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TUBERCULOSIS TOLL, YEAR 1942
A Statistical Summary

I. - Morbidity and Mortality

During 1942 there were recorded in New York City 3,502 deaths from tuberculosis, of which 936, or 27 percent, occurred among the colored and 2,566 among the white population. The former are now estimated to number slightly over half a million (508,189), and to be the largest urban Negro community in the world; the latter, about seven millions (7,064,830). The respective death rates were therefore 184 and 36 per 100,000, the combined death rate being 46.2, as compared with 49.4 in 1941, a decrease of 6.5 percent -- during a full year of War.

Against a decrease in mortality there was an increase in morbidity: 9,834 new cases of the various forms of tuberculosis having been registered in 1942 as compared with 9,222 in 1941, which was 612 or 6.6 percent more. The larger number of new cases reported may however have resulted in part from the wider use of the X-ray especially in the examination of selectees for the Armed Services.

Since on January 1, 1942, a total of 20,812 pulmonary cases was already carried on the tuberculosis roster of the Department of Health, and during the year 9,145 new cases of the same type of disease were added thereto along with 1,660 resumed cases, there was a grand total of 31,617 such cases coming to the attention of various medical authorities in a single year. After the removal from the register of 9,914 cases due to deaths and other reasons, there still remained on December 31, 1942, a total of 21,703 known cases of pulmonary tuberculosis in New York City.

These already known cases -- the day's problem -- are most numerous in the Borough of Manhattan where they total 8,711, being found mostly among residents of the Central Harlem District (2,184), the Lower East Side (1,717), and the Lower West Side (1,199). In Brooklyn, the Bedford District has 851 registered cases; the large Flatbush area, 786. The Astoria-Long Island City section of Queens has 687 cases, the largest number of known cases of tuberculosis in any one district of that borough.

The death rate for the entire City represents an average which does not necessarily hold in every section. In the year 1942, the highest tuberculosis death rate in New York City, namely 192 per 100,000 population, was recorded in the Central Harlem Health Center District of Manhattan. The next highest rate, 88, was noted both in the East Harlem and in the Lower West Side Health Center districts. In the Lower East Side of Manhattan, the tuberculosis death rate was still 80 per 100,000 population.

In the Bronx, the highest tuberculosis death rate, 45 per 100,000, prevailed in Mott Haven; in Brooklyn, Bedford had the highest, 59, followed by the Fort Greene section with a rate of 52. Both of the last two districts have a material proportion of colored residents. It is to be noted, however, that in the Borough of Brooklyn death rates as low as 20 and 18 -- the lowest of any in the City -- prevailed in Flatbush and in Gravesend. In the Borough of Queens, tuberculosis death rates ranged from 23 in the Maspeth-Forest Hills section to 33 in the Jamaica East District.

A material number of deaths of New York City residents occur out of town, especially in country health resorts. There were 536 of them in 1942; considered along with the 3,410 deaths of New York City residents which were reported locally, they indicate a death rate, corrected for residence, of 52 per 100,000 population, or six points higher than that based on local records only. Residents of "Up-State" New York the same year had a death rate of only 33; in the neighboring State of New Jersey, it was 44.

The five largest cities of the United States, each with a population of more than a million, recorded the following tuberculosis death rates in 1942: Detroit, 45.0 per 100,000; New York City, 46.2; Chicago, 49.2; Los Angeles, 54.4; and Philadelphia, 58.7. The same year, it may be recalled, the tuberculosis death rate of the United States as a whole was 43.5* whereas in 1941 it was 44.5.

II. - Institutional Services: Clinics, Hospitals and Sanatoria

In general, despite war and defense activities, longer hours of labor and accompanying disturbing conditions, tuberculosis mortality so far has been kept at a comparatively low level in the United States. This, however, has not necessarily happened without cause. Too often there may be forgotten, because of lack of readily available information, the extensive volume of concurrent anti-tuberculosis activities which "hold the line".

Reference is here made especially to anti-tuberculosis clinic work carried on in every section of New York City and the daily care of hundreds, and thousands for that matter, of patients in hospitals and sanatoria, a task especially difficult to accomplish these days with reduced personnel.

