

PEP Prevents HIV Infection after Exposure from Sex or Injection Drug Use

What is PEP?

PEP is post-exposure prophylaxis. PEP is used to prevent HIV infection after someone has been exposed to the virus by having sex or injecting drugs. **PEP works best if you start taking medicine before 36 hours have passed since you were exposed to HIV, and no more than 72 hours after exposure.** PEP means taking medicine for 28 days and having medical checkups during the time you are taking the medicine.

How Risky Was My Exposure?

Does PEP Prevent HIV Infection?

PEP is proven to prevent HIV infection in health care workers who have been stuck with a used needle and in babies whose mothers have HIV. *PEP* works best when started as soon as possible. It will probably not help if more than 72 hours have passed since you were exposed to the virus.

Where Do I Get PEP in New York City?

PEP is available at clinics, hospitals, and emergency rooms and from private doctors. In NYC, PEP is available at low or no cost to people without health insurance coverage at the following clinics. Your exposure must have occurred less than 36 hours before in order to get PEP at these clinics. Call before you go to make sure PEP is available.
