the same safety requirements as brand name medicines.

Are generic medicines safe?

- Yes. Generics must meet all the same safety standards as brand name medicines.
- Generics must be approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to be sold in the United States.

Do generic medicines work?

• Yes. Generic medicines work just as well as brand name medicines.

Do generic medicines cost less?

• Yes. Generics usually cost about 80% less than brand name medicines.

How does a brand medicine become available as a generic?

- A drug company does years of research to create a new medicine.
- Once approved by the FDA, only that drug company can sell the medicine.
- After a specified amount of time, the drug company no longer has exclusive rights to sell the medicine.
- This allows other companies to make their own generic version of the medicine
