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JOINT STATEMENT FROM DOI and DOB COMMISSIONERS REGARDING THE GUILTY PLEAS ENTERED BY PHILLIP MINUCCI AND TRI STATE SCAFFOLD & EQUIPMENT SUPPLIES

Today, Phillip Minucci and Tri State Scaffold & Equipment Supplies pleaded guilty in Manhattan Supreme Court to Manslaughter in the second degree, a Class "C" felony. These charges arose from a multi-agency investigation of a scaffolding collapse in which five people died and four others were seriously injured. Today's plea is significant because it marks the first, or one of the first, instances that a contractor doing business in the City has pleaded guilty to manslaughter. Today's plea should send a message that contractors are responsible and will be held accountable for the safety of the workers on their jobsites.