The Department of Hospitals of the City of New York continues to maintain out-patient services in 11 institutions; the private hospitals or agencies conduct 8 more; and, the Department of Health of the City of New York operates a series of 22 district tuberculosis clinics. To these various dispensary services and diagnostic stations no less than

*Care must be taken to remember that the rate for the United States is based upon complete mortality returns, whereas that of the cities mentioned above is dependent upon the number of deaths recorded within their limits only, being exclusive therefore of those which may have occurred out of town.

42,064 new admissions were made in 1942, besides an unrecorded number of readmissions. Attention was given by specialists to the examination, observation or treatment of no less than 75,956 persons -- the total clinic attendance for the year amounting to 208,227 visits.

Some seventeen thousand (17,601) household "contacts" of tuberculosis cases were examined for the first time at the clinics and 544 new cases found tuberculous. The X-ray examinations exceeded one hundred thousand (107,109). In addition thereto, for case-finding purposes and special surveys, 90,876 X-ray examinations were made, 62,945 by the Health Department, the remainder by the Brooklyn Tuberculosis and Health Association and the Queensboro Tuberculosis and Health Association.

At the end of 1942, there remained under the care or observation of the 41 clinics a total of 35,061 persons of whom 6,560 were presumably active cases of tuberculosis, and 8,559 had become arrested cases recently. Special treatment was being given to 1,697 ambulant "pneumothorax cases".

Besides the regular district tuberculosis clinics, the Department of Health of the City of New York and the Queensboro Tuberculosis and Health Association again conducted in 1942 more than a score of Consultation Services for private physicians' cases. The admissions thereto numbered 14,535 among whom were found 1,163 cases of tuberculosis, a third of them still in the minimal stage.

Home sanitary supervision and individual instruction in personal hygiene was again actively maintained despite the reduction in the number of public health nurses. A total of 98,770 home or field visits "to or for" tuberculosis cases was made in 1942 for both "clinic" and "non-clinic" cases -- 85,006 by the Department of Health, 4,218 by the Department of Hospitals and 9,546 by other agencies.

While all this clinic and field work was being carried on, there was also being given daily intensive special care to the acutely ill tuberculosis patients in the various hospitals and sanatoria serving New York City. In 24 institutions there was an average daily census of 6,433 patients in 1942 as compared with 6,458 in the year 1941, a change of but 25, or of one-third of one percent only, indicating the steady maintenance of this most vital service against the spread of tuberculosis and for the humane care of those already stricken. There was an average ratio of bed occupancy of 95.9 percent in tuberculosis institutions at the end of 1942. In certain places it rose much higher, beyond capacity. As a matter of fact, at the Metropolitan Hospital, on December 31st last, it was 109.6 percent. There must be noted, however, that, whereas there were 6,244 patients in the institutions serving New York City at the beginning of 1942, by the end of the year the census had fallen slightly to 5,890. The demand for labor and the high remuneration offered for it is exerting a rather dangerous influence upon these groups.

Altogether 18,412 patients were treated in the tuberculosis hospitals serving New York City in 1942. The immensity of the task of caring for the tuberculous in a large community like New York may be surmised from the statement that the total patient-days numbered 2,291,810.

The character of the cases entering institutions in 1942 improved very slightly over that of the year previous. The proportion of patients already in a far advanced condition on admission to the services of the Department of Hospitals particularly was 49 percent, as compared with 51 percent the year previous. The proportion of those in the minimal stage unfortunately still remained very low, only 14 percent.

There appeared to be a slight recession in the number of hospital patients "under collapse therapy"; at the end of 1942 they numbered 1,540 or 27 percent of all adult patients as compared with 29 percent the year before. The average length of stay in institutions of all patients during the year was 124 days, two less than the year before. The proportion of cases discharged alive was again 81 percent, indicating therefore a 19 percent mortality ratio as in previous years. It must be noted, however, that practically one-third of those who died in institutions must have come there in a moribund condition; of the total 2,324 deaths, 716 occurred within one month of admission or transfer from reception centers.

So, as first noted, some gains continue to be made against tuberculosis, but they demand the full maintenance of intensive community-wide services. The human toll taken by the tubercle bacillus is still staggering. During the past five years alone in New York City there have been recorded a total of 18,491 deaths -- every one of them premature* by many years -- and no less than 47,048 new cases were registered. And the end is not yet in sight! The present services and facilities afford the community a certain measure of protection, but they are as yet inadequate for a full control of this preventable disease.--G.J.D.

*While the expectancy of life in New York City is now 61.7 years for males and 65.8 for females, the average age at death of those recently taken by tuberculosis was, respectively for each sex, 44.6 years and 36.7 years -- a cutting off in each instance, therefore, of 17.1 years for men and of 29.1 years for women, not to mention the additional two or three years of previous invalidism through which they suffered.

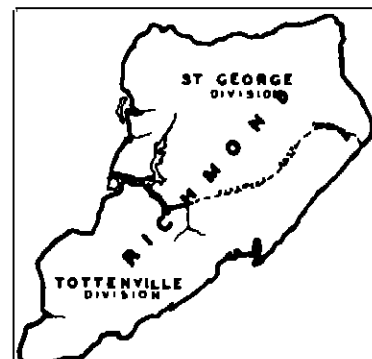
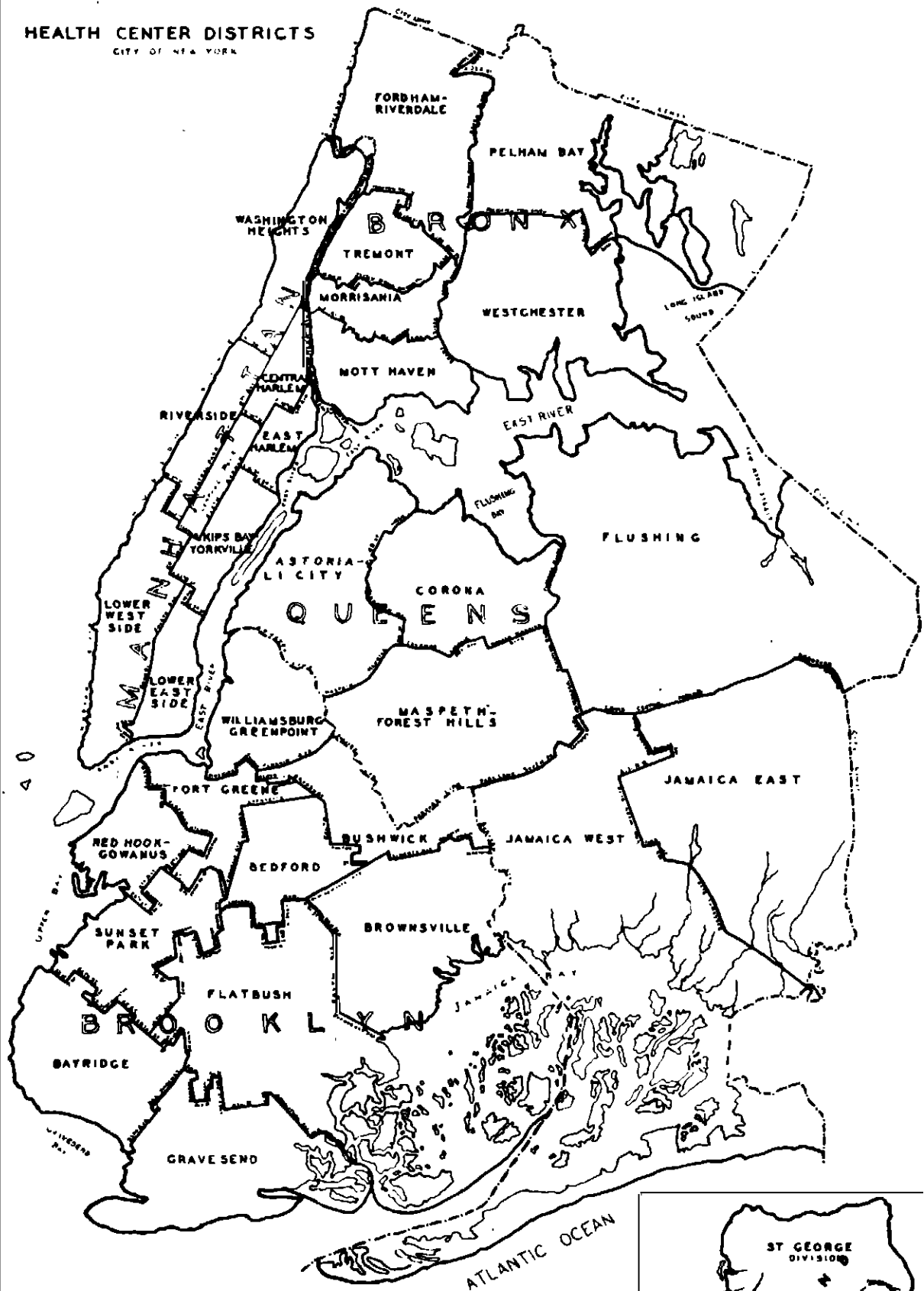

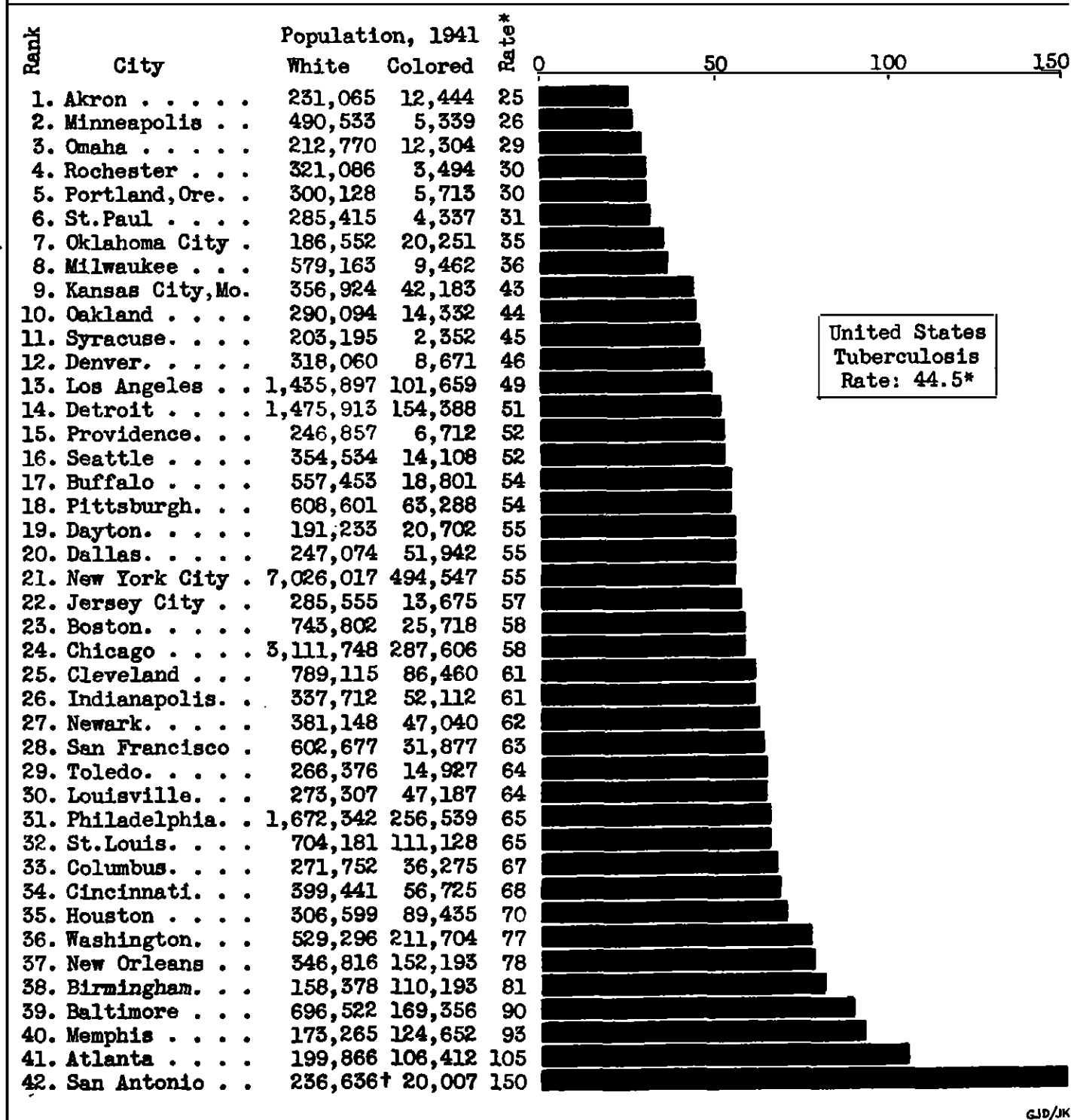

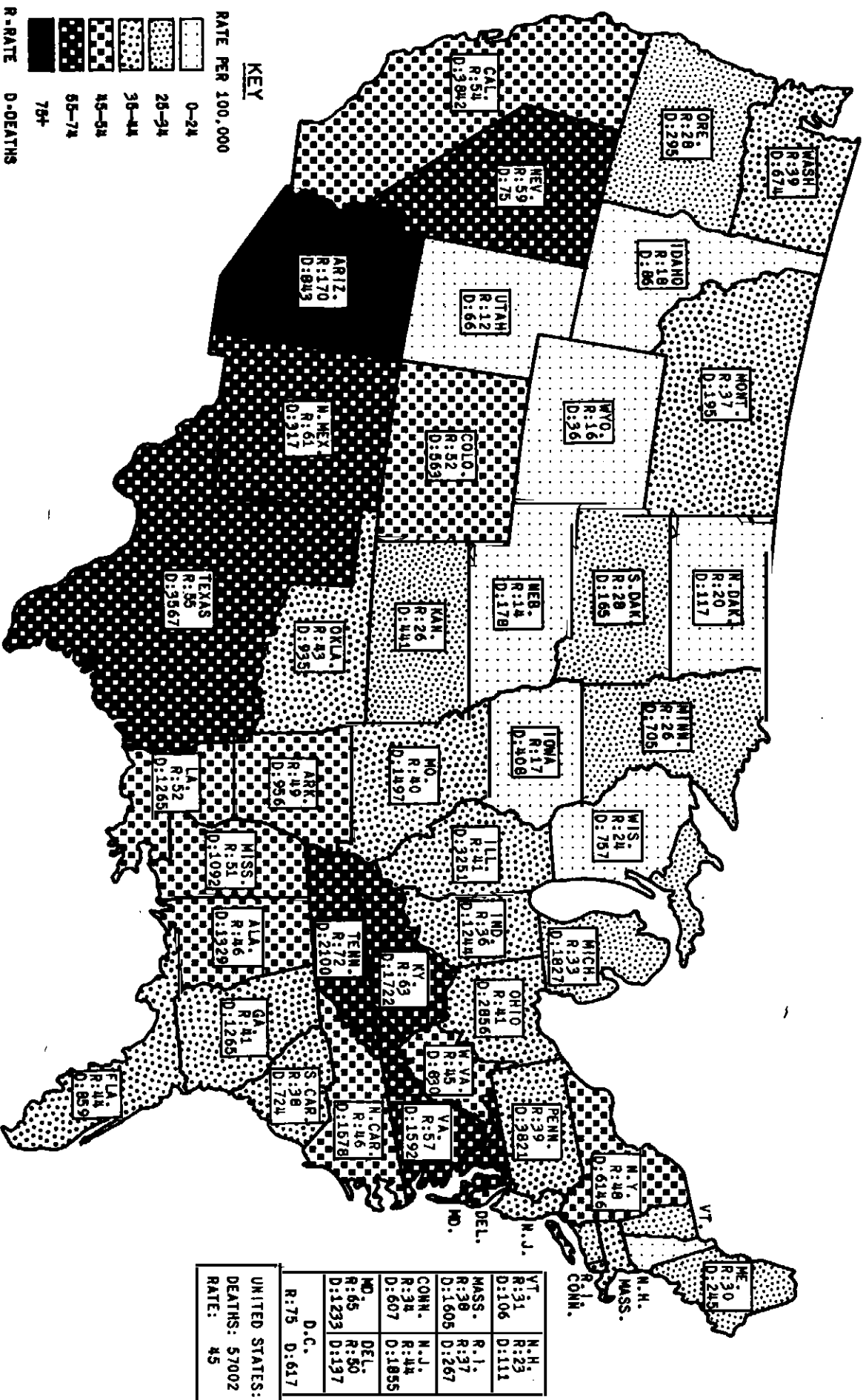

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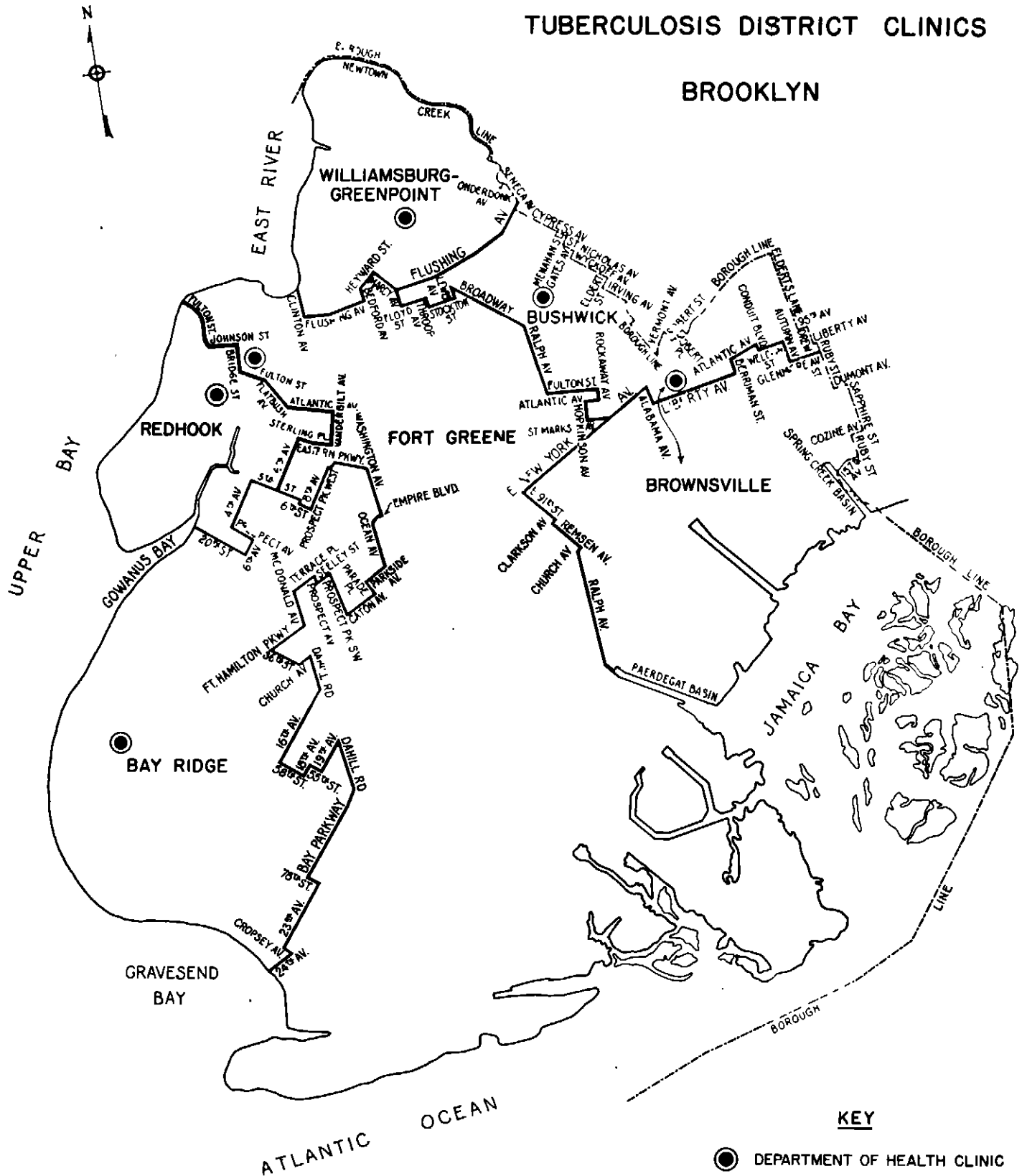
